This Friday, we celebrated graduation at Holy Family Catholic Academy. We are so proud of all our graduates as they reach this significant milestone. Fr. Terry, Fr. Rich, Principal Kate O'Brien, Assistant Principle Laura Clark, all our teachers and supporting staff are so proud of your achievements.

Congratulations to all other graduates from their respective grammar schools, high schools, and colleges. All our graduates should feel proud of themselves as well. We are blessed to celebrate all our graduates and their achievements, perseverance and successes. It's one of the most important times to reflect on and give thanks for all the young people in our lives and feel good as parents and mentors. Graduation is a coming of age, a right-of-passage, an official way to recognize this important step into their next stage of life. Congratulations All Graduates!

As we honor our graduates over the next several weeks, this weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Holy Trinity. Today's scripture readings remind us that God is love and God is relationship. God is therefore community, family, parish, friendship, hospitality. In proclaiming a Trinity of relationships, we proclaim that the reality of our everyday dealings with each other is not a "secular" event, but the stuff of church, and the "stuff" of God. Ron Rolheiser sums this up well where he writes: "...God is not, first of all, a formula, a dogma, a creedal statement, or a metaphysics that demands our assent. God is a flow of living relationships, a trinity, a family of life that we can enter, taste, breathe within, and let flow through us. God is not an abstraction. But the one in whom everything and everyone has their being." We are all held in life within a trinity of love. It is in the everyday reality of our dealings with each other that the Trinity lives: at our dinner tables, or even over a bottle of good wine, in our arguments, disagreements, and frustrations with each other,

and in the simple giving and receiving of hospitality, warmth, openness and tenderness. None of these is ever "secular," no matter how earthly they may seem. These dealings with each other are the "stuff" of God. God is relationship! The Trinity is alive and well in all of us until the end of time.

Since we were all created by God, the Feast of the Holy Trinity is also a renewal of our mission as a parish community to live in communion with God and one another. The call to live both with and for others means being a people who welcome one another and bearing witness to the beauty of the Gospel, but also a commission to live in mutual love towards one another, sharing joys and sorrows, learning to ask for and grant forgiveness, and valuing our different charisms. Pope Francis told the pilgrims in St. Peter's Square, "our being created in the image and likeness of God-communion calls us to understand ourselves as beings-in-relation, and to live interpersonal relationships in solidarity and reciprocal love."

The Gospel reading from John is taken from a portion of Jesus' discourse shortly before his Passion, in which Christ outlines the relationship between the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Knowing that he must fulfill the Father's plan through his own death and resurrection, Jesus assures the disciples that he will not abandon them, "because his mission will be continued by the Holy Spirit." May God bless and strengthen our relationships with one another on this Feast of the Holy Trinity.

"Happy Anniversary!" Speak those words to our own Fr. Rich Jakubik. He just celebrated the twenty-fifth anniversary of his Ordination to the priesthood! He has baptized, preached, performed marriages and buried the dead with love, care, and holiness. He did not want a celebration or personal recognition! (So be sure you keep quiet by whispering "Happy Anniversary" in his ear.) And say a prayer for him as he continues his ministry to all of us at Holy Family!

Why did you join RCIA at Holy Family?

"I started the journey as someone wanting to get married in the Church with full participation during our Mass. After going through the process, I have found much stronger faith, and understanding of how God has played such an important role in every aspect of my life."

"I initially joined RCIA to unify my faith with my wife and daughter, who were already Catholic. However, as the journey progressed, I felt myself reaching a new level of personal faith with Christ, who I saw in every person I encountered on the journey. 
Catholic Theological Union Chicago, IL Summer Institute 2018 June 11-15, 2018 June 18-22, 2018 June 25-29, 2018

Faith Formation for Generation Z: Part II



In Part I of this series, which ran in our bulletin the past two weeks, we identified Gen X as the youngest and largest generational cohort on the planet, 20 % of the US population but 36.3% of the world's population. They are the first truly "post-Christian" generation in American history and seriously question the need for religious faith. This poses real challenges for parents and Religious Educators when forming this generation in spiritual practices that will be meaningful to them and providing them with a core set of beliefs and morals that will enhance their lives.

Though suspicious of religious faith Generation Z values spirituality.

At first glance the research can be confusing. Gen Z is twice as likely to self- identify as atheist (as compared to former generations). Yet when affiliated with religious faith, they are more likely to be engaged than their parents (i.e. 41% say they attend weekly religious services, compared with 18% of millennials at the same ages). This trend is visible among our Holy Family teens. Many of our teens remain active and engaged in parish life even after their parents move to the sidelines. The reason they give for doing so is the sense of community they experience - the connections they make.

How do we reconcile these apparent inconsistencies?

Learning more about what makes this youngest generation tick may help us better understand their wariness of traditional models of religious faith and guide our efforts in forming them as modern Christian disciples.

The most ethnically and racially diverse group ever, this cohort feels positive about the idea of increasing racial and gender diversity. They see themselves as global citizens. Having grown up immersed in social media they are highly interactive and thrive on connection, resulting in their highly developed social and emotional intelligence. Many leave religious traditions because of religious opposition to LGBTQ rights, their ignorance on the subject of sex education and science literacy, their hypocrisy on opposing both abortion and contraception and their treatment of women, people of color and those who do not agree with them. Looking for an alternative to weekly Faith classes?

Why not consider homeschooling for Religious Education @ Holy Family

Why home school for religious education?

Teaching religious education at home is a wonderful option for many families. Home schooling, with the parent as catechist, has unique benefits and is still seen as a partnership between parents and the parish.

Benefits of home schooling for religious education

- > To have more quality family time
- To give children with special needs one-on-one attention
- > To eliminate scheduling conflicts
- > To provide stability in the midst of frequent moves

Does the Catholic Church allow home schooling for Religious Education?

Absolutely. The Second Vatican Council document on Christian education, *Gravissimum Educationis*, states that parents, society, and the Church all have a duty regarding the education of children, but that the primary and principal duty belongs to parents.

What is the role of the Parish community in home schooling for religious education and what is expected of parents who choose to home school their children for religious education?

The **General Directory for Catechesis (GCD)** reminds us that education in the faith is carried out in different ways in different places. At Holy Family we realize that much if not most education in faith takes place outside a classroom setting: in the family, in the neighborhood, in the larger parish community. It is in these settings that children see and experience the faith lived.

- Liturgy in the parish community is where the proclamation of the Gospel begins and where we, regardless of age, are invited to conversion and to follow Christ.
 - 1. Families who home-school for religious education will be asked to make a commitment to participate in the Sunday assembly on a regular basis.
- Fenuine religious education <u>informs</u>, <u>forms</u>, and <u>transforms</u>! The Church calls all religious educators, including parents to foster both knowledge and understanding of Catholic teaching and practice, and develop an appreciation for Sacred Scripture and tradition in young people.
 - 2. Families who home-school for religious education will be asked use catechistical materials provided by the parish, submit completed work online and meet with one of the Faith or Teen Faith staff at regular intervals.
 - ➤ Bringing children to the parish programs for sacramental preparation further enriches their lives by bringing them into contact with other adults and with peers on the same faith journey.



3. Families who home school their children for religious education are asked to participate in the parish-based sacramental preparation programs. In the case of Confirmation, home schooled students will be asked to take part in community service opportunities, attend the FLAME 1 & 2 Retreats, and attend one of the PIZZA WITH THE PASTOR sessions.

The cost of the home-schooling option for Religious Education at Holy Family

- **Tuition:** \$200.00 per <u>family</u> per year (a \$100.00 non-refundable fee is due at the time of registration)
- ➤ Instructional Materials: \$20.00 per child per year
- > Sacramental and retreat fees are in addition to tuition.

She found this resource on her own called the Living Free Program. The program needs to be completed in 90 days and our mom is very excited because she wants to pursue a license in cosmetology. She is still saving! With the help of her tax refund, she has plans to reinstate her license and buy an affordable car. Her children are stable and happy!

Goals:

- · Save up at least 3 month's rent/saving IRS tax refund
- · Obtain her GED
- · Apply for low income housing
- Obtain her driver's license by paying off outstanding debts
