Responding with compassion to those who are sick is a universal Gospel mandate. We hear a Gospel passage from Mark this weekend in which the disciples are given authority, by Jesus, to address evil, be compassionate to (anoint) the sick and to cure. From this mandate and many other scripture stories, we hear of and are inspired by the healing aspect of the ministry of Jesus Christ. In the spirit of His compassion, our Catholic Church all over the world trains and commissions ministers to visit the sick, bring them Communion, pray with them. Then, in cases of serious Illness, they notify priests who may help people heal through the Sacrament of Reconciliation and anoint them with the Oil of the Infirmed (one of the three oils housed in the ambry in a central place in EVERY Catholic Church in the world) in the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. Here at Holy Family the ambry is located in the center aisle near the Baptismal Font, opposite the large Paschal Candle.

Each parish has slightly different procedures to reach out to the sick, but all are designed to prayerfully and reverently pray with and assist people who are sick and, often, their loved ones. We here at Holy Family are blessed many Ministers of Care who are well trained and prayerfully visit hospitals, nursing homes, senior living centers, assisted living facilities and individual homes where people may be living who cannot come to church.

As we say at the beginning of each Mass, "We are in this TOGETHER." When THIS is ministering to the sick, please consider how we can work together. First of all, if any loved one, family member or friend is ill and needs a pastoral visit, please call Mimi Ferlita at 847-907-3425 and let us know the details of your loved one's situation. In order to minister to those who can't attend church in the MOST compassionate way, friends of someone who is ill or homebound can also call us with the same information. Often illness brings on some anxiety and stress, so immediate family members may overlook the importance of notifying us.

Often a time of illness can bring on a desire to return or reconnect with the church or with one's faith. Sharing basic information about the sick can help us to help others. In addition, regular visits with Communion often facilitate some basic information sharing about other parish resources and programs that may be of assistance. send a Minister of Care to visit. Please let us know of someone you know who is sick and may need a visit, but perhaps has limited or no family to help.

RCIA

We often refer to the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) ministry here at Holy Family "Footsteps," because it certainly is a journey for Candidates (those baptized in another Christian denomination besides Catholicism, or those baptized as Catholics who have not received First Communion or Confirmation) and Catechumens (those never baptized). The RCIA is the oldest form of teaching in all of Christianity and it is, in many ways, the best of adult education. These Candidates and Catechumens meet regularly, along with their sponsors and our Footsteps Team to learn about the Catholic Church. At the same time, a bond of unity always forms as these people share their stories and learn about their faith in an adult manner.

The first phase of the RCIA process, which begins in September, always involves basic learning about Catholicism. Once adults get more basic information about our faith, they are free to continue or not, based on what they have learned. In other words, with more information about the Catholic Church they can make an informed adult decision about whether they wish to continue and ultimately be welcomed into the Church in an official capacity. During the Easter Vigil, they complete their initiation by receiving, either that night or prior to it, Baptism, First Communion and Confirmation.

I invite all of you to encourage any family member, friend, acquaintance or loved one who may be interested in learning more about and perhaps becoming Catholic to please contact Bonnie Rooney at 847-977-4715.



- WE WILL BEGIN TO PLACE STUDENTS IN CLASSES ON JULY 1ST. Students are <u>not</u> placed in a class until the registration process is complete. If you register late we cannot guarantee your choice of class placement. If your child has been with a particular group and wants to remain in that group, register now.
- Archdiocesan policy requires that children/teens who are requesting to prepare to receive a sacrament must have at least two years of formal religious education prior to the reception of the sacrament.
- Archdiocesan policy requires those requesting to prepare for First Eucharist or Confirmation must be registered in a Catholic parish. If you are registered in a parish other than Holy Family you must obtain a letter from the parish you are registered in stating you are member of their parish.
- 2017-18 tuition balances must be paid in full OR parents must make arrangements for an extended payment plan with Dr. Peg Hanrahan prior to registration for 2018-19.





In Case of Emergency


We value your safety. Please take a moment to review this card.

Of Special Note

Rummage Sale Suspended

For over 15 years Holy Family has hosted a rummage sale every summer, the last couple of years during the first weekend of August. The rummage sale provided a forum for parishioners and other local community members to donate their gently used furniture and household goods which in turn were organized, priced and sold by a bevy of Holy Family volunteers. The profits from the event allowed us to support our outreach ministries.

We have received many compliments over the years on how well our sale was organized. We also added pick-up service a few years ago to help donors with large items they could not manage alone. Those attending the sale were able to purchase quality merchandise at a fraction of retail price. The proceeds from the sale helped benefit several outreach organizations, with Habitat for Humanity being the largest benefactor.

Though profitable, several factors have caused the sale's volunteer leadership team and parish staff to evaluate the future of the rummage sale.

• The Chairs have actively pursued others to take the leadership torch and continue the good work, but no one has been willing to step up and take their spots.

• Though staffed by a committed group of volunteers, time was taking its toll and new, younger volunteers were not stepping up to support and ultimately replace the current volunteers.

• The sale takes a full week, Monday through Sunday, to set-up, sell and break-down. Some of our volunteer base was required to spend 50 hours or more that week to ensure the sale went off. It was wearing people out.

• Though profitable, the total amount of time and energy expended to yield the results was out of balance.

After thoughtful and prayerful deliberation with the event chairs we have decided to indefinitely suspend the Holy Family Rummage Sale. However, this leaves us with a void in revenue and program support that we cannot afford. Consequently, we are restructuring our Fall Fest fundraiser in hopes of generating additional revenue that will allow us to continue to support all of our outreach programs.

We ask donors looking for a home for their gently used items to consider directing these to other local organizations such as House of Hope, WINGS and Home of the Sparrow. Finally, we are exploring ways that our parishioners who are willing to provide 4-8 volunteers hours at a time to do so at a charity that would in turn credit our volunteer hours into financial donations for our outreach programs. Stay tuned for more information.

Finally, thank you to Mary Rubino, Rose O'Brien and Nancy Stacy who have chaired the sale the last several years. Their leadership provided us some of the best results ever achieved in the history of the sale to which we are forever grateful.
