Fr. Terry Keehan

Follow me and I will make you fishers of people. Jesus engages four of the disciples in this manner according to Mark's Gospel this weekend. I believe that these are some of the most brilliant words that Jesus ever spoke. He uses words and an image that the hearers are familiar with – fishing. He breathes the possibility of a new future for them using the livelihood of fishing that they are so familiar with. He urges them to look at a new calling using imagery that they are very familiar with. How is God calling you to a potentially new, different and meaningful future using the things that are most familiar to you?

We welcome Fr. Corey Brost, former President of our neighbor St. Viator High School in Arlington Heights and currently on the staff of the Justice for Immigrants ministry of the Archdiocese of Chicago. Corey is a civil attorney and is now using a slightly different skill set than he did in his role at St. Viator. Accompanying Corey will be a young woman named Adrianne who will join Corey in presenting significant information and stories about the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) immigration policy. There has been much discussion recently regarding many immigration issues. Corey and Adrianne will also be available after the 9:00am and 11:00am Masses for a question and answer session in the chapel.

Please see page 17 of this bulletin for updates and reminders of the previous Lenten Social Justice Projects that so many of you have supported during the past four Lents. Beginning with our support of Rebecca Koury, a Pastoral Associate at St. Paul Parish in McKee, Kentucky, then St. Mary's and Fr. Jerry Rogers serving members of the Chippewa Native American tribe on the Red Lake Reservation in Minnesota. We then supported a ministry here in our community as we turned our attention to Journeys | The Road Home and the PADS ministry, and those who are homeless right here in our neighborhood. Last year we initially intended to support one parish in Cuba, but ended up supporting several due to your overwhelmingly generous response. Kentucky, Minnesota and Cuba are all part of our collaboration with Fr. Jack Wall and the Catholic Extension Society, and Holy Family is the first parish anywhere to collaborate on such a level with Catholic Extension Society.

This year's Lenten Social Justice Project will be another example of our ground breaking efforts as we will collaborate with St. Sabina Parish, Catholic Charities, Mercy Home for Boys and Girls, Mayor Rahm Emanuel and others in Cardinal Cupich's innovative anti-violence initiative. Once again, we here at Holy Family are the first parish to participate in this collaboration in which anti-violence describes our intent and "Peaceful Pathways" describes our approach. More will follow as we get closer to and enter into Lent.

Very often people ask about opportunities to learn more about the Eucharist and Mass. The Second Vatican Council tells us that the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of the life of the church, so we are offering two presentations this week for anyone interested in learning more about this essential element of our faith in which God, through Jesus Christ, fulfills his desire to be with us in a REAL way. This Sunday, January 21 at 1:00pm Dr. Peg Hanrahan, our Director of Teen and Family Faith, and I will lead a "Teaching Mass" primarily for 2nd graders preparing for First Communion and their parents. This will be an actual Mass. Then, this Wednesday, January 24 at 7:00pm, I will lead an explanation of the Eucharist and Mass primarily for our Candidates and Catechumens preparing for full reception into the Church. Anyone is welcome to either of these informative and prayerful events.

Our 2018 Gala, *Le Grand Ball de Versailles*, is fast approaching. Please plan on joining us on Saturday, February 24 at Concorde Banquets on Rand Road in Kildeer. 





Learning the way of mercy

Formation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation

Many think that the preparation for the sacraments begin during the school years in parochial schools and/or parish-based religious education programs. The truth is preparation begins when the parents decide to have the child baptized. At that time parents formally and publicly accept the responsibility

"...of training him (her) in the practice of the faith. It will be your duty to bring him (her) up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbor." (from The Rite of Baptism for Children; paragraph #77)

If we want our children

to be GOOD

we need

to SHOW

them how!

YOUNG CHILDREN ARE EXPERIENTIAL LEARNERS

Children are keen observers of the information they glean from their senses. Early learning often occurs within social interactions with those whom the child has learned to trust. This learning is often demonstrated through imitation. Children repeat what they hear, sometimes to the consternation of their parents. Young children also learn by exploring the environments they find themselves in. Few things are off limits in this early experimentation, hence the need for 'baby-proofing'. The result of their exploration is often expressed in play. Any parent can tell you young children are like little sponges - they do not miss a trick.

The practice of the faith in a sacramental Church is rooted in experience and sensuality. In a sacramental Church, one experiences God's presence through sight, sound, touch, taste and smell. Faith is not so much taught as caught. New Christians go through a process of initiation during which they become apprentices mentored by the community of believers, learning to imitate more mature disciples. The first of these faith communities is the family.

THE APPLE DOES NOT FALL FAR FROM THE TREE

Moral education – character formation – begins very young. Parents begin this education through example and then by establishing norms (permitting certain behaviors and not permitting others). Children learn quickly what is expected by following the example of their parents. Innocence comes naturally; sharing, selflessness, caring, patience, and trust do not. Moral <u>and</u> immoral attitudes and behaviors are learned. Children will do and say, and later think, what their parents do, say and think.

THE AGE OF REASON

Children begin learning right from wrong as toddlers. The older they become the more nuanced their understanding of what is right and wrong becomes. As their cognitive abilities advance, children between the ages of 7-11 develop the beginnings of logical thought or reasoning. This is why medieval theologians declared age 7 *the age of reason*.

Children at this age do become more logical about concrete and specific things yet they still struggle with abstract ideas. Our catechesis on forgiveness, the role of conscience and what constitutes sin must be developmentally appropriate. At Holy Family catechesis on these and other related issues (i.e. guilt, culpability, moral responsibility...) is done in stages in grades 2, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, and 10. This is why consistent and systematic religious education is necessary. In second grade we help children differentiate between accidents, mistakes and sin. Children learn that God wants us to be good and through His grace helps us to <u>be</u> good. One of the ways God does this is first and foremost through active participation in the Mass and then through the sacrament of Reconciliation.

is thriving under the leadership of Mrs. Mary Schiffer. Currently nine families with nine children/teens ranging in age from 7-14 are involved. This spring three of these young people will be baptized, 8 will receive the sacrament of Reconciliation and 8 will receive the Eucharist for the first time.

It is truly inspiring to see these families working together, sharing their faith and growing in their understanding and appreciation for our Catholic tradition.

RECONCILIATION: The back story

We are in the middle of preparing children in both our Family Faith programs and our Academy to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. **This is a daunting task.** Forgiveness and reconciliation are tough values to sell in a conflict-ridden world.



Consider this

- Of all the virtues, forgiveness feels farthest from our reach, says Pope Francis
- > We live in a world desperate for healing as individuals, communities and nations
- > Terror terrorism and terrorists affect every dimension of human life and it is a global concern
- > All religious and spiritual traditions believe in, teach, and ask people to practice forgiveness.
- > Forgiveness is linked to health and well-being by leading health care institutes around the world.
- > There is a growing body of scientific research indicating forgiveness is a transformative process.

When people think of preparing young people for sacraments, 1st communion and Confirmation come to mind. They see the preparation process as necessary and know that substantial time and resources are needed for the task. That is true. Reconciliation, on the other hand is thought of as a step in the march to 1st communion, if that. As a lifelong religious educator I can tell you that far more time and energy is spent on the formation for this "orphan sacrament". Why? The sacrament of reconciliation is our least understood sacrament, aligned with negative associations to guilt and shame, and for some outright cruelty. It was the last sacrament to be reformed after Vatican II. As a result many simply decided to no longer continue "confession" as a spiritual practice.

Receiving and extending forgiveness is a complex human interaction Reconciling is a difficult life-skill to master. Yet knowing how to imaginatively and constructively deal with what diminishes body, mind and spirit, what fractures wholeness is priceless. As Catholics we believe life, in all its myriad forms is created in the image and likeness of God, endowed with unalienable rights, imprinted with divine dignity. All of creation is made to be in relationship, hard wired to connect. This is what is good – God like - about all of creation. Evil severs connections; destroys integrity. Sin, evil translated into the concrete, malevolent energy taking up residence in time and space trespasses on our ability to connect and be connected. As Catholics we have a rich legacy, found in both Scripture and Tradition, about the need for and our capacity to, deal with the full range of human thought, feeling and behavior. It would simply be foolish



not to explore this wisdom in earnest. That wisdom is at the heart of the catechesis for the sacrament of Reconciliation. Meet me here next week to hear how we form children and teens in this vital spiritual reality here at Holy Family.

2018 Lenten Social Justice Project

This Lent, Holy Family will embark on a Lenten Journey that looks at the cycle of poverty's complex nature while identifying critical programs already showing positive results with at-risk youth in two of Chicago's most violent neighborhoods. Our recent Lenten Social Justice Projects have been very successful and we pray this year is no different. Let's take a look back at the last 4 years. Our financial goal the last four years has been to raise at least \$25,000.

2014 - St. Paul Mission Church in McKee,

KY– St. Paul is a small mission church in Appalachia (the only Catholic Church in that county) and serves a rural population. It cannot sustain the salary of a full-time priest. Rebecca Koury (now Rebecca Woods) is the Pastoral Associate. Holy Family raised \$48,718 in collaboration with Catholic Extension to pay Rebecca's salary and support the many ministries she administers. Since 2014, Rebecca has instituted a program to support youth with mission trips, updated religious education programs, held crafting workshops to create religious décor for the church, offered guest adult faith formation speakers and programs, assisted the community with a carpentry and home repair ministry, incorporated "Christmas Forward" as a way for families to provide community services in return for gift cards towards gas and food, and finally...started an entrepreneurship through the local college to make and sell granola. You will hear more about their granola project as the details firm up.

2015 - St. Mary's Mission Church, Red Lake Reservation, Red Lake, MN - St. Mary's Mission Church and School, with a staff of 20 people, help to care for and educate the Native American residents of Red Lake. The pastor, Fr. Jerry Rogers, feels that by surrounding the children and their families with the power of prayer, the living witness of Catholic beliefs and a strong education, the greater hope there will be for their future. Holy Family raised \$70,030 to support a Staff Associate and to sustain the education of the children attending the school, again, in collaboration with Catholic Extension. Because of Holy Family's Lenten Project, St. Mary's hired Charmaine as an Outreach Director and Parish Nurse directly serving the community on so many personal levels. Our gift also assisted the school which is now experiencing increased enrollment and thriving. On a sad note, the church was devasted by a fire

and the building was totaled. Fr. Jerry Rogers is, as always, optimistic, and he expressed hope that the church will rebuild. He said, "Out of the ashes will rise a new church."

2016 – JOURNEYS|THE ROAD HOME – Holy Family Parish is a PADS site, which hosts the local homeless clients registered through JOUR-NEYS on Sunday evenings, Oct through April. Raising \$54,384 directly assisted JOURNEYS in their care and guidance of those who are homeless or on the verge of homelessness. Critical services such as long-term case management, job counseling, minor medical care, mental health screenings, and most of all, securing permanent and stable housing are provided. A year following our Social Justice Project, they were able to secure housing for 135 clients, which is their greatest success rate to date.

2017 - San Miguel Arcangel Church, San Miguel de los Banos, Cuba – This Lenten project worked in collaboration with Catholic Extension and was our most innovative and successful in terms of donations raising \$95,000. This enabled Catholic Extension to provide grant money to not only rehab San Miguel Arcangel Church, but also two chapels in the Diocese of Pinar del Rio – Las Ovas Chapel and Paso Real de San Diego Chapel. St. Rosendo Cathedral also received grant funding to complete their renovations. To date, all projects are moving along quite well as the both chapels are very close to completion and St. Rosendo Cathedral is moving ahead of schedule. San Miguel Arcangel is also moving along well as they continue to gather the materials needed for completion. The bell tower has been removed as they begin its rebuild. Thankfully, all four structures received little damage from Hurricane Irma.

We will keep the parish updated as more information develops from these past Lenten Projects.
