### Fr. Terry Keehan

We celebrate Catholic Schools this coming week and this is always an opportunity to acknowledge the world-wide mission of education that our Church carries out every day all over the world. More specifically, we give thanks for the faculty, staff and students here at Holy Family Catholic Academy, as we celebrate our 15th year. Many thanks to our Principal, Kate O'Brien, for her tireless leadership and attention to so many details that help our students to see that they are the 'Hands and Feet of Jesus.'

The Academy's motto is *"thinkers, leaders, grounded in faith."* While it is a motto for developing our students, the Academy itself has proven to live this motto.

**HFCA is a thinker.** The Academy is one of the first schools in the Archdiocese to adopt the use of inquirybased learning. This type of learning develops critical thinking skills. While studies show that most of the jobs that our students will have in the future have yet to be invented, we do know that they will be asked to solve problems and work in teams. Inquiry-based learning develops these skills, takes knowledge and applies it to authentic issues, and introduces the skills of collaboration, communication, creativity, critical thinking. This method of teaching has resulted in HFCA being recognized locally, nationally and beyond.

#### HFCA is a leader.

• In September, our parish school was one of only 50 private schools in the nation to be awarded the US Department of Education's Blue Ribbon for Exemplary teaching and learning.

• In October, HFCA underwent an extensive two day review and became the first middle school program in Illinois to earn AdvancEd STEM certification. This review measured HFCA's performance across 11 rigorous STEM indicators, included meeting with 58 students, and observed both elementary and middle school classrooms. The AdvancED review team concluded, "HFCA's program gives learners exceptional opportunities to collaboratively address and solve real life problems. You have much of which to be proud!"

• Later this spring, the Academy will complete its multi-year candidacy and seek authorization as an International Baccalaureate World School in the Primary Years Programme. HFCA is the first school in the Archdiocese to be accepted as a candidate in this programme and the first known school in the northwest suburbs. This authorization provides the Academy with access to worldwide best practices in teaching and is yet another indication of HFCA's leadership in our community and beyond.

**HFCA is grounded in faith.** Our Catholic faith is integrated into everything that is done at our parish school. Our alums have attended 6 different Catholic high schools and have now go on to attend 13 different

Catholic universities.

In addition, this weekend we enter into Commitment Weekend for the Annual Catholic Appeal. Your generosity supports parishes and schools serving financially challenged communities; evangelization and liturgical initiatives to enhance parish vitality; youth, young adult, campus and adult religious education ministries; continuing education for lay volunteers and staff serving in ALL parishes; assisting Catholic Relief Services that help the poor and vulnerable overseas; activities promoting respect for life at all stage; immigration; Kolbe House prison ministry; Peace and Justice Initiatives; continuing education for seminarians and priests ordained for the Archdiocese of Chicago; programs to support marriage preparation, marriage enrichment and family ministries; support for Chicago Fire and Police chaplaincies and other community oriented ministries. Each parish has a financial goal and funds raised in excess of parish goals are returned to the parish. On behalf of those who can't thank you - THANK YOU for supporting the Annual Catholic Appeal.

Next weekend we will hear from Pete and Cari Pappas who are the new ministry leads for our Lectionary Based Small Christian Communities. Lectionary based means that the group reads and discusses how the scripture readings to be proclaimed at the upcoming weekend masses connect with your life. Holy Family provides each group with DVD presentations, discussion questions and other resources to enhance discussion. Members provide hospitality, laughs, fun and joy, as well as the classic opportunities to grow in faith, in knowledge of scripture and a smaller, more intimate sense of community.

Please be attentive to Pete and Cari's message and mine regarding the importance of this ministry in the life of Holy Family Catholic Community. You do not have to be an expert in scripture, or even have knowledge of 'church stuff' to join a group. However, we do provide training for anyone who might be interested in leading a new Small Christian Community. Leaders are asked to make sure the discussion is balanced and all have an opportunity to share.

I would also like to encourage more groups to form around the topic of work. I am forming some Small Christian Communities around the connection of Faith and Work with a great new book entitled "Balancing Faith & Work," based on the writings of Chris Lowney. Our own parishioner, John Fontana, has written the forward of the book, and I share his passion for supporting people in discussing how our faith and our work come together. 



### Learning the way of mercy

**Formation for the Sacrament of Reconciliation** 

**Many think that the preparation for the sacraments** begin during the school years in parochial schools and/or parish-based religious education programs. The truth is preparation begins when the parents decide to have the child baptized. At that time parents formally and publicly accept the responsibility

"...of training him (her) in the practice of the faith. It will be your duty to bring him (her) up to keep God's commandments as Christ taught us, by loving God and our neighbor." (from The Rite of Baptism for Children; paragraph # 77)

#### YOUNG CHILDREN ARE EXPERIENTIAL LEARNERS

Children are keen observers of the information they glean from their senses. Early learning often occurs within social interactions with those whom the child has learned to trust. This learning is often demonstrated through imitation. Children repeat what they hear, sometimes to the consternation of their parents. Young children also learn by exploring the environments they find themselves in. Few things are off limits in this early experimentation, hence the need for *'baby-proofing'*. The result of their exploration is often expressed in play. Any parent can tell you young children are like little sponges - they do not miss a trick.

The practice of the faith in a sacramental Church is rooted in experience and sensuality. In a sacramental Church, one experiences God's presence through sight, sound, touch, taste and smell. *Faith is not so much taught as caught*. New Christians go through a *process of initiation* during which they become apprentices mentored by the community of believers, learning to imitate more mature disciples. The first of these faith communities is the family.

#### THE APPLE DOES NOT FALL FAR FROM THE TREE

Moral education – character formation – begins very young. Parents begin this education through example and then by establishing norms (permitting certain behaviors and not permitting others). Children learn quickly what is expected by following the example of their parents. Innocence comes naturally; sharing, selflessness, caring, patience, and trust do not. Moral <u>and</u> immoral attitudes and behaviors are learned. Children will do and say, and later think, what their parents do, say and think.



#### THE AGE OF REASON

Children begin learning right from wrong as toddlers. The older they become the more nuanced their understanding of what is right and wrong becomes. As their cognitive abilities advance, children between the ages of 7-11 develop the beginnings of logical thought or reasoning. This is why medieval theologians declared age 7 *the age of reason*.

Children at this age do become more logical about concrete and specific things yet they still struggle with abstract ideas. Our catechesis on forgiveness, the role of conscience and what constitutes sin must be developmentally appropriate. At Holy Family catechesis on these and other related issues (i.e. guilt, culpability, moral responsibility...) is done in stages in grades 2, 4, 5, 7, 8, 9, and 10. This is why consistent and systematic religious education is necessary. In second grade we help children differentiate between accidents, mistakes and sin. Children learn that God wants us to be good and through His grace helps us to <u>be</u> good. One of the ways God does this is first and foremost through active participation in the Mass and then through the sacrament of Reconciliation.

### ANOINTED, TRANSFORMED, REDEEMED

Everyone who has been baptized has been given the gift of salvation, indeed all Christian Churches proclaim that *"Christ died once for all,"* so all of humanity has been offered the gift of salvation. The catechism of the Catholic Church states,

"Those who, through no fault of their own, do not know the gospel of Christ or his Church, but who nevertheless seek God with a sincere heart, and, moved by grace, try in their actions to do his will as they know it through the dictates of their conscience—those too may achieve eternal salvation" (CCC 847).



One often hears Christians pose the questions, '*Are You Saved' or 'Have you accepted Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior'*? By that they mean have you made that crucial step in your faith life and committed to becoming a disciple of Christ's. Life-long Catholics have accepted Christ into their lives, yet have a sense of being saved daily understanding redemption as an on-going process.

#### REDEMPTION – A LIFE-LONG PROCESS MARKED BY CONTINUAL CONVERSION

Redemption is an on-going process of continual conversion as we more and more conform ourselves to Christ. For Catholics participation in the sacramental life of the Church is an essential part of this

conversion process. The effect of the grace God provides through the sacramental encounter is to draw one more deeply into an intimate relationship with Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and by extension with all of creation.

#### TEACHING MORALS AND INSTILLING VALUES

As has been said, parents are the primary moral educators. Children come to Catholic schools and parish-based Religious Education programs with a set of values and morals. The job of religious educators is to

- 1. Reinforce the moral teaching of the home
- 2. Present the foundations of Catholic moral teaching

**In second grade** we focus on helping children see that as followers of Jesus, baptized Christians they are called to do good and avoid evil. The

Maturity is learning to walk away from people and situations that threaten your peace of mind, self-respect, values, morals and self worth.



primary values explored are the need for forgiveness and the need to forgive and contrition – what it means to be truly sorry. The spiritual practices emphasized is attendance at Sunday Mass and the celebration of First Reconciliation using form 3 and includes the entire family.

**In fourth grade** children focus first on the moral teachings we find in scripture, in both Old and New Testament, principally

- 1. The Ten Commandments
- 2. The Beatitudes
- 3. The Mercy Parables a more in depth look at forgiveness

The exploration of these texts is done over time (there is not just one class on the 10 Commandments), and encourages the children to know not only what the text says but also the why behind the text and how to apply the texts in daily life. In addition to the scripture teachings children learn about teachings from the Tradition

- 1. The definition of good and evil, which includes a simple theology of suffering
- 2. The role of conscience in making good decisions and moral choices
- 3. A simple theology of sin
- 4. A child's experience of moral injury and moral repair

The principal spiritual practices emphasized are the celebration of Form 1 of the sacrament of Reconciliation – face-to-face and simple penitential practices (examination of conscience, prayer and acts of penance).

## **2018 Lenten Social Justice Project**

This Lent, Holy Family will embark on a Lenten Journey that looks at the cycle of poverty's complex nature while identifying critical programs already showing positive results with at-risk youth in two of Chicago's most violent neighborhoods.

In April, 2017, Cardinal Cupich launched an Anti-Violence Initiative (endorsed by Pope Francis) to increase the capacity and reach of current programs addressing the root causes of violence and a Peace Venture Philanthropy Fund to be used to invest in new anti-violence approaches and expand promising programs. As Cardinal Cupich stated, "The causes of the violence we are seeing in our city are complex and deep seated, but I have a strong belief, based on the good will and the many dedicated efforts of our civic and religious leaders, that these causes can be addressed and the suffering can end if we all work together."

Next week I will share information about two of these promising programs which are part of the Cardinal's Anti-Violence Initiative.




