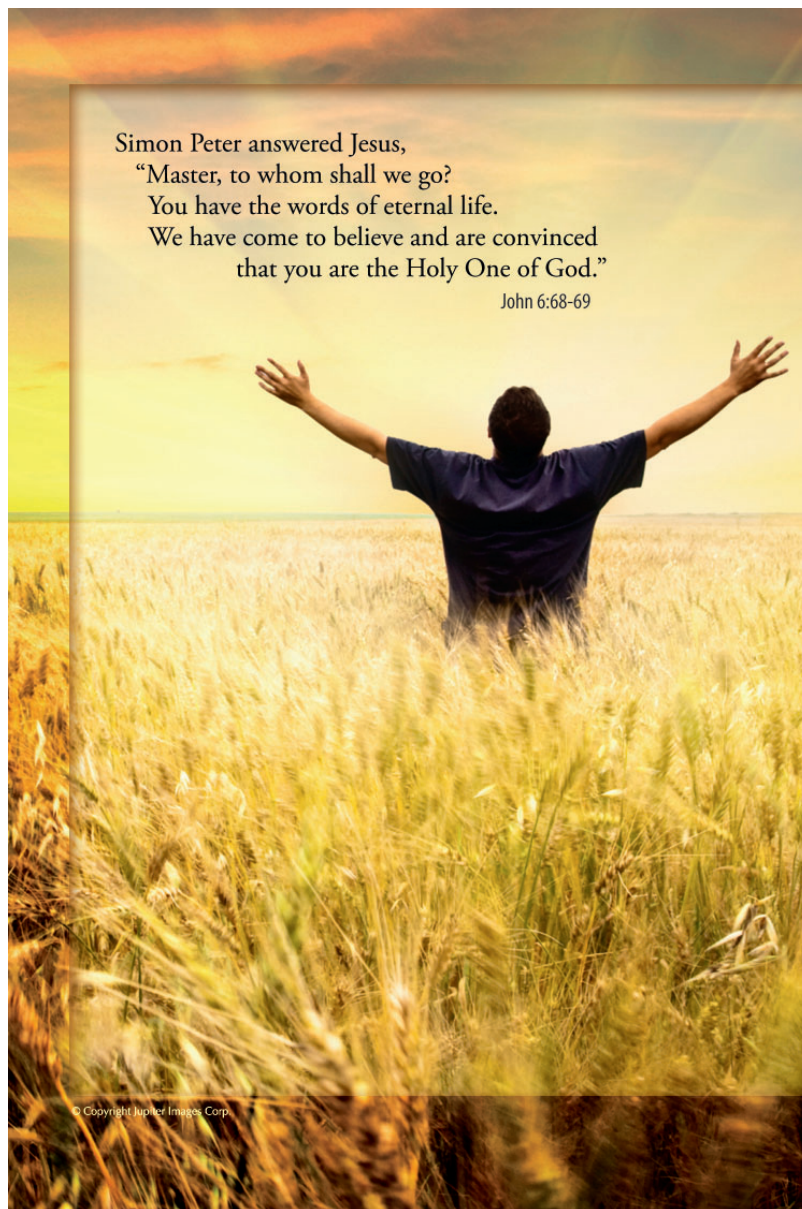

# Fr. Terry Keehan

This weekend we conclude the five week series of one of the most significant sections in all of scripture, The Bread of Life Discourse, from the 6th chapter of the Gospel of John. As we have reflected on this critical passage, we have heard Jesus repeatedly identifying himself as The Bread of Life...that has come down from heaven...that lasts forever....that is real food and his blood is real drink...that is his flesh to give life for the entire world. He has also repeatedly told us that when we eat this Bread of Life...he will remain in us...that we will live forever...that those in the desert who ate manna have died, but those who eat this bread will never die.

These statements are the basis for our Catholic belief in his real presence manifest in our midst as a gift to us in the sacrament of the Eucharist.

Over the past weeks we have taken extra efforts to emphasize the importance of this profound spiritual reality. In fact, I believe that Jesus becoming real in the Eucharist is THE most important, the deepest and the most profound reality in all of Christianity.

Through liturgical documents and the teachings of our Catholic Church, we have come to identify the following four ways that Christ's REAL presence is made known every time we celebrate the Eucharist:

**The People Gathered**  
**The Word of Scripture Proclaimed**  
**The Elements of Bread and Wine**  
**The Person of the Priest**

We have supplemented the larger Church teachings by unique expressions of these here at Holy Family, such as: our inclusive welcoming both before and as Mass is starting; our vibrant, contemporary music; all liturgical ministers led by the presider bow in reverence to the altar and then bow to the PEOPLE as the procession approaches the altar; our screens that enhance images and bring us supplemental wording, video and audio; the way our assembly stands in a wave from back to front accentuating ushering forward the gifts of bread and wine being brought forth; the manner in which members of the assembly come all the way up to the altar and place those gifts while facing the assembly; the emphasis that we place on breaking God's Word open in a preaching style that addresses contemporary and relevant real life topics and concerns; the inclusion of lay women, men and teens sharing reflections during Mass; the unifying moment of praying The Our Father with hands joined by the entire assembly across the aisles; our servant model of Communion beginning with the Fractioning Rite and Lamb of God that sends Eucharistic Ministers into the assembly; the emphasis that we place on saying your name just prior to receiving the Body and Blood of Christ; accentuating our belief that the Eucharist is so sacred that it MUST be lived in the world with our proclamation that "The Mass never ends..." as we conclude. This statement is rooted in what the earliest Christians said as they concluded

the Eucharist. They then responded as we do today, "Thanks be to God." As those early Christians said this, they knew that there was a distinct possibility that some of them would not be with them the following week because they would be martyred for their faith.

As we contemplate the Lord's real presence among us as The Bread of Life these many years later, there are many elements to this spiritual reality that have not changed. However, some have. We live in a world where people are identifying as spiritual, but not religious. Anti-institutional feelings abound as large organizations (of which the Catholic Church is perhaps the largest) have lost the trust of so many, often because of the sins of leadership.

So, in the midst of institutional Church failings and waning religious practice, I believe that the Eucharist, at its core, can feed us even more profoundly. Jesus identifies himself with what is real (people, bread, wine, scripture) and he gives himself to us as sustenance for eternity. He stimulates our spiritual imagination by connecting our past with the present and urges us to see into the eternal future. These are some of the gifts of the Eucharist that can feed us now in a critical time in the institutional church's history – our history.

I wish to once again reiterate the three-part story of our faith that can be viewed both physically and spiritually. In the physical part of the ONE world we live in, there is often a beginning, a middle and an end to many of our endeavors.

However, if we choose to, we can also embrace the spiritual invitation to look at all of life as having a beginning, a next step and the eternal. I remind people that an easy way to remember this pattern is through 3 C's. CREATION is the beginning (*God created the heavens and the earth...Genesis 1:1*). Prayerfully consider the beginnings in your life, in your work, in significant relationships and other endeavors. COVENANT is the next step. (*I will be your God and you will be my people...Exodus*). When have you taken a significant next step? When have you advanced, stepped up, made a rite of passage? Third, CHRIST, the eternal manifestation of that covenant (*This is the cup of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal COVENANT.*) What has lasted, endured, stayed in your life? What is eternal for you?

I believe that all of faith can be viewed as an extension of the covenant that God formed with all of us, humanity, and that which he forms with us personally.

What is lasting, what is communal, what is personal, what lasts, what helps us to seal the covenant with our God through which He remains in us – is best celebrated in the Eucharist – our God manifest in a real way in the Bread of Life that feeds us no matter what – Jesus Christ!

## Questions & Answers

Over the past several weeks, Fr. Terry has encouraged us a community of faith to deepen our understanding of the Sunday liturgy in light of the Bread of Life Discourse. To help foster this deepening of faith and understanding, here are the answers to the fifteen common questions about the Eucharist which I listed in last week's bulletin.

**1. Why does Jesus give himself to us as food and drink?** Jesus gives himself to us in the Eucharist as spiritual nourishment because he loves us. By eating the Body and drinking the Blood of Christ in the Eucharist we become united to the person of Christ through his humanity.

**2. Why is the Eucharist not only a meal but also a sacrifice?** The Eucharist is the memorial of Christ's sacrifice through which we are joined. Jesus does not sacrifice himself again and again, but rather his eternal sacrifice is made present once again, re-presented, so that we may share in it.

**3. When the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, why do they still look and taste like bread and wine?** "Substance" and "accident" are used as philosophical terms in the efforts to understand and explain the faith. This change at the level of substance from bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is called "transubstantiation."

**4. Does the bread cease to be bread and the wine cease to be wine?** Yes. In the Eucharist the bread ceases to be bread in substance and becomes the Body of Christ, while the wine ceases to be wine in substance and becomes the Blood of Christ.

**5. Is it fitting that Christ's Body and Blood become present in the Eucharist under the appearances of bread and wine?** Yes. Jesus Christ gives himself to us in a form that employs the symbolism inherent in eating bread and drinking wine.

**6. Are the consecrated bread and wine "merely symbols"?** No. The transformed bread and wine are the Body and Blood of Christ and are not merely symbols.

**7. Do the consecrated bread and wine cease to be the Body and Blood of Christ when the Mass is over?** No. During the celebration of the Eucharist, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, and this they remain. They cannot turn back into bread and wine, for they are no longer bread and wine at all. The Church teaches that Christ remains present under the appearances of bread and wine as long as the appearances of bread and wine remain (cf. Catechism, no. 1377).

**8. Why are some of the consecrated hosts reserved after the Mass?** The Body of Christ under the appearance of bread that is kept or "reserved" after the

Mass is commonly referred to as the "Blessed Sacrament." First, it is used for distribution to the sick, and those who legitimately cannot be present for the celebration of the Eucharist. Secondly, the Body of Christ in the form of bread is to be adored when it is exposed, as in the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction.

**9. What are appropriate signs of reverence with respect to the Body and Blood of Christ?** The Body and Blood of Christ present under the appearances of bread and wine are treated with the greatest reverence both during and after the celebration of the Eucharist.

**10. If someone without faith eats and drinks the consecrated bread and wine, does he or she still receive the Body and Blood of Christ?** If "to receive" means "to consume," the answer is yes, for what the person consumes is the Body and Blood of Christ. A lack of faith on the part of the person eating and drinking the Body and Blood of Christ cannot change what these are.

**11. If a believer who is conscious of having committed a mortal sin eats and drinks the consecrated bread and wine, does he or she still receive the Body and Blood of Christ?** Yes. The attitude or disposition of the recipient cannot change what the consecrated bread and wine are. In this case, the person is to be mindful of their imperfections and should seek reconciliation. A firm intention of receiving reconciliation is encouraged.

**12. Does one receive the whole Christ if one receives Holy Communion under a single form?** Yes. Christ Jesus is wholly present under the appearance either of bread or of wine in the Eucharist.

**13. Is Christ present during the celebration of the Eucharist in other ways in addition to his Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament?** Yes. Christ is present during the Eucharist in various ways. He is present in the person of the priest and in the assembled people. We speak of the presence of Christ under the appearances of bread and wine as "real" in order to emphasize the special nature of that presence.

**14. Why do we speak of the "Body of Christ" in more than one sense?** The Body of Christ refers to the human body of Jesus Christ, who is the divine Word become man. During the Eucharist, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ. As members of the Mystical Body, we have a responsibility to work against all the forces in our world that oppose the Gospel, including all forms of injustice.

**15. Why do we call the presence of Christ in the Eucharist a "mystery"?** The word "mystery" is commonly used to refer to something that escapes the full comprehension of the human mind. It also refers to aspects of God's plan of salvation for humanity, which has already begun but will be completed only with the end of time.

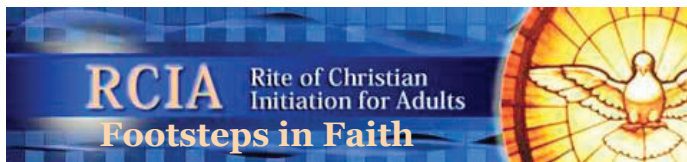

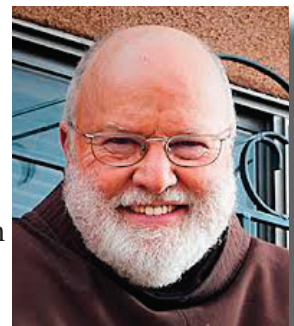

**Family & Teen Faith** early enrollment numbers are the best they've been in years. Again we remind parents if they haven't yet registered please do so. Remember class placement is done on a first come first serve basis and Teen Faith classes are capped at 12 (no exceptions) Space in our Sunday evening classes for grades 1-6 is filling fast.

**Tuition Assistance** is available to all registered parishioners in the form of payment plans and waivers (full and partial), but families must apply. Catechists and Hall Monitors who serve all year receive a \$150.00 tuition discount. Co-catechists split the catechist discount. If both parents serve in this way (i.e. Dad is a catechist and Mom is a Hall Monitor) they each receive the full discount. Parents can also share the task (Mom does certain weeks; Dad does the others) and receive the full discount.

**PART 1: Describe the work you completed this week:**



We dug a trench around a church to prevent water from getting into the basement and flooding it.



Lots of yard work and housework for a lady who is paralyzed.



I worked at a thrift store that took donations, sorted through them, priced them, and put them out on the sale floor. I organized the sale floor and sorted through huge boxes of donations.

We helped at a home for people experiencing memory loss by cleaning out the garage, painting the upstairs hallway, emptying out a food closet and linen closet, washing the cabinets, walls and windows, and weeding the front yard.

The first 3 days we painted a school and on the last day we packed rice in the morning and did some weeding at a college for young adults on the spectrum of Autism in the afternoon.



Painted a dock and boat house, and burned wood.

Our group worked at a warehouse where we packaged food for low income families. In the mornings we worked on their micro farm weeding, shoveling woodchips, and preparing the dirt so that they could grow asparagus. In the afternoon we packed food and labeled cans.

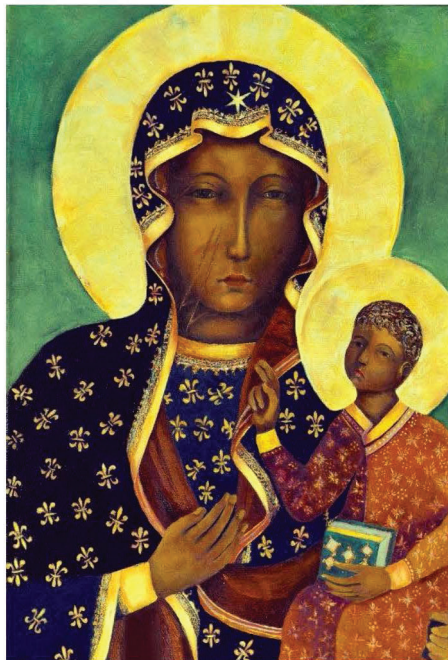
