Where do you find belonging?

This weekend, Jesus invites us to reflect on our sense of belonging and where it derives from. You may think of the grammar or high school you attended; the town, city, or country you grew up in; the university you graduated from; your job or company; parish affiliation; memberships; leagues; clubs; and sport teams you cheer for. Another major source of belonging comes from our family of origin and the new families we create. Belonging is a foundational concept in the Bible which begins with the book of Genesis. God was initially the source of people's sense of belonging, not being part of a tribe, nation, or family. Whether it be biological or interest based, Jesus reminds us in the gospel of Mark that our sense of belonging is incomplete whenever it serves to mark who is in and who is out, who belongs and who doesn't.

As we reflect on the Gospel of Mark, Jesus makes a claim that belonging is multifaceted in its inclusivity of all people who share a common sense of mercy, love, justice, who welcome the refugee, seek holiness, the wellbeing of others, and do the will of God. Jesus now draws a new group around himself. He gathers a family that is no longer characterized by blood, political affiliation, nationhood, race, or even theology. Belonging is to be defined by all who do the will of God. Jesus gives us a new criteria of what constitutes a family, not to do away with our family loyalties and values, but to transform them to their true and deeper meaning.

Jesus is speaking directly to you and me and all our deeply embedded cultural assumptions about belonging. He determines that his own true family is not by blood relations or kinship. Belonging and family are to be about doing the will of God. His words are meant to radically widen our own concepts of "belonging"

and "family." The loyalty, love and service that is properly given to one another in family life is now due to God and through our relationships with one another in the wider "family" of believers. As members of the Holy Family Catholic community, our relationships with one another are to be reconfigured in and through our relationship with Christ. In and through him, we are now all brothers, sisters, mothers, and children to and for one another.

No matter who we are or where we come from, the call of belonging extends to all people. Jesus aims to break down every wall that serves to divide us and calls us to be a part of his new family. All other lovalties and commitments fall short and pale in comparison to the call that Jesus proposes to our lives. Being part of Jesus' family means that we will continually open our lives to him, acknowledge that he is in charge, and embrace both the invitation and the challenge of following him. Jesus' words prompt us to consider the relationship between our own family members and what it means to know and do God's will. The people that Jesus calls his family, his true mother and brothers, are all those who seek and do the will of God.

May the words of Jesus invoke in all of us today a new vision of life in which all people are to care for one another both physically, emotionally, and spiritually. Our spiritual lives are now meant to transcend all our old concepts of family life. The rich, vibrant faith community of Holy Family must seek to draw us more deeply and fully into the will of God. Let us seek our true belonging in our relationship with Christ and recognize the wider family or household of God that is characterized by a sense of unity, spirit, and ability to stand strong in the things of God.



Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

- 1. Ezekial talks about trees, fruit and birds. Although this is simple imagery, what does this passage tell us about the power and majesty of God's creation and our obligation to protect it?

- I dry up the green tree and make the dry tree flourish." What is Ezekial telling us about God's plan for the world?
- 3. Paul concludes the second reading by saying that: "each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil." Does this passage seem to contradict Paul's previous writings that we are saved by grace? What are your thoughts on grace versus works?
- 4. Jesus often spoke in parables to reveal to us some aspect of the kingdom of God. What parable is your favorite and why?
- 5. Is the Church today doing a good job of reaching people in a way that they are able to understand? How can we personally do a better job of making the Church more inviting?



Faith Formation for Generation Z: Part II



In Part I of this series, which ran in our bulletin the past two weeks, we identified Gen X as the youngest and largest generational cohort on the planet, 20 % of the US population but 36.3% of the world's population. They are the first truly "post-Christian" generation in American history and seriously question the need for religious faith. This poses real challenges for parents and Religious Educators when forming this generation in spiritual practices that will be meaningful to them and providing them with a core set of beliefs and morals that will enhance their lives.

Though suspicious of religious faith Generation Z values spirituality.

At first glance the research can be confusing. Gen Z is twice as likely to self- identify as atheist (as compared to former generations). Yet when affiliated with religious faith, they are more likely to be engaged than their parents (i.e. 41% say they attend weekly religious services, compared with 18% of millennials at the same ages). This trend is visible among our Holy Family teens. Many of our teens remain active and engaged in parish life even after their parents move to the sidelines. The reason they give for doing so is the sense of community they experience - the connections they make.

How do we reconcile these apparent inconsistencies?

Learning more about what makes this youngest generation tick may help us better understand their wariness of traditional models of religious faith and guide our efforts in forming them as modern Christian disciples.

The most ethnically and racially diverse group ever, this cohort feels positive about the idea of increasing racial and gender diversity. They see themselves as global citizens. Having grown up immersed in social media they are highly interactive and thrive on connection, resulting in their highly developed social and emotional intelligence. Many leave religious traditions because of religious opposition to LGBTQ rights, their ignorance on the subject of sex education and science literacy, their hypocrisy on opposing both abortion and contraception and their treatment of women, people of color and those who do not agree with them. This is true of most Holy Family teens. Generally more

morally conservative than their elders,

Gen Z abhors exclusion in all its forms.

Generation Z will become the most educated generation in the world and already

demonstrate a deep

commitment to life-long learning. 50% of Gen Z's will be university educated compared to 33% of millennials and 25% of Gen X. Technology has put information at their finger tips making them adept researchers who know how to self-educate and find answers.

They value intellectual rigor and are turned off by watered down religious truth expressed in tired cliché's. We need to stop pretending that what they want is entertainment rather than real engagement with honest intellectual exchange about questions of faith.

Looking for an alternative to weekly Faith classes?

Why not consider homeschooling for Religious Education @ Holy Family

Why home school for religious education?

Teaching religious education at home is a wonderful option for many families. Home schooling, with the parent as catechist, has unique benefits and is still seen as a partnership between parents and the parish.

Benefits of home schooling for religious education

- > To have more quality family time
- To give children with special needs one-on-one attention
- > To eliminate scheduling conflicts
- > To provide stability in the midst of frequent moves

Does the Catholic Church allow home schooling for Religious Education?

Absolutely. The Second Vatican Council document on Christian education, *Gravissimum Educationis*, states that parents, society, and the Church all have a duty regarding the education of children, but that the primary and principal duty belongs to parents.

What is the role of the Parish community in home schooling for religious education and what is expected of parents who choose to home school their children for religious education?

The **General Directory for Catechesis (GCD)** reminds us that education in the faith is carried out in different ways in different places. At Holy Family we realize that much if not most education in faith takes place outside a classroom setting: in the family, in the neighborhood, in the larger parish community. It is in these settings that children see and experience the faith <u>lived</u>.

- ➤ Liturgy in the parish community is where the proclamation of the Gospel begins and where we, regardless of age, are invited to conversion and to follow Christ.
 - 1. Families who home-school for religious education will be asked to make a commitment to participate in the Sunday assembly on a regular basis.
- Fenuine religious education <u>informs</u>, <u>forms</u>, and <u>transforms</u>! The Church calls all religious educators, including parents to foster both knowledge and understanding of Catholic teaching and practice, and develop an appreciation for Sacred Scripture and tradition in young people.
 - 2. Families who home-school for religious education will be asked use catechistical materials provided by the parish, submit completed work online and meet with one of the Faith or Teen Faith staff at regular intervals.
 - ➤ Bringing children to the parish programs for sacramental preparation further enriches their lives by bringing them into contact with other adults and with peers on the same faith journey.



3. Families who home school their children for religious education are asked to participate in the parish-based sacramental preparation programs. Tony was cheerful and seemed surprised but interested in these services. The client disclosed that he was having a difficult time coping with his situation and was interested in receiving assistance with transportation to and from medical appointments and attending group and individual counseling.

Tony has been with Catholic Charities for about one year. During this time, he has utilized transportation, counseling services and is making progress towards goals he set toward education, developing coping skills and asking for support when needed. Tony has said that despite losses in the past, now that he has all of us, he cannot imagine his life without the people and support from Catholic Charities. 
