Hope is Alive here at Holy Family Catholic Community! This virtue is manifest in so many ways in our community, but one of them is the dedication, creativity and hard work that so many people put into our ministries, services, activities, programs and, on a REGULAR basis, our Liturgical Arts Ministering Community.

We have just concluded the busiest week of the entire year with SEVERAL major celebrations from Palm Sunday to Easter. I would like to list as many of the ministries and services as possible that plan, execute, breakdown and clean up after our many events. I hope that this list gives you some idea of the complexities and very hard work that goes into what we host and carry out here at Holy Family Catholic Community. We strive to do them TOGETHER in order to CARRY OUT OUR MISSION of LEADING ALL TO NEW LIFE IN CHRIST THROUGH VIBRANT WORSHIP, LIFE-LONG LEARNING AND PASSIONATE COMMUNITY. We are not always perfect, and as evidence of that I will still omit some, and for that I apologize, but I hope this gives all of you a glimpse of the range and depth of our services and ministries, the effort expended by so many and the scope of work that is done here to carry out our Mission. On behalf of our entire community, I thank the following for:

LITURGICAL ARTS – planning Lent and Holy Week that began in September, carrying out the many prayer experiences of the season, crafting detailed liturgy plans that guide EACH celebration. The major components of Liturgical Arts include:

Table and Light – those who bear the light and set the table, follow slightly different instructions for the Masses and services from Palm Sunday to Easter.

Proclaimers – those who practice and execute several different scripture proclamations for various services.

Ushers – assist the assembly with seating, counting attendees, collecting the offering, directing communion flow.

Greeters – those who welcome all who enter our doors. We have improved in this area, but my vision of Holy Family is a much warmer, authentic and inviting welcoming at EVERY liturgy, but we have so many guests at Easter time and Christmas, this aspect of our mission is critical during these special times.

Mass Coordinators – provide direction and implementation of the liturgy plans that guide our celebrations.

Eucharistic Ministers – trained ministers who prayerfully serve the Body and Blood of Christ at many liturgies.

Presiders – not only homily preparation for various Masses but extra Reconciliation times here at Holy Family as well as surrounding parishes and Catholic high schools such as St. Viator and Carmel. Rehearsals – each of the major celebrations as well as the Passion Play require rehearsals, sometimes multiple rehearsals for all involved.

Music – planning music that expresses and complements the dramatic events of Holy Week; many, many practices for at least 4 major different Masses which include singers, musicians, guests musicians.

Environment – Art and Environment committee who create a prayerful atmosphere all year long but have so many extra challenges, particularly changing the environment from Palm Sunday to Holy Thursday to Good Friday to Easter not only in the church, but in the multitorium, gym and chapel.

Foot washers and **candle bearers** lighting the procession on Holy Thursday.

Adoration Ministry – those who set the table on Holy Thursday, removing host from and replacing host to Adoration Chapel on Holy Thursday and Easter Sunday.

Small Christian Communities – responsible for preparation of LB-SCC materials year 'round, and forming additional Small Christian Communities for Lent.

Volunteers – who assist with just about all of the above.

OTHERS INVOLVED IN HOLY WEEK ACTIVITIES:

Teen Faith – Passion Play: writing of a script that is presented and tweaked in November, auditions, rehearsals that go through January and up to Good Friday, parents who cook for the teens, set people, AV, lighting, music, choreography, costumes etc.

Family Faith – staff and catechists who help with Passion Play, Prayer Festival during Lent.

Human Concerns – Research, planning and creating the Lenten Social Justice Project, this year our Violence Prevention Initiative that has created Peaceful Pathways for Hope for so many, both here in our community and in two neighborhoods in Chicago.

Maintenance – Practical assistance and muscle needed to move, arrange, rearrange, assist with the creative planning of the environment and then set up and take down in three locations (multitorium, gym and church) as well as other areas such as the narthex and the knuckle, filling of the Baptismal font and moving various crosses used for Passion Play and adoration, and setting up for our PADS guests on Easter Sunday evening.

Academy - Stations of the Cross

AV – In order to pray and celebrate the way we have become accustomed to here at Holy Family, our AV efforts are critical. They help us to carry out our vibrant and unique liturgies. Creating each of the countless individual slides with the standard of excellence that you have come to appreciate takes A LOT of time.

Operations – overseeing all regular functions of our campus that we take extra care in attending to so ALL experience a warm, comfortable and holy place to pray and one that gets challenged when we have so many visitors, parishioners and guests assembling. (Think of the details that you attend to when you host a large crowd at your home. We have the same, right down to providing enough toilet paper and emptying the garbage.)

Knights of Columbus – Traffic control

Adult Faith – RCIA / Footsteps, who welcome adults seeking full communion with our church, meet with them beginning in September, walk with them during their continued formation, coordinate various rituals with Liturgy team, sponsors. There are always Lenten themed talks and presentations for adults and an annual parish mission.

Multicultural – Thursday evening preparation of the church for exposition of the Blessed Sacrament while the procession following Mass takes place.

ALL OF YOU – who share your prayerful presence here to heighten the celebrations.

Thank you ALL, and those I have omitted. God knows who you are and thanks you.

In the Gospel passage from John, Jesus appears twice to his disciples, and both times Jesus shows them his wounds from his crucifixion. Thomas actually touches the wounds. Jesus' wounds did not disappear after the Resurrection. Jesus meant for his followers to know that his sufferings, and ours, are part of our encounter with him. Jesus revealed how God is present in our human suffering, joining us in our most painful moments with consolation and with mercy.

Suffering is a great mystery, and we cannot adequately explain or justify the many wounds we experience in life. However, in prayer God can open a way forward. The Holy Spirit might offer wisdom to perceive when or how our sufferings make healing or hope possible for others or for ourselves. When we enter into this mystery we follow Jesus, who radically trusted God to transform his sufferings into new life.

In just a few verses, we see that the disciples received not only a new perspective on suffering, but a new energy and a new task in their lives. Their new energy, Jesus' very breath, is the Holy Spirit. Their new task, given in the same breath, is to embody God's forgiveness and proclaim this forgiveness to all. When Jesus appeared to them, he didn't castigate them for their abandonment and betrayal of him just days before. Jesus gave them the peace of being forgiven. He gave the Holy Spirit, so to forgive others.

The experience of being forgiven and forgiving others is at the heart of the Gospel. Jesus came to proclaim and to manifest God's desire to reconcile with God's very sons and daughters, us human beings. God is always working toward reconciliation and rejoices when any broken relationship is healed. When we accept forgiveness from God or from others, we are letting God into our hearts. When we forgive others or ourselves, we are participating in God's work.







Family & Teen Faith

Comprehensive, intentional and systematic: The Purpose of Religious Education and Faith Formation



The aim of catechesis is to make "...each person's faith living, explicit and active..." (National Catechetical Directory [NCD] # 14). Catechesis, like all educational endeavors, is developmental and occurs over time. The catechesis offered through the Family & Teen Faith (FTF) programs and Holy Family Catholic Academy (HFCA) is known as initiatory catechesis. This type of catechesis is basic and essential formation, which

- cultivates the roots of faith, which for Christians is characterized by a personal relationship with Christ;
- nurtures a distinctively Christian spiritual life, as opposed to an eclectic and/or general sense of the spiritual;
- prepares the person to be nourished at the table of the Eucharist and
- incorporates the individual in the ordinary life of the Christian community that knows, lives, celebrates and bears witness to the faith.

Initiatory catechesis "... includes more than instruction: it is an apprenticeship of the entire Christian life (NCD # 204). It is meant to be comprehensive, intentional and consistent. It is celebrated in the reception of all three sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation.

- An authentic, life-giving relationship with Him that is personal and unique, characterized by love, trust and faithfulness.
- An authentic, life-giving relationship with each other that is characterized by a trust born out of compassion.

What do we want from God?

A sense of deep connection with something

larger than ourselves;

- A sense of purpose and meaning and
- A sense of belonging to something that is bigger than ourselves.

Christian faith is about relationships. When the Scriptures tell us we are made in the image and likeness of God, they



reveal to us a central truth about human nature — we are hard wired to connect. We were made to love and be loved. We understand that God, Father, Son and Spirit, share a sacred communion that is not just loving, but the source of love itself. This single, indivisible union of three persons in one is life-giving (creates), radically healing (redeeming) and holy (sanctifying). We are called to experience this powerful presence, this source of life and love and all the energy that flows from it. We, like all of creation, were formed by this life and love, invited to participate in this life and love and called to share this life and love with all.

Developing relationships takes time and effort.

Becoming like Christ is a life-long pursuit. It does not happen haphazardly or half-heartedly. This is why our apprenticeship as Christians must be marked by intentionality and consistency. A deeply personal, intimate relationship is not an on again off again reality, it takes total commitment. This is why catechesis must be comprehensive. Such a commitment is not possible without support, which is why "catechesis is the responsibility of the whole Catholic community and occurs most fruitfully within the community" (NCD # 32).

Love is not convenient; it is abiding. Love is not self serving; it is sacrificial. To love is a purposeful act. Christian faith is rooted in love. Faith comes as a result of God's love, is nurtured and sustained by love and is recognized by the fruits of love.






