## Fr. Terry Keehan

We take great pride in referring to ourselves as Holy Family Catholic Community. The word Community is both used and is manifest in many different ways. Unity is a big part of the word, so the term implies bringing people together. I have urged us all to reflect on being in THIS together and the fact that THIS can vary from the celebration of the Eucharist to each of the ministries that are carried out in the name of Holy Family Catholic Community as well as any activity, event or service that we provide.

I often challenge and invite people to recognize the impact that Holy Family has far beyond the walls of our 155,000 square foot, 19 acre campus.

Our teens and youth regularly reach out to countless people in need. Our Adult Faith Ministering Community has connected with other communities of faith, some of them not Christian. There are many other examples, and that doesn't include the ministering community that focuses on outreach which is our Human Concerns Ministering Community. This community opens our doors to the homeless, feeds those who have no other means to be fed, supports those who need it the most. We build homes in neighboring communities, assist the needy, not only physically but spiritually and emotionally. Human Concerns has led the Lenten Social Justice initiatives that have even assisted people in other countries. 



## Family & Teen Faith



The sacraments of Christian Initiation – Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation – are intrinsically connected comprising one process, which we call Christian initiation.

## The Christian Initiation of Children - Eucharist

"The sacraments of Christian initiation – Baptism, Confirmation, and the Eucharist – lay the foundations of every Christian life."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1212.

At Holy Family we have created two beautiful rituals for families preparing their children to receive the Eucharist. Celebrated at the Sunday liturgy, the children participate in a **Rite of Welcoming** and the *Presentation of the Our Father.* Adapted from the Rites of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) these provide the children and their families with an experience of how Christian Initiation "…progresses through gradual stages, it unfolds the Church's rites, symbols, and biblical signs; and it incorporates the participants into the Christian community of faith and worship." (*National Directory for Catechesis 2005, pg.116*). These rituals also emphasize the foundational role of worship for Catholics, especially the Sunday Eucharist which is the source and summit of our faith.

At Holy Family Christian initiation is seen as a developmental journey by which a person, no matter their age, comes to a new understanding of him/herself as a disciple of Christ and member of Christ's Church. It is this new understanding of self that is celebrated and sustained in the sacraments of initiation.

In receiving the sacrament of the Eucharist we not only receive the Body and Blood of Christ we <u>become</u> the Body of Christ. This deeply profound and unique becoming lies at the heart of Christian initiation. Speaking to Christian parents sixteen centuries ago St. Augustine said, "Believe what you see, see what you believe and become what you are: the Body of Christ."

He went on to explain, "You are saying 'Amen' to what you are: your response is a <u>personal signature</u>, affirming your faith. When you hear 'The body of Christ', you reply 'Amen.' Be a member of Christ's body, then, so that your "Amen" may ring true!"



When we say "Amen", we are saying "Yes! I believe this is the Body and Blood of Christ and that I will be the Body of Christ to others."

## **Christian Initiation - Confirmation**

"Sacramental moments are points of contact between us and God —moments of grace that sustain us for the journey." Kielbasa, Sacraments: Celebrating the Sacred

**"Catholicism is essentially and particularly a sacramental faith."** To be engaged in the sacramental life is to recognize that all of reality <u>reveals</u> God's presence and is a means to <u>encounter</u> God. As Catholics we believe

- Sacraments are moments or <u>life events</u> in which God's loving presence breaks into our consciousness and becomes <u>real</u> to us.
- Sacraments <u>connect</u> us spiritually to all those who came before us and all those who will come after us.
- As sacramental people our emphasis is on we rather than on I. This is why Sacraments are always <u>public</u> proclamations celebrated in the midst of the community.

At Holy Family we see sacrament as a <u>unique way of being</u> in the world. We help each other prepare for, celebrate and live out what the sacraments call us to and effect in us, both personally and communally. We <u>become more</u> – more loving, more courageous, more attuned to the mystery of life. Our initiation into the sacramental life unfolds gradually. We need time to experience the fullness of life and to learn how to see and be more. We need time to experience how important it is to be in

community, to appreciate how vast and inclusive God's way is. A spiritual openness needs to ripen in us for us to see how much more imaginative and resourceful we are as part of the greatest good.

When Confirmed we are *marked* with the **indelible seal of the Holy Spirit** - a sign of *personal authority* and *ownership* that completes the work done on our behalf at Baptism. This seal of the Holy Spirit marks our *total belonging* to Christ, our enrollment in his service *forever*. We *become* compelling witnesses of Christ assuming the apostolic responsibilities of Christian life. This deeply profound and unique becoming infuses in us a longing for connection; a sincere commitment to belong to Christ and the community Christ raises up to build the Kingdom of God.


#### The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers
