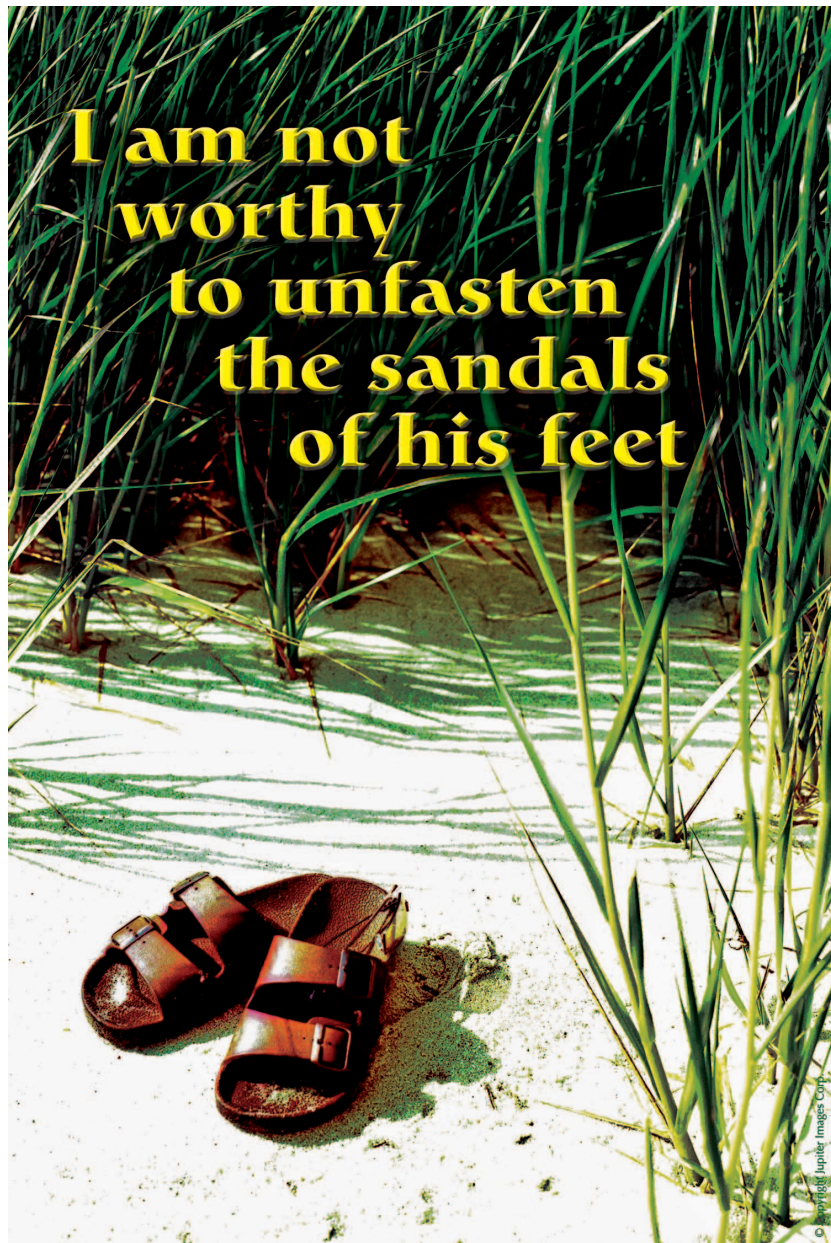

Fr. Terry Keehan

I have often held John the Baptist as an example of what every Christian should do. Let's look past his unconventional dress and his somewhat wild demeanor. Those two aspects of his personality can be explained by the almost certain fact that he was taken in by an itinerant community in the desert around the Dead Sea called the Essenes.

The reason that I hold up his example is that he points out the presence of Christ as he sees him. If there ever was a person who could have pointed to himself as the ultimate spiritual leader it was John the Baptist. But instead of turning attention to himself, he points people toward Jesus. In fact, he sees his entire identity only in relation to Jesus Christ. He sees himself as 'One crying out... prepare the way of the Lord.' And says, 'One is coming who is far greater than I.' *How do you point out the presence of Christ to others?*

Even though he is a cousin of Jesus, they did not grow up together and were certainly not close. We know this from their encounters later on as adults.

This part of the story is closely tied with the feast that we celebrate this weekend, one that calls our attention to his birth.

His parents, Elizabeth and Zechariah, were advanced in years when John was born. People did not regularly live past the age of 50-55 back then, so John was orphaned most likely in his teenage years, and thus his experience with the Essene community of desert dwellers who regularly took in orphaned children.

John joins key scripture figures who were born to aging parents who did not think that they could conceive a child. (Abraham and Sara gave birth to Isaac when they were advanced in years). This phenomena seems to underscore John's destiny as a prophet. However, his father Zechariah questioned God as to whether he and his wife could conceive, and as a punishment Zechariah is left unable to speak until he verifies in writing that his son's name will be John. He then goes on to proclaim the great canticle that bears his name from the Gospel of Luke. He says, in praise of his son John the Baptist:

"Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel
for He has come to His people

and set them free.
He has raised up a mighty savior
born of the house of David His servant.
Even as he promised through the mouth of
His holy prophets from of old,
salvation from our enemies
And from the hand of all who hate us
to show mercy to our fathers
And to be mindful of his holy covenant
And to the oath he swore to Abraham
our father, and to grant us that
rescued from the hand of enemies,
without fear we might worship Him
in holiness and righteousness,
all the days of our life.
And you my child will be called the Prophet
of the most high,
For you will go before the Lord
to prepare his ways,
To give his people knowledge of salvation,
Through the forgiveness of their sins,
because of the tender mercy of our God
by which the daybreak from on high will visit us,
To shine on those who sit in darkness
and death's shadow,
To guide our feet into the path of peace."

This past Lent, Holy Family embarked on a Lenten Social Justice Project supporting two programs working toward ending the violence in their neighborhoods.

St. Sabina's Strong Futures Program, in the south side neighborhood of Auburn Gresham, created a model to serve young men by connecting them to existing workforce and supportive resources, thereby creating a pathway for them to be successful in the workplace and in life.

Catholic Charities' Peace Corner Youth Center, on the west side in the Austin neighborhood, empowers children, youth and their families to develop stability and self-reliance by enhancing their education, health, safety and connections to their community.

Holy Family parishioners were touched by the impact these programs are having upon young people and were extremely generous in their giving. A total of \$103,134 was collected. It is a pleasure to present a check to each of them for \$51,567 at Mass on Sunday.

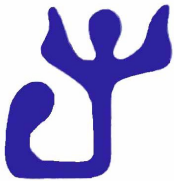

➤ WE WILL BEGIN TO PLACE STUDENTS IN CLASSES ON JULY 1ST. Students are not placed in a class until the registration process is complete. If you register late we cannot guarantee your choice of class placement. If your child has been with a particular group and wants to remain in that group, register now.

- Archdiocesan policy requires that children/teens who are requesting to prepare to receive a sacrament must have at least two years of formal religious education prior to the reception of the sacrament.
- Archdiocesan policy requires those requesting to prepare for First Eucharist or Confirmation must be registered in a Catholic parish. If you are registered in a parish other than Holy Family you must obtain a letter from the parish you are registered in stating you are member of their parish.
- 2017-18 tuition balances must be paid in full OR parents must make arrangements for an extended payment plan with Dr. Peg Hanrahan prior to registration for 2018-19.

HOW TO REGISTER

If you were registered this past year turn in your Fast Track Form **ASAP**. Fast Track Forms can be dropped off in the Parish Office or the Faith Office. If you are coming to Spirit Camp drop off your Fast Track form when you drop off or pick up the kids.

Register on line at www.holyfamilyparish.org

For New Students, parents please pick up a paper form fill it out and return it and a copy of your child's/teen's Baptismal certificate to the Parish Office or the Faith Office. You can also **register on line** (see above). If you have any questions please reach out to Marta Robak in the Faith Office, 907-3447.

Tuition assistance is available to all registered parishioners. To request a full or partial waiver parents must fill out a simple request form and meet with Dr. Peg Hanrahan. Faith Formation for Generation Z: Part III



In Part II of this series, which ran in our bulletin the past two weeks, we identified Gen Z as the youngest and largest generational cohort on the planet. Though suspicious of religious faith this generation values spirituality and does not settle for religious truth expressed in tired clichés. This cohort of practical pragmatists dedicated to lasting social change are **looking for more not less** from religious education. They are searching for spiritual practices that will be meaningful to them and a core set of beliefs and morals that will enhance their lives.

The intellectual tradition of Catholicism and its deep and broad variety of spiritualities has much to offer Gen Z

When affiliated with religious faith, Gen Z are more likely to be engaged than their parents. This trend is visible among our Holy Family teens. It is well established that only between 22-28% of Catholic teens remain engaged after being confirmed. **At Holy Family a remarkable 68% remain active and engaged after Confirmation.** The reason they give for doing so is the sense of community they experience and the vitality of the Teen Faith community.

These independent thinkers are self starters and imaginative problem solvers. Google has always existed and Wi-Fi is a given. These

young people are used to having answers only seconds away. They spend between six and nine hours a day absorbing media and Pew Research reports 92 percent go online daily and 24 percent are online

“almost constantly”. **They are beyond ‘tech savvy’.** They’ve never known a world without the internet or cell phones; younger Z’s have never known a world without smartphones.



Often thought to have short attention spans, the truth might be they have developed highly selective filters to help them sort through the enormous amounts of information literally at their fingertips.

Due social media they have grown up with the knowledge that they can speak to anyone around the world at a moment’s notice. This has made Gen Z highly interactive, one that thrives on connection, resulting in their highly developed social and emotional intelligence. **The sense of belonging that faith communities provide speaks to a very real felt need.**

The world they live in has never felt safe. International terrorism school shootings, financial crises and recession as well as underemployment is not new – it’s what they’ve always known. Their

turbulent upbringing has made them “more self-aware, self-reliant and driven,” according to a 2015 survey by Ernst & Young. It has also made them more socially minded. Being so-called **‘woke’** is important to Gen Z. They prize engagement with politics and society. Being ‘authentic’ — valuing honesty —not only by the way you live but the way you buy is big with gen Z. Seventy- one percent believe that being passionate and enjoying what you’re doing for a living is a better measure of success than money.

Generation Z wants to change the world. They volunteer in record numbers. They are generous and genuinely moved by the suffering of others.

Faith traditions that have a strong sense of social justice and ways for individuals to *personally engage* the moral issues of the day, appeal to Gen Z. Community service, a well articulated mission, and social activism are essential ways to connect to their spiritual search. The social teachings of Catholicism, our global reach to the poor as well as our concern for the environment and centuries of authentic dialogue with science needs to be presented Gen Z. **Herein lies our task as spiritual mentor’s to Gen Z.**

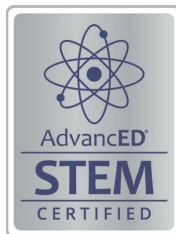

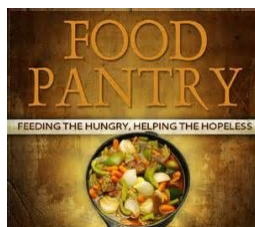
On the Journey of Love *In Action*, Catholic social teaching calls for engaging both feet, Charity and Social Justice, to respond to the needs of people in our society. A balanced, holistic approach ensures that the struggles of everyday life are lightened for those on the margins, but also advocates for institutional changes needed to empower people towards self-sufficiency. Tearing down barriers and building innovative structures requires time and effort. Using both feet to challenge the status quo prevents fatigue and a lopsided effort.

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) demonstrates how walking on the Two Feet of Love *In Action* generates change. Prior to the passage of ADA, someone with disabilities depended on the charity of others. For example, someone opened doors or pressed elevator buttons for those in wheelchairs. However, once the ADA became law mandating accessible access for these Americans, the structures put in place enabled them to be self-sufficient.

As poverty continues to grow in the United States, addressing the immediate needs of the poor must be combined with challenging the barriers preventing them from being self-sufficient. The impact of racism overwhelmingly affects those who live in poverty. Discrimination against people of color is not just about an individual's own views. Racism includes historic institutional policies that make it part of the system. This gives power to exclude a group of people and gives another group the advantage. Today, many of these policies and laws no longer are legal, but their lingering effects continue the cycle of poverty for people of color. This imbalance affects all institutions- housing, education, health care, employment and the judicial system. These imbalances make climbing out of poverty that much harder.

The fight for social justice requires time and resolve. It works best when fueled by a group of people motivated by faith who believe that everyone is a child of God and made in His image. Working together as a community fosters creativity to make changes in systems. Overcoming these barriers presents challenges for not only those on the margins, but for those of us trying to promote social justice and walk in the Path of Love towards the Kingdom of God.

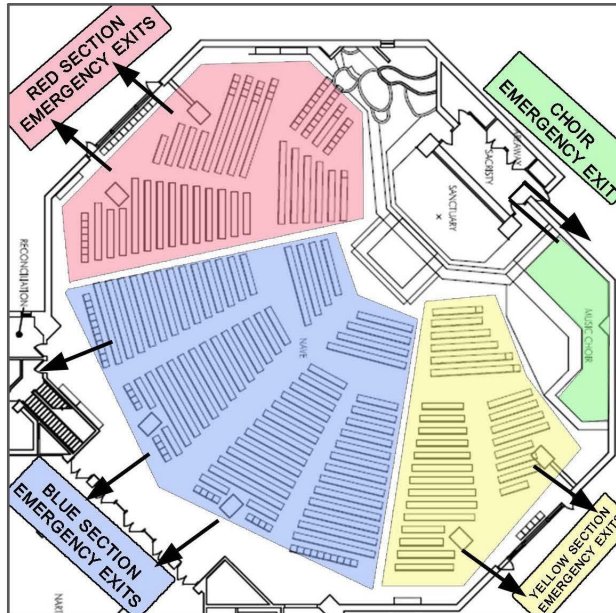
