WHOLE AND HOLY TOGETHER

TODAY WE CELEBRATE what is often referred to as the birthday of the Church. Happy birthday to all! It's the Feast of Pentecost! We celebrate by wearing red today, or traditional clothing from our culture of origin. As we enter the doors of the church this weekend, sit in our seats, exchange the Sign of Peace, and share a sacred meal, we bring to completion the celebration of the Paschal Mystery – the suffering, death, resurrection, ascension and coming of the Holy Spirit on Jesus' disciples. Today's feast of Pentecost reminds us what being a Christian is all about. It is a call to holiness and wholeness together. We are a people representing many languages, cultures, histories, and colors. Together, we are more vibrant and more Spirit-filled.

Fr. Richard Rohr, the great spiritual writer of our time, describes Pentecost not as a private holiness, but as connectedness with others. Rohr quotes the words of St. Peter, "You are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people set apart, who have been called out of darkness into this wonderful light. Once you were not a people at all; now you are the very people of God." (1 Peter 2:9-10) Jesus' image of discipleship is the Reign of God and the Kingdom of God. St. Paul's uses the image of the Body of Christ. St. John's Gospel speaks of a journey into a mystical union where "I and the Father are one." (John 14:20) All of these writers give similar reasons for why we look for a communal image of our relationship with God, because an individual image cannot carry God's glory and greatness alone. Our relationship with God provides us with an open, relational invitation to become more whole and holy.

Here at Holy Family Catholic Community, we all play an important role in how we structure our lives, respect one another, receive questions openly, honor our differences, practice hospitality and generosity, and work for justice in all our relationships in the world. Richard Rohr reminds us that built into every one of us is a "human be-

coming...an incompleteness, set on a trajectory of personal growth and formation. God creates us as finite, limited, and dependent creatures."

Pentecost invites us to growth in love with God and others as we learn to be and become more loving and hospitable in our daily lives. As we become more loving, more just, more compassionate, more merciful, and more generous, we are also becoming more integrated into the life of God made possible by the sanctifying work of the Spirit. As we become more whole and holy, we become more like Christ.

Although we are all created to be and become the image of God for one another, becoming whole and holy is not guaranteed or automatic. It takes time, attention, and intentionality. We can aid in this process by creating contexts more amenable to Christian formation — contexts that invite questions, hold our tensions with a loving embrace, respecting our doubts, and trusting in the Spirit's work in the life of all God's people. The reading of Sacred Scripture, serving together, prayer, worship, meditation, and self-reflection are just a few practices from our tradition that are given to our parish community as gifts of God for our formation and faithful living.

As we celebrate together the birthday of the Church, may we celebrate how Holy Family Catholic Community participates with God is bringing all people together as one holy and whole family. May we also seek healing and forgiveness from God for the ways in which the Church has, at times, failed to be inclusive of the differences of one another who are made in the image and likeness of God. May this healing and reconciliation cross all the barriers that divide us - such as race, class, gender, sexual orientation, marital status - which can impinge on our lives as we work for complete wholeness and holiness.



Faith Formation for Generation Z: Part II



In Part I of this series, which ran in our bulletin the past two weeks, we identified Gen X as the youngest and largest generational cohort on the planet, 20 % of the US population but 36.3% of the world's population. They are the first truly "post-Christian" generation in American history and seriously question the need for religious faith. This poses real challenges for parents and Religious Educators when forming this generation in spiritual practices that will be meaningful to them and providing them with a core set of beliefs and morals that will enhance their lives.

Though suspicious of religious faith Generation Z values spirituality.

At first glance the research can be confusing. Gen Z is twice as likely to self- identify as atheist (as compared to former generations). Yet when affiliated with religious faith, they are more likely to be engaged than their parents (i.e. 41% say they attend weekly religious services, compared with 18% of millennials at the same ages). This trend is visible among our Holy Family teens. Many of our teens remain active and engaged in parish life even after their parents move to the sidelines. The reason they give for doing so is the sense of community they experience - the connections they make.

How do we reconcile these apparent inconsistencies?

Learning more about what makes this youngest generation tick may help us better understand their wariness of traditional models of religious faith and guide our efforts in forming them as modern Christian disciples.

The most ethnically and racially diverse group ever, this cohort feels positive about the idea of increasing racial and gender diversity. They see themselves as global citizens. Having grown up immersed in social media they are highly interactive and thrive on connection, resulting in their highly developed social and emotional intelligence. Many leave religious traditions because of religious opposition to LGBTQ rights, their ignorance on the subject of sex education and science literacy, their hypocrisy on opposing both abortion and contraception and their treatment of women, people of color and those who do not agree with them. This is true of most Holy Family teens. Generally more

morally conservative than their elders.

Gen Z abhors exclusion in all its forms.

Generation Z will become the most educated generation

in the world and already demonstrate a deep commitment to life-long

learning. 50% of Gen Z's will be university educated compared to 33% of millennials and 25% of Gen X. Technology has put information at their finger tips making them adept researchers who know how to self-educate and find answers.

They value intellectual rigor and are turned off by watered down religious truth expressed in tired cliché's. We need to stop pretending that what they want is entertainment rather than real engagement with honest intellectual exchange about questions of faith.

Generation Z wants to change the world. They volunteer in record numbers, especially for humanitarian projects. They are generous and genuinely moved by the suffering of others. Innovation consultant Jeremy Finch describes this cohort as practical pragmatists dedicated to lasting social change. Gen Z is looking for more

taken seriously and empowered to lead. This is the way to connect to their spiritual search. The social teachings of Catholicism and its rich intellectual heritage has a lot to say to our young.

We are way ahead of previous year's total for early registrations. If you still need to register call the Faith Office, 847-907-3447, pick up a registration form in the Parish Office or register on line at https://holyfamilyparish.org/family-and-teen-faith-registration.

Remember kids are placed in classes on a first come, first serve basis.

Important Notes to Parents

- Students are <u>not</u> placed in a class until the registration process is complete. The earlier you register the more choices you will have.
- Archdiocesan policy requires that children/teens who are requesting to prepare to receive a sacrament must have at least two years of formal religious education prior to the reception of the sacrament.
- To receive the lower tuition rate you must be a <u>registered</u> parishioner.
- 2017-18 tuition balances must be paid in full OR parents must make arrangements for tuition assistance with Dr. Peg Hanrahan <u>prior to</u> registration for 2018-19.
 - * Tuition assistance is available to all registered parishioners

Why not consider homeschooling for Religious Education @ Holy Family

Why home school for religious education?

Teaching religious education at home is a wonderful option for many families. Home schooling, with the parent as catechist, has unique benefits and is still seen as a partnership between parents and the parish.

Benefits of home schooling for religious education

- To have more quality family time
- To give children with special needs one-on-one attention
- > To eliminate scheduling conflicts
- > To provide stability in the midst of frequent moves


Does the Catholic Church allow home schooling for Religious Education?

Absolutely. The Second Vatican Council document on Christian education, *Gravissimum Educationis*, states that parents, society, and the Church all have a duty regarding the education of children, but that the primary and principal duty belongs to parents.

What is the role of the Parish community in home schooling for religious education and what is expected of parents who choose to home school their children for religious education?

The **General Directory for Catechesis (GCD)** reminds us that education in the faith is carried out in different ways in different places. At Holy Family we realize that much if not most education in faith takes place outside a classroom setting: in the family, in the neighborhood, in the larger parish community. It is in these settings that children see and experience the faith <u>lived</u>.

- Liturgy in the parish community is where the proclamation of the Gospel begins and where we, regardless of age, are invited to conversion and to follow Christ.
 - 1. Families who home-school for religious education will be asked to make a commitment to participate in the Sunday assembly on a regular basis.
- Fenuine religious education <u>informs</u>, <u>forms</u>, and <u>transforms</u>! The Church calls all religious educators, including parents to foster both knowledge and understanding of Catholic teaching and practice, and develop an appreciation for Sacred Scripture and tradition in young people.
 - 2. Families who home-school for religious education will be asked use catechistical materials provided by the parish, submit completed work online and meet with one of the Faith or Teen Faith staff at regular intervals.
 - ➤ Bringing children to the parish programs for sacramental preparation further enriches their lives by bringing them into contact with other adults and with peers on the same faith journey.



3. Families who home school their children for religious education are asked to participate in the parish-based sacramental preparation programs. In the case of Confirmation, home schooled students will be asked to take part in community service opportunities, attend the FLAME 1 & 2 Retreats, and attend one of the PIZZA WITH THE PASTOR sessions.

The cost of the home-schooling option for Religious Education at Holy Family

- **Tuition:** \$200.00 per <u>family</u> per year (a \$100.00 non-refundable fee is due at the time of registration)
- > Instructional Materials: \$20.00 per child per year
- > Sacramental and retreat fees are in addition to tuition.

In addition, (people with mental illness) always have the inalienable right not only to be considered as an image of God and therefore as a person, but also to be treated as such."

"The people of God, the church, are called to be communities of compassion, hope and justice for people with mental illness and their families. It is important that persons with mental illness feel welcomed and supported within the parish. This requires the purest spiritual outreach, i.e., non-judgmental love and acceptance of the individual. The more that parishes can project non-judgmental love, the more its members suffering with mental illness, or those who have a family member with mental illness, are likely to acknowledge their needs and overcome their fears of rejection."






