Fr. Terry Keehan

Perhaps you have heard me speak about the physical and spiritual aspects of the number three. I believe that it gives an important perspective into the one world that we all live in, that is both physical and spiritual. The 1-2-3 of our one world that is physical can be described as:1. The Beginning, 2. The Middle, and 3. The End. That probably sums up a classic way of looking at a lot of things, such as a sports season, a school year, a play or even a song. Rock N' Roll songs frequently have what is called the Middle 8 referring to a tempo or melodic change and/or a bridge following the second chorus leading to the final chorus. Notice the important threes in life: The Trinity; three elements of the Paschal Mystery (Suffering, Death and Resurrection); a hat trick in hockey (three goals by one player); the Triple Crown (three wins in horse racing); three strikes in baseball statistics; three point play or shot etc. (Sorry that I'm heavy on sports analogies!)

The 1-2-3 in our world that is spiritual can be described as: 1. The Beginning (Creation); 2. The Next Step (Covenant); and 3. The Eternal (Christ). Notice the assignment of three words beginning with C to help you remember the spiritual depth of the one world that we live in and share.

God began everything in CREATION. God then reached out a hand and made a COVENANT with all of humanity as the Jewish people journeyed to a better way of life in the desert. Jesus CHRIST fulfills that covenant in an eternal way. In case you forget, listen intently at Mass when the priest says the words of Jesus at the Last Supper, "Take this all of you and drink from it, this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the NEW and ETERNAL Covenant.

The spiritual covenant that God fulfills with us in Jesus Christ is both NEW and ETERNAL at the same time. This 1-2-3 spiritual progression is not limited to a chronology of events. It can expand our spiritual and religious imagination to reflect and pray differently.

This week's Gospel gives us an example and in it there are three crucial issues that build on one another. The beginning is the question Jesus puts to the disciples, and just as importantly to us – "Who do people say that I am?" What does our world say about Jesus Christ these days? How is he identified? Who is he to today's world?

The next step is the question for all of us, "Who

do you say that I am?" This next step is much more personal. How do we describe Jesus to others? Who is Jesus to you? Peter responds, "You are the Christ." There is little acknowledgement about the importance of Peter's insight/answer according to Mark as there is in the other Gospels. Jesus goes on to explain that He must suffer and die and Peter rebukes him. In other words, he challenges the idea. He speaks as a protector of his friend. He doesn't want to lose Jesus to death.

The third phase, or eternal or lasting part of the spiritual progression, in this passage is to think like God. Jesus connects Peters rebuke with pure evil and returns the admonition with, "Get behind me Satan." So what does it mean to think like God? In this case it is a reminder that Jesus Christ was sent by God to suffer, die and rise from the dead. That is what we call the Paschal Mystery that is, in fact, a difficult pattern to accept because it involves two challenging things: suffering and death. Thinking like God invites us to look at those two challenges (suffering and death) through the lens of faith that says sometimes it is ONLY through suffering and dying that we can get to new life. It is a figurative pattern that we experience on a regular basis that encourages us to be led to the new life of the Resurrection. Peter and all of us sometimes find it extremely difficult to hold out hope for the new life when we are in the midst of suffering and death.

Using the third spiritual component, the eternal, we are invited to reflect on what lasts in life. We are challenged to see that life goes on even beyond our suffering and death, or that of our larger family, community or the world.

Try prayerfully reflecting on literally anything in your life through the 1-2-3 of the Beginning, the Next Step and the Eternal. Try looking at your professional career, your marriage, your family life, your educational endeavors, your health, your... through this lens and not simply the beginning, middle and end of them.



25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

- 1. In Wisdom, the author portrays the wicked as one who does not tolerate the just person. They test and humiliate the just person, to see if God will rescue them. Have you or someone close to you ever been put to the test? How did faith play a role in how it was handled (and resolved)?
- 2. As noted in our second reading, how have you drawn from "the wisdom from above" to counter envy and selfish ambition?
- 3. The second reading also warns of the "conflicts and disputes among you ... cravings that are at war within you." We are all guilty of these cravings. How have you learned to ward them off? What advice would you give to others, especially the young?
- 4. In our Gospel, the disciples once again fail to understand the prediction of Jesus' passion, death and resurrection. Despite hearing these teachings from Jesus before, why do you think his disciples still did not get it? And since they "did not understand" why were they "afraid to ask him?"







As Catholics we believe that

God's Spirit and humankind work together through everything and anything of life. Through nature and creation, through culture and society,



through our minds and bodies, hearts and souls. God's Spirit works in the depth of our own being and in community with others, through the events and experiences that come our way, through what we are doing and what is "going on" around us.

This is called the 'principle of sacramentality'. No other

theological principle or focus is more characteristic of Catholicism or more central to its identity.

Yet for far too many the 'big picture' has been reduced to a series of snapshots of individual events, that once celebrated fade into the distance. At Holy Family we are trying to change that and invite people into a deeper, richer, more satisfying understanding of the sacramental life.

Reconciliation

FIRST RECONCILIATION is celebrated in 2nd grade. We focus on helping children see that as baptized Christians, followers of Jesus, we are called to do good and avoid evil. The primary values explored are the need to forgive and ask for forgiveness from other. *Contrition* (what it means to be truly sorry) is part of forgiveness. The spiritual practices emphasized are the Penitential Rite at Mass and the celebration of First Reconciliation using Form 3 and includes the entire family.

In fourth grade additional catechesis is offered and the children are prepared to celebrate Form 1 of the sacrament of Reconciliation – face-to-face confession with a priest.

FIRST EUCHARIST



The celebration of the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our faith. For Catholics, without the Eucharist the communion we so earnestly seek with God and each other is not possible. This is why the first Christians made 'the breaking of the bread and the sharing of the cup' such a priority. It was in this meal they shared together, that their Lord, Jesus, was most present to them. The same is true for us today.

Just as you feed your children, God feeds us. For us the Eucharist is literally the *bread of life*. The preparation for 1st Eucharist begins with feeding; bringing your child with you to celebrate the Eucharist each Sunday. Everything else in the preparation process flows from and leads back to the Sunday Eucharist.

CONFIRMATION at HOLY FAMILY



Celebrating the Spirit is Holy Family's program that prepares high school teens for the sacrament of Confirmation.

Why does Holy Family offer the preparation for Confirmation in high school? Don't most other parishes do it in 8th grade?

The age of confirmation varies throughout the Church. Ten dioceses in the U.S. confirm children prior to the reception of First Communion (click here for a list of parishes and the reasons behind this practice). Others celebrate this sacrament exclusively in high school (Milwaukee, Corpus Christi, and Buffalo to name a few). Parishes in the Chicago

Archdiocese confirm young people as early as 5th grade; as late as the spring of 11th grade. About 40% of the parishes in Chicago now confirm young people in high school.

The debate about the age when sacraments should be conferred is nothing new. Prior to St. Pius X's encyclical Quam Singulari (1910), First Eucharist and First Confession were celebrated at the age of 12, 14 or even older. Receiving First Communion at the age of 12 lasted into the 1940's in many parishes. Often, a shift in the Church's understanding of a sacrament or sacraments in general, leads to these changes.

Currently the Church teaching and law state that

- Confirmation is a decision, a statement of **personal** faith.
- Part of the preparation process is that a Catholic should discern the opportune time to be confirmed in the faith.
- No person should be confirmed if they do not wish to be. If a candidate does not feel ready they should say so.

At Holy Family we feel that young Catholics are best able to begin this discernment process during their high school years. At Holy Family **disposition**, demonstrated in concrete expressions of a personal faith is the mark of readiness.

"... ministers may not deny the sacraments to those who **opportunely** ask for them, are properly **disposed** and are not **prohibited** by law from receiving them."

Canon Law # 843 §1

The focus of the two year preparation process is on the development of <u>personal</u> ownership of the Catholic Christian faith. The faith these young people were given by their parents now needs to be internalized and integrated in a personally authentic spirituality.

Celebrating the Spirit has options for teens at all stages of their faith journey.

- Freshmen and Sophomores attending a Public High School
- Freshmen and Sophomores attending Catholic High Schools
- Juniors and Seniors attending a Public or Catholic High School who have not been Confirmed
- Teens that are choosing at this point in their lives to be baptized as Catholics or make a Profession of Faith and receive First Communion with the sacrament of Confirmation.
- College students, who have not been Confirmed




