Fr. Terry Keehan

This weekend we welcome our Mission speaker, Fr. Jim Clarke. Jim will preach at all Masses and then present this Sunday, February 11, Monday, February 12 and Tuesday, February 13. The title of the Mission is "Love Me Tender, Lord: The Work of Transformation." Fr. Clarke is a priest for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles and serves there as the Director of New Evangelization. He is also the Associate Spiritual Director at the Cardinal Manning House of Prayer for priests in Los Angeles. Previously he served as Director of Spiritual Formation at St. John's Seminary in Camarillo, California. He is very well known nationally as a Mission preacher and a regular presenter at the Religious Education Congress in Los Angeles.

You can find a brief description of the Mission on page 9 of this bulletin. Remember, there is no cost, hospitality follows each night, and it is a great opportunity to gather with members of your ministry, Small Christian Community, class, or simply with friends. Come to the Mission and get your heart and soul ready for Lent. Please give a warm welcome to Fr. Clarke as he joins us!

Yes, Lent begins this coming Wednesday. We anticipate a deeper spiritual focus as we embark on another journey that, as always, encourages us to become more reflective, adding extra time and variety to our prayer life, to be more intentional either in added practices or diminished consumption such as fasting from food or other things. We are always called to works of charity during our Lenten journey and we here at Holy Family have a strong tradition of focusing on a Social Justice Project during the forty days of the season. With particular excitement this year, we are proud to be the first and only (so far) parish to join Cardinal Cupich's Anti-Violence Initiative. This Lent we will be a partner with Catholic Charities, St. Sabina Church on the South Side of Chicago, Mercy Home for Boys and Girls, and the City of Chicago in supporting programs that address some of the root causes of violence, not only in some areas of Chicago, but here in our community.

Sue Geegan, our Director of Human Concerns, Ro Geisler, our Parish Manager, and I have been in extensive conversations with members of the above agencies and communities for some time now and our research has led us to ask your support for two initiatives specifically, the "Strong Futures" program at St. Sabina on Chicago's south side and "The Peace Corner" on the West Side of the city. Both of these programs help young men by creating opportunities for them to address gang affiliation, drugs, guns and other weapons,

and unemployment, just to name a few, as factors contributing to violent behavior.

Anti-Violence is our intent, but our method, or approach, is to create *Peaceful Pathways*, which, again, is not solely focused on violence in the city of Chicago, but forms of it right here in our area, even in our own homes and amidst our families. We will use the word "Hope" as a guide throughout the season. We want to hold up Hope in the midst of experiences and emotions such as Anger, Judgment, Doubt, and more. Look for the word Hope displayed in church with associated words and how it will lead us to the ultimate Hope of new life at Easter.

I want to thank Pete and Cari Pappas for sharing their witness talk at all Masses last weekend, and for being such faithful Ministry Leads for our Small Christian Community ministry. Many of you signed up for more information and have accepted Pete's invitation to "test drive" participating in a SCC during Lent. Please consider coming on each Wednesday of Lent at 7:00pm here at Holy Family to get a taste of what being part of a Small Christian Community is like. In addition, if you are interested in a Small Christian Community focused on Leadership in Business or connecting Faith and Work, please contact Pete and Cari at pmpbears@comcast.net or 815-670-3734.

First Sunday of Lent

- 5. Our Lenten theme centers on the word "Hope." How can we use this sacred time of Lent to center on Hope as we move to the joy of Easter morning? What changes can you make in attitude and action that will last beyond Easter?

THE PASCHAL SEASON 40/3/50

ALL THE DAYS, from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost, are our Paschal (Passover) Season. The 40 days of Lent and the 50 days of Eastertime surround the Triduum, the Great Three Days from Holy Thursday evening through Easter Sunday evening. This entire season has a unity founded in the Easter Vigil and visibly expressed in our Lenten reflection on HOPE in the face of violence, and our continued celebration of baptismal death and resurrection in Christ during Eastertime. To put it another way, TOGETHER we seek HOPE and deeper conversion during Lent so that we might come to new life during Easter and, in turn, go forth at Pentecost with the power of the Spirit to transform the world.



Book Discussion - Tattoos on the Heart: The Power of Boundless Compassion By Gregory Boyle, S.J.



Passion Play Update

Our teens have been hard at work for six weeks on our annual Passion Play. This year we have another original script authored by Dr. Peg Hanrahan and Lynn



Daugerdas (this year's Director), entitled "Come to the Water".

Each year we try to bring a fresh look at the Passion of Christ, highlighting the many layers of meaning in this central Christian narrative. This year's passion play opens in Peter's house as the fledging Pentecost community gathers to celebrate the Eucharist.

It is our hope in beginning this way we as a faith community will make the connection with our own celebration of the Eucharist the night before on Holy Thursday. The Passion is then told in flashback by Mary, mother of God and Peter, as the Pentecost community shares the story of Jesus with a young Jewish couple in need of food and shelter on their way to Jerusalem.

What does water have to do with the Passion? Jesus' own baptism in the Jordan ushers in his public ministry. At the time of his death blood and water flow from his side pierced by the centurion's spear, transforming the cross into the Tree of Life. As we gather to hear again this moving story and venerate the Cross on Good Friday, we are prepared to move into the splendor of Easter at the Holy Saturday Vigil, where we are renewed by the living waters of baptism. Plan to be with us on March 30 to reimagine once again the Passion of Jesus.



2018 Lenten Social Justice Project "Peaceful Pathways"

This Lenten season, walk with us along "Peaceful Pathways", our social justice project. Although "Anti-Violence" describes our intent, "Peaceful Pathways" describes our approach. Our contributions will support two highly successful local programs: Strong Futures on the south side of Chicago (www.saintsabinapeacemakers.org/strong-futures), and The Peace Corner Youth Center (www.thepeacecorner.org) on the west side.

Through providing a safe physical space, academic help, job counseling, physical activities and a strong support network, both programs work by peacefully rescuing, training and shielding high-risk youth. They arm young people with the fortitude, skills and support needed to avoid the pitfalls of drugs, gangs, and violence. Strong Futures and The Peace Corner Youth Center both have impressive histories and proven results. This Lenten season, we want to help them do even more. Our goal is to raise a minimum of \$25,000. The total amount raised will be split evenly between these two programs.


