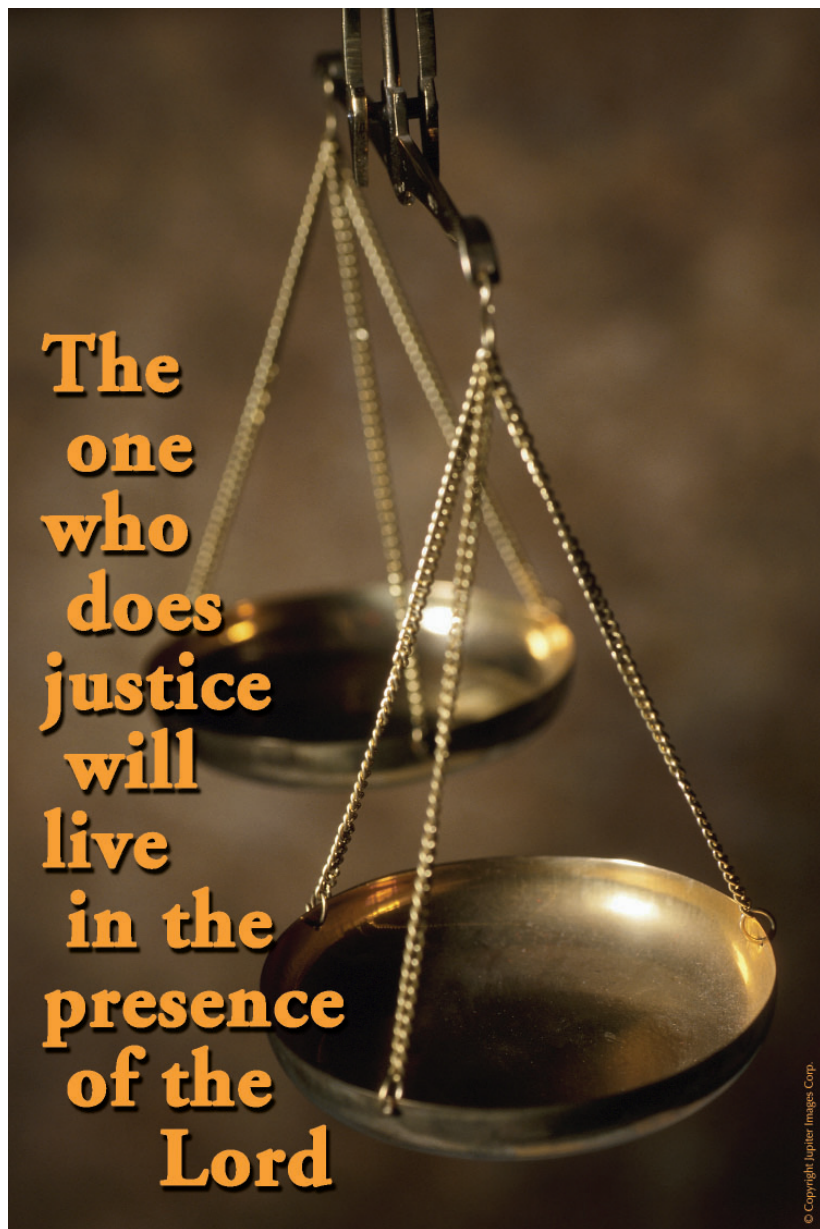

## Fr. Terry Keehan

We mark Labor Day this weekend as a signaling of the unofficial end of summer. Even though school has started already for most if not all students, the persistent warm weather tells us we are not yet ready for fall. With a special and extra day off, we have an opportunity not only to enjoy family, friends, perhaps a swimming pool, a brat and a burger on the grill, but to reflect on the value and importance of work.

I spent some significant time writing about work during my mini-sabbatical in the spring. I have a basic but very strong conviction that our work is God's work. When we work, we are carrying out the work of creation that God initiated. Our work extends God's work.

My writing is organized according to a simple pattern that I believe carries out this work partnership between us and God. First, we must **acknowledge** the primacy of God's work and God as the first worker. We must bring to our spiritual consciousness, on a regular basis, that God worked first and God intended for us to continue his good, meaningful work. Second, we must **identify** the unique gifts and skills that each of us has been given as a gift from God so that we can carry out God's work with our own special flare and with our personal passions. Third, we must always be aware of how we can **share** those gifts, skills, talents and resources to make our world a better place, truly serving each other and constantly looking for needs in the world to match our work interests, passions, creativity, beliefs and hopes.

It is a really simple three step process: **acknowledge, identify and share**. Perhaps you can spend a few minutes, or longer if you can, this weekend reflecting on how you have carried out this process. In my research, both formal and informal about work, I am saddened by the amount of people that I have met, heard from or who have written about work, who make absolutely no connection between God and their work. I hope that you are not one of them. Take some time to prayerfully recognize and connect your work with God's. I do not limit the word work to job, career or vocation, but any endeavor that you put effort towards.

As I have mentioned at Mass, along with many of you, I wrestle with a range of emotions regarding the recent reports of clergy sexual abuse of

minors. The following statement does not say it all because of the ebb and flow of various feelings, but it is our parish's statement, crafted by our leadership. It is on our website, but many of you requested that it be included in a printed form.

*We share in the anger, sorrow, disgust and outrage that many are feeling in response to the Pennsylvania Grand Jury report revealing a long-standing history of clergy sexual abuse in the state and beyond. For those who were affected by these horrors, the latest revelations have meant suffering all over again, reliving the pain and humiliation of the past. As a Church and as leaders, we have failed to protect the innocent, those entrusted in our care.*

*Our hearts, prayers and support go out to all who have been impacted by these horrific abuses. But that's not enough. We stand with Pope Francis, Cardinal Cupich and dioceses throughout the U.S. in committing to a zero tolerance policy with regard to incidents of sexual abuse. We stand united in demanding accountability from abusers, from those who allowed abuses to occur, and in demanding objective, third party based investigations to root out the truth and hold violators accountable.*

*May all Church leaders work in unison with the laity to create a renewed environment of hope, healing, protection, and safety for children and the most vulnerable who we serve.*

This past Thursday we held the first in a series of prayer services, providing ANYONE who wishes to participate an opportunity for quiet prayer and reflection on significant, violent, tragic or upsetting events in our world. This past Thursday's service focused on the survivors of clergy sexual abuse and the need for greater wisdom and accountability on the part of our Church Leadership.

We are calling these services "The Quiet: a Reflective Prayer Experience for Healing and Peace," held at Holy Family at 6PM on the last Thursday of each month. The next one will be Thursday, September 27. Our Knights of Columbus have inspired us to craft the themes of this and future services in response to events or issues that may surface prior to the service. Stay tuned for more details as it gets closer to these quiet prayer experiences. Come to the quiet and invite others to join you.

### 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

1. In our first reading, Isaiah begins by saying: "Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense." But the tone of this reading immediately changes to a message of hope and salvation. Do his words appear to be a contradiction? How do you reconcile these words and what do they mean to you?
2. As you look at the second reading, how can we avoid acts of favoritism that move us away from our Lord?
3. James says: "have you not made distinctions among yourselves, and become judges with evil thoughts?" What needs to be done individually and as a community to level the playing field for all people?
4. In our Gospel, how is opening the deaf man's ears and speech a lesson for how we need to work on listening and speaking with more care? Do you feel a need to improve in this area?
5. "Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it." Is there a message here about gossip?

Dear Parents and Guardians,

All loving relationships call us to dedication and sacrifice. As parents I know you understand what I am speaking about. I see it in the way you cherish your children, providing the very best for them, putting their needs ahead of your own, delighting in their presence, bearing all their joys and sorrows. This is how God loves us. **Faith is a choice we make for ourselves and our children** rooted in our relationship with God – a relationship that requires similar attention, time and energy.

As your Pastor I want to help you and your children grow in faith. I want you each to know how much God loves you. I want you to always experience God's Spirit of Love, having lives richly blessed with love, joy, peace, patience and hope.


**As Catholics we encourage you to “practice your faith.”** We do this by being members of a faith community, being grateful, receiving the sacraments, studying God's Word and serving each other. Our children learn to practice the faith by watching and imitating us. This is a solemn responsibility God has entrusted to us.

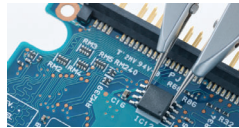

## HFCA STEM Education

HFCA is the *first*, and currently only, middle school program in the State of Illinois to earn AdvancED STEM Certification. In addition to our rigorous math and science curriculum, middle school students rotate through these four hands-on/minds-on units.

### Electrical Engineering



Students are introduced to the hardware side of technology. Electrical circuits, electronic components, circuit boards, and wiring. Every student will learn the skill of reflow soldering by hand. Students will complete two projects with their own individual circuit boards and electronic components: capacitors, resistors, transistors, and LEDs.

### Farm-to-Table



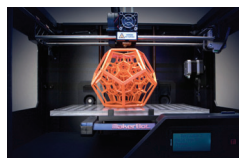
Where does our food come from? How does it grow? In this module, students will learn the many farming methods that bring nutritious, fresh food to our tables. They will explore the intricacies of soil, dairy farming, aquaponics, poultry and cattle raising, beekeeping, and fruit farming, as well as the concepts of green-collar careers and sustainable food production.

### Game Design



Students will design, draw, animate, and revise their very own video games using a program called **Bloxels**. Students will use an interdisciplinary approach to problem solving as they create the story, art and mechanical function of their game. Working as a team, students will collaborate on their layouts, characters, and art and offer each other feedback to improve the gaming experience.

### 3D Design



Using a curriculum developed by **Intel**, the students are introduced to fundamental engineering concepts that help them think like engineers. They learn the steps of the design and discovery process, and are challenged to brainstorm, design, build, test, evaluate, redesign and share their solution with others. Students will be using design software and HFCA's two 3-D printers to create designs to solve problems encountered by the Holy Family community.

In an effort to be better stewards of the environment, Holy Family will take the first step by discontinuing the use of Styrofoam coffee cups. Only paper cups will be available once our supply of Styrofoam is used up. We hope, eventually, we will be able to eliminate the use of all Styrofoam products from church use as we are well aware of the negative impact it has on the environment. Paper coffee cups cost more than Styrofoam, so we ask, when possible, to use ceramic coffee cups (available in both kitchens) and return them to the kitchen cleansed after use.

## Lenten Social Justice Project Recaps **\$371,266 has been raised over the past 5 Years**

**2018 – Peaceful Pathways, Chicago, IL** – We joined Cardinal Cupich’s Violence Prevention initiative targeting vulnerable, at risk youth in Chicago’s most troubled neighborhoods. Although “Anti-Violence” described our intent, “Peaceful Pathways” described our approach. Our contributions of \$103,134 supported two highly successful local programs: Strong Futures on the south side of Chicago and The Peace Corner Youth Center on the west side.

**2017 – San Miguel Arcangel Church, San Miguel de los Banos, Cuba** – This Lenten project worked in collaboration with Catholic Extension and was our most successful in terms of donations raising \$95,000. This enabled Catholic Extension to provide grant money to not only rehab San Miguel Arcangel Church, but also two chapels in the Diocese of Pinar del Rio – Las Ovas Chapel and Paso Real de San Diego Chapel. St. Rosendo Cathedral also received grant funding to complete their renovations. To date, all projects are moving along quite well as the both chapels are very close to completion and St. Rosendo Cathedral is moving ahead of schedule. San Miguel Arcangel is also moving along well as they continue to gather the materials needed for completion. The bell tower has been removed as they begin its rebuild. Thankfully, all four structures received little damage from Hurricane Irma.

**2016 – JOURNEYS|THE ROAD HOME** – Holy Family Parish is a PADS site, which hosts the local homeless clients registered through JOURNEYS on Sunday evenings, Oct through April. Raising \$54,384 directly assisted JOURNEYS in their care and guidance of those who are homeless and those on the verge of homelessness. Critical services such as long-term case management, job counseling, minor medical care, mental health screenings, and most of all, securing permanent and stable housing are provided. A year following our Social Justice Project, they were able to secure housing for 135 clients, which is their greatest success rate to date.

**2015 – St. Anne’s Mission Church, Red Lake Reservation, Red Lake, MN** – St. Mary’s Mission Church and School, with a staff of 20 people, help to care for and educate the Native American residents of Red Lake. The pastor, Fr. Jerry Rogers, feels that by surrounding the children and their families with the power of prayer, the living witness of Catholic beliefs and a strong education, the greater hope there will be for their future. Holy Family raised \$70,030 to support a Staff Associate and to sustain the education of the children attending the school, again, in collaboration with Catholic Extension. Our gift assisted the school, which is experiencing increased enrollment, and a salary for an Outreach Director and Parish Nurse. On a sad note, the church experienced a fire and the building was totaled. Fr. Jerry Rogers is, as always, optimistic, and he expressed hope that the church will rebuild. He said, “Out of the ashes will rise a new church.”

**2014 - St. Paul Mission Church in McKee, KY** – St. Paul is a small mission church in Appalachia (the only Catholic Church in that county) and serves a rural population. It cannot sustain the salary of a full-time priest. Rebecca Koury (now Rebecca Woods) is the Pastoral Associate. Holy Family raised \$48,718 to pay Rebecca’s salary and support the many ministries she administers in collaboration with Catholic Extension. Since 2014, Rebecca has instituted many programs benefitting youth, adults and the greater community. You will hear more about their granola project as the details firm up.
