CONFIRMATION IS NOT AN END; IT'S A NEW BEGINNING

Confirmation is one of three sacraments of Christian initiation, the others being Baptism and Eucharist. It means the beginning, not the end. The Holy Spirit calls each person, through Confirmation, to go deeper and deeper into their faith so as to grow in their relationship with Christ and His church community. We are called to move further away from a separate-self to a more communal relationship and witness of what it means to live an authentically Christian life. Over the past several months, the Holy Family FLAME students have met in their small Faith groups in the rectory for a one-time session with Fr. Terry and me (Fr. Rich) over pizza. The purpose of this session was to engage in a personal and meaningful conversation about the teen's faith and future as confirmed Catholics, and to let them know how proud we are of each and every one of them.

Holy Family Community has a history of celebrating Confirmation during the high school years. These extra years of formation are meant to allow our teens to challenge their belief-system in healthy ways, to grow deeper in their spiritual experiences and experience faith-in-action. Holy Family Catholic Community believes that Confirmation is neither a destination nor something we "get" and can then simply check off our list of things done. Instead, our teens are developing a real and personal desire to live out the Confirmation process in faith and service for the rest of their lives.

The high school FLAME program is therefore multifaceted and Confirmation is but one part of their life-long faith journey. During our teen's high school years, they have had many opportunities to spread their wings and engage in service opportunities within our communities that have deeply impacted their faith lives. The Sacrament of Confirmation does not signify the end of our teen's religious education or formation in the Catholic faith; rather it is a piece of their life-long journey. Likewise, it is not the end of parental responsibilities either. For parents, Confirmation represents both an important accomplishment in the parenting of

a Catholic son or daughter and a new opportunity to grow in faith with them in more concrete ways. Confirmation is not an end; it's a new beginning for all of us, whenever and wherever we gather in faith.

In Confirmation we are anointed for a special mission, like the priests, prophets and kings of old, as Jesus invites us into a new covenant.

We all share in the priesthood of Jesus Christ. We all are called, "to proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient; convince, reprimand, encourage through all patience and teaching." (2 Timothy 4:2) Confirmation is therefore an important milestone along the journey of our Catholic life. For teens, it represents an opportunity to look at their Catholic faith in a more adult way – exploring, discerning and deciding to make a willful and intentional commitment to learn and live the Catholic faith, beliefs, morals, and practices.

At Confirmation, the Bishop seals and recognizes the Baptism that was celebrated earlier in our life. Though Baptism is something we participated in with the help of our parents and godparents, it now represents a personal commitment to grow in the knowledge, love, and practice of our faith. When we are confirmed, we gain a new identity as a full member of the Church. We celebrate this sacrament and then carry out a personal decision to continue to learn, live and love through our faith. Every Catholic who is prepared to celebrate a sacrament is called to do so. May all of our newly Confirmed teens be assured of the love, support, and prayers of the entire parish community at Holy Family as they undertake this important sacrament. We are proud of our teens and most grateful to their parents and the staff and catechists who assisted in their faith formation.

Congratulations and Blessings to all our Newly Confirmed!

Fifth Sunday of Easter A STUBBORN VINE

After moving into my present home ten years ago, I was pleased to find that the back yard's landscaping included a very healthy-looking clematis, a quick-spreading vine that yields large, beautiful, star-shaped flowers. I had always wanted a yard with a clematis vine growing in it. Moving into the house in the summer, I was able to experience the beauty of hundreds of blossoms that covered the vines for most of the season. Since that summer, I have tried, year after year, to tend to this plant. I have read books about these easy-to-grow vines, consulted other gardeners, and searched the Internet for clues. I prune the clematis at the proper time and apply lime to the soil around the vine. Every summer for the last nine years, the total number of blossoms each year barely reaches five. I have been tempted to tear out the vine and plant a new one, yet I always remember those hundreds of blossoms that first summer and I am committed to trying again, year after year. FAITH BLOSSOMS. Our faith lives are sometimes like the reluctant clematis. Even when we try to nourish and tend our spiritual lives, we often experience only a few "blooms." The metaphor Jesus used, the vine and the branches, is a beautiful image and says much about persistence in the faith for today's believer. Sometimes our conversion experiences are slow in coming, and take lots of time and tending. As long as we keep our attention focused on the Lord, there is always hope that deep faith and conversion will blossom within and around us. The words of the Lord that continue to encourage us are embedded within today's Gospel passage: "Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing" (John 15:5).

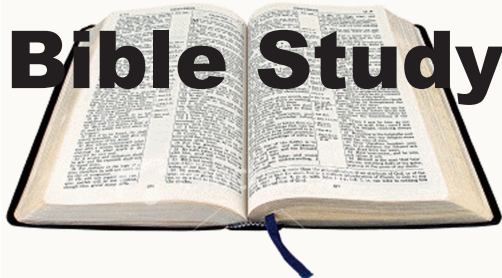

“The sacraments of Christian initiation – Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist – lay the foundations of every Christian life.”

(The Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1212)

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is now the standard practice for welcoming and incorporating men and women into full communion with the Catholic Church. The RCIA has fundamentally changed the way we view and implement Christian Initiation not just for adults but for children as well.

As a result

- Catholics see the sacraments of Christian Initiation – Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation – as intrinsically connected with each other comprising one process, which we call Christian initiation.
- **Christian initiation is seen as a developmental journey** by which a person, no matter their age, comes to a new understanding of him/herself as a disciple of Christ and member of His Church.
- **Christian initiation is “... a fruitful blend of instruction and formation in the faith;** it progresses through gradual stages, it unfolds the Church’s rites, symbols, and biblical signs; and it incorporates the participants into the Christian community of faith and worship.”
(National Directory for Catechesis 2005, pg. 116)

The **Rite of Christian Initiation for Children (RCIC)** at Holy Family is open to all registered parishioners who want to prepare their school age child/ren (6-14) for the sacraments of initiation. This includes those

- who have not been baptized,
- were baptized in another Christian Church (Lutheran, Baptist, Evangelical...) and now want to receive First Eucharist
- who are baptized but have not received any formal religious education or the sacraments of Reconciliation or Eucharist and are in 4th grade or older.

Participation in the RCIC involves

- Being a registered member of the parish
- Regular attendance at Mass with the weekend assembly
- Participation in the nine (9) RCIC sessions with a parent(s) held on two Saturdays following the 5 pm Mass and seven Sundays from 12:30-1:30pm
- Participation in a formal religious education class at grade level – either at Holy Family Catholic Academy or Family Faith classes

If you have any questions or want to register your child/ren in the RCIC process this coming Fall contact Dr. Peg Hanrahan, phanrahan@hoyfamilyparish.org

Children in grades 1-3 must have two years of formal religious education prior to receiving First Eucharist. Individuals who have been baptized are also prepared and receive the sacrament of Reconciliation as part of the RCIC process. Confirmation is celebrated at Holy Family during high school and generally not during the RCIC process.

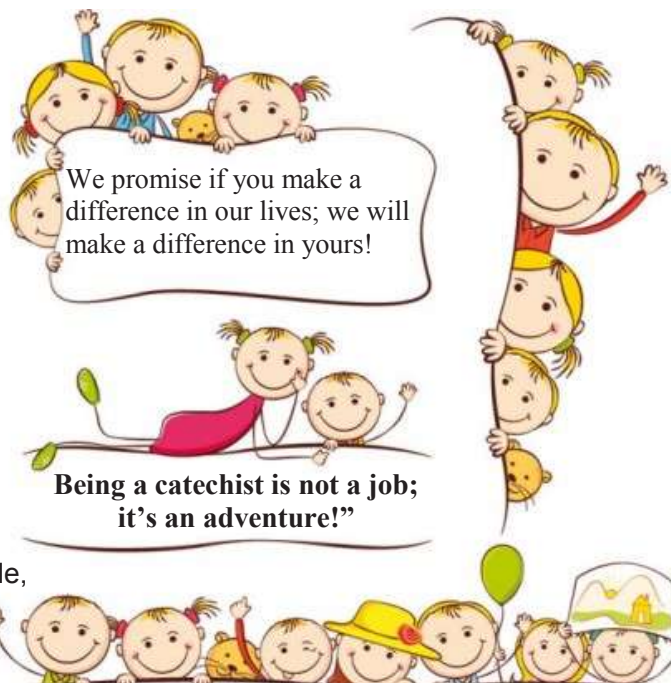

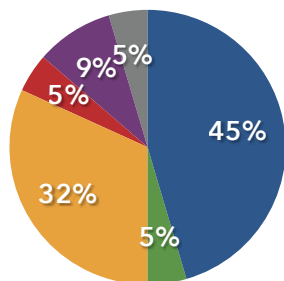

The Church's social teaching is a rich treasure of wisdom about building a just society and living lives of holiness amidst the challenges of modern society. Modern Catholic social teaching has been articulated through a tradition of papal, conciliar and episcopal documents. The depth and richness of this tradition can be understood best through a direct reading of these documents. In these brief reflections, we highlight several of the key themes that are at the heart of our Catholic social tradition.

Care for God's Creation

We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

Pope Francis wrote the 2015 encyclical *Laudato Si* or "Praised Be": *On Care For Our Common Home*. Here is an excerpt.

Climate change is a global problem with grave implications: environmental, social, economic, political and for the distribution of goods. It represents one of the principal challenges facing humanity in our day. Its worst impact will probably be felt by developing countries in coming decades. Many of the poor live in areas particularly affected by phenomena related to warming, and their means of subsistence are largely dependent on natural reserves and ecosystemic services such as agriculture, fishing and forestry. They have no other financial activities or resources which can enable them to adapt to climate change or to face natural disasters, and their access to social services and protection is very limited.

Family #30

Our new family consists of a single 23 year old African American mom and her two son's ages 4 and 2. She became homeless due low income status. She reported that she had a history of being homeless during her high school years.

Our mom is working on her goals and continues to seek another full time job. However, she is in desperate need of a car and must settle a debt before she can reinstate her license. Our mom has still not signed up for GED classes and is showing some hesitation since she struggled academically while in high school. She is being encouraged to sign up because special accommodations can be made for her limitations.

Goals:

- Save up at least 3 month's rent/saving IRS tax refund
- Obtain her GED
- Apply for low income housing
- Obtain her driver's license pay by paying off outstanding debts

Family #31

This family consists of a single mixed race (white and black) 24 year old female and her two son's ages 7 and 5. Client became homeless due to emotional abuse from her ex and his family with whom they lived. Her oldest child is from another relationship.

Our mom is doing quite well. She is excelling at work and her employer sent her to Texas for additional training. Our mom continues to attend school and is also meeting her savings goals each month. Client's case is pending for Medicaid, however, she will be reinstated within 30 days. She knows that her food stamps will be cut due to an increase in her income. Client reported that she has filed her taxes and is waiting to receive refunds. She plans to save her refunds to increase her savings.

Goals:

- Save up at least 3 month's rent/saving IRS tax refund
- Attend work and school as scheduled
- Apply for low income housing

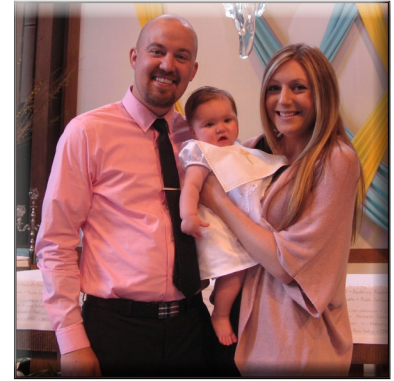

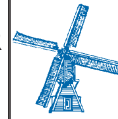
