Fr. Terry Keehan

We celebrate fathers this weekend, and even though reports indicate that far more gifts are given to mothers on Mother's Day, I also learned something interesting. One report said that families, particularly children, tend to pool their resources and buy dad one gift as opposed to individual family members who tend to buy their mothers individual gifts. Isn't that interesting? At the risk of reading too much into this, it may indicate a more communal sense of gratitude for dads that comes as a great compliment to the individual gratitude for moms. Perhaps it indicates our inert appreciation for the individual attention we receive from both dads and moms and the communal sense of support and leadership that parents provide.

I am also certain that for some families and at some times the communal and individual gift giving on Father's Day and Mother's Day switches. Either way, I would like to use this gift giving pattern as an opportunity for all of us to reflect on the complimentary communal role of parents and individual roles of parents. At times we need individual attention and focus from parents, and at times we need to be together as families and be nurtured by the energy of the group, however large or small.

Many family structures do not permit a partnership or balance of the communal and individual roles of both parents for many reasons, and this Father's Day and next Mother's Day may be opportunities for you to acknowledge your parents communal presence to and with your entire family, regardless of your family structure, be it a single parent home or some separation from parents geographically, physically or emotionally. And may this Father's Day be an opportunity for you to acknowledge and appreciate your father's individual attention to and with you, as well as his attention and support of your entire family where possible, if possible, be he living or deceased, or whatever your experience of your father.

I want to thank one particular father as I return from my mini-sabbatical, and that is Father Rich Jakubik. He has assumed many additional responsibilities in my absence including writing this column. I want to express particular admiration and gratitude for his excellent article on the feast of The Body and Blood of Christ. As I read it from afar, I was moved by his connection between Social Justice and the Eucharist. Thanks, Rich!

Another father that I wish to thank is Father Bill Zavaski who also stepped up during my absence. Bill has significantly enriched my faith journey, that of my family and my priestly ministry journey for many years. His presence at St. James Parish in Arlington Heights during my growing up years was a blessing. And speaking of fathers, he and my father Bill shared many

discussions and even some disagreements, but my dad came to have a respect for Bill Zavaski that lasted until his death. My dad continually expressed admiration and respect for Bill Zavaski's ministry and shared that respect with our family on a regular basis. Thanks, Bill Zavaski!

My time away was indeed a blessing. I spent extended periods of time at the Sycamore Tree Retreat House in Swan Lake, Montana and St. Thomas the Apostle Retreat Center in Cody, Wyoming. These were both places of solitude in different settings, both filled with the beauty of God's creation. Montana provided me with a daily view of the Rocky Mountains, tall pine trees, daily walks with the threat of (but never an encounter with) bears and mountain lions. Driving to the retreat house I was greeted by a pack of eight wild horses running right down the highway. Wyoming was a picture of the open plain with mountains in the background and just about everything western in nature, Buffalo Bill Cody, the rodeo and more.

I am not usually drawn to nature and I didn't venture out a whole lot, but I did appreciate the BIG sky that I came to embrace as an image of a very BIG God who looks over us every second of our lives.

The setting provided me with an opportunity to write and that was my first and most important goal, I started with a couple of ideas and paths for future books, but eventually settled in on extended writing about work. I am fascinated with the varying views, opinions and experiences of work. My contention is that our work is God's work. God began working in the story of creation and we are all asked to continue that work in the endeavors of our lives. I will keep you updated on the progress of this writing endeavor.

Most importantly, I have returned with a profound appreciation for Holy Family. I realize what a deeply spiritual, although sometimes complex, community of faith we have here. I cherish the energy and creativity we have here. I appreciate the empowerment of the laity and our progressive spirit. We are in this together and I appreciate that many of you share that conviction.

Tomorrow starts our tri-annual Priest Convocation at Pheasant Run Resort in St. Charles. Fr. Rich and I will be attending this convocation as will so many of the other priests in the Archdiocese. Cardinal Cupich has asked that parishes hold Word and Communion services on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday mornings while we are away. This enables parishioners to gather in prayer, receive the nourishment of God's Word proclaimed and Communion.

Because we here at Holy Family also have 7:00pm evening Masses on Monday and Wednesday, we will have Masses at those times as scheduled.



- ➤ WE WILL BEGIN TO PLACE STUDENTS IN CLASSES ON JULY 1ST. Students are <u>not</u> placed in a class until the registration process is complete. If you register late we cannot guarantee your choice of class placement. If your child has been with a particular group and wants to remain in that group, register now.
- Archdiocesan policy requires that children/teens who are requesting to prepare to receive a sacrament must have at least <u>two years of formal religious education</u> prior to the reception of the sacrament.
- Archdiocesan policy requires those requesting to prepare for First Eucharist or Confirmation must be registered in a Catholic parish. If you are registered in a parish other than Holy Family you must obtain a letter from the parish you are registered in stating you are member of their parish.
- > 2017-18 tuition balances must be paid in full OR parents must make arrangements for an extended payment plan with Dr. Peg Hanrahan prior to registration for 2018-19.

If you were registered this past year turn in your **Fast Track Form ASAP**. Fast Track Forms can be dropped off in the Parish Office or the Faith Office. If you are coming to Spirit Camp drop off your Fast Track form when you drop off or pick up the kids.



Faith Formation for Generation Z: Part III



In Part II of this series, which ran in our bulletin the past two weeks, we identified Gen Z as the youngest and largest generational cohort on the planet. Though suspicious of religious faith this generation values spirituality and does not settle for religious truth expressed in tired cliché's. This cohort of practical pragmatists dedicated to lasting social change are looking for more **not less** from religious education. They are searching for spiritual practices that will be meaningful to them and a core set of beliefs and morals that will enhance their lives.

The intellectual tradition of Catholicism and its deep and broad variety of spiritualities has much to offer Gen Z

When affiliated with religious faith, Gen Z are more likely to be engaged than their parents. This trend is visible among our Holy Family teens. It is well established that only between 22-28% of Catholic teens remain engaged after being confirmed. At Holy Family a remarkable 68% remain active and engaged after Confirmation. The reason they give for doing so is the sense of community they experience and the vitality of the Teen Faith community.

These independent thinkers are self starters and imaginative problem solvers. Google has always existed and Wi-Fi is a given. These

young people are used to having answers only seconds away. They spend between six and nine hours a day absorbing media and Pew Research reports 92 percent go online daily and 24 percent are online

"almost constantly". **They are beyond 'tech savvy'**. They've never known a world without the internet or cell phones; younger Z's have never known a world without smartphones.



Often thought to have short attention spans, the truth might be they have developed highly selective filters to help them sort through the enormous amounts of information literally at their fingertips.

Due social media they have grown up with the knowledge that they can speak to anyone around the world at a moment's notice. This has made Gen Z highly interactive, one that thrives on connection, resulting in their highly developed social and emotional intelligence. The sense of belonging that faith communities provide speaks to a very real felt need.

Family #30

Our family consists of a single 23 year old African American mom and her two son's ages 4 and 2. She became homeless due low income status. She reported that she had a history of being homeless during her high school years.

Our mom is doing well and continues to work on her goals. She recently expressed that she wants to start her own cleaning service since learning details about the business and feels confident she can be very successful. She is working towards achieving her GED and saving money. Her income tax refund should arrive soon. The children are doing well and making progress in school. *Goals:*

- Save up at least 3 month's rent/saving IRS tax refund
- Obtain her GED
- · Apply for low income housing
- · Obtain her driver's license by paying off outstanding debts

Family #31

This family consists of a single mixed race (white and black) 24 year old female and her two son's ages 7 and 5. Client became homeless due to emotional abuse from her ex and his family with whom they lived. Her oldest child is from another relationship.

Our mom is doing well however, she has had some car problems recently. The car's engine is not working properly and in need of repair. The car was purchased from a dealership in Rockford, IL and the salesman says there is nothing that they can do since a warranty did not come with the car. They will give her a small refund but our mom will have to cover the remaining portion of the repair bill with some of her savings.

Our mom also reported that she accepted the general manager position at her job. She is very excited about the additional responsibilities and the extra money she will make. The child's father will be as supportive as he can by watching her children when she is working long hours. Both children are doing well. *Goals:*

- Save up at least 3 month's rent/saving IRS tax refund
- · Attend work and school as scheduled
- · Apply for low income housing




