## Fr. Terry Keehan

I believe that **Welcoming** and **Hospitality** are among the greatest Christian virtues. Official Catholic teaching does not list them as such, but welcoming the stranger (Matthew 25:35) and hospitality (Genesis 19:1-15) are compelling stories that both carry out and create a mission of expansion, growth and reaching out to newcomers and making friends feel at home time and time again.

My vision for Holy Family is one that includes a warmer, more sincere, more consistent and more joyful welcoming experience. Welcoming has been a part of the Catholic culture for a long time. It is essential to the earliest and longest lasting form of learning in all of Christianity. We call it the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults and it dates back to the second century. This process of learning, often referred to by the first letters in each word – RCIA, is a spiritual process of learning that is integrated with faith, almost entirely Christian faith. Because it is learning with faith woven into it. the process is also referred to as **Formation**. People not only learn, they are formed in the faith in God, through Jesus Christ.

The formation process of RCIA is ritualized through several rites, or prayer experiences, during Mass that ritualize key moments in the process, much the same way that sacraments ritualize key moments in all of life.

One of those rites is WELCOMING. One of the creative things that my predecessor Fr. Pat Brennan brought to Holy Family was adapting the RCIA formation process for ALL people preparing for ANY sacrament, so the Rite of Welcoming is truly a part of the sacramental culture of Holy Family. I don't know too many other Catholic Churches that follow this model, but it has become a staple of life and worship here. So we have a Rite of Welcoming for our children preparing for First Communion, for other children preparing to become Catholic (in the RCIC, or Rite of Christian Initiation of Children) and our teens preparing for the sacrament of Confirmation. Last weekend and this weekend at the 5:00pm Mass on Saturday, we ritually welcomed our children preparing for First Communion and last weekend at 4:00pm we welcomed teens and sponsors preparing for Confirmation. We will repeat the Rite of Welcoming for another group of children and families preparing for First Communion this weekend, and celebrate the Rite of Welcoming for adults in our RCIA during the 9:00am Mass this Sunday.

As of this writing, Sue Geegan our Director of

Human Concerns, Ro Geisler our Parish Manager and I are preparing for a trip to Nogales, Arizona and other sites in Mexico and Arizona sponsored by our friends at Catholic Extension. As you know, we have partnered with Catholic Extension, whose primary mission is to help build up the Catholic Church in areas that are significantly economically challenged. Our previous Lenten Social Justice Projects with Extension have significantly helped parishes in Cuba, McKee, Kentucky and on a Native American Reservation in Red Lake, Minnesota. By the time you read this, we will have more details about the needs of parishes in the Diocese of Tucson and in Mexico. Stay tuned.

We have been hosting an event for men for several years called The Gathering. Often women ask when we will hold an event for women. Although I am more supportive of adult events for women and men together, we are very excited to welcome and invite women to "The Three Wise Women of the Nativity Story" as a part of our Advent by Candlelight series for women here at Holy Family on Tuesday, December 4 from 7:00-9:00pm. The evening will be led by Mary McKeon who shared a reflection with us on the Feast of Mary Magdala this past July and she is on the staff at the Bellarmine Jesuit Retreat House just up the road from us on Lake Cook Road in Barrington. Mary will share insights of the role of three great women, Mary, the Mother of Jesus, Elizabeth her cousin and the mother of John the Baptist, and the Prophetess Anna. All three play a unique role in the Nativity story. Wine and hors d'oeuvres will be served in the Narthex following Mary's presentation which will be held in the Church. I am inviting ALL women of the parish to attend and I am challenging both women and men to personally invite other women to attend. This promises to be an enriching evening that will help prepare your heart for Advent and Christmas. There is no charge for the evening and details will be in the bulletin as the evening gets closer.

We hear the story of another inspiring woman this weekend in the passage from the Gospel of Mark often referred to as The Widow's Mite. She contributes a comparatively small amount to the temple treasury, but it is "...all she has, her whole livelihood." How much of our livelihood do we give to God? I am not referring to a dollar amount, rather the work of our life?

Thanks to all of our Veterans who have given so much of their livelihood for our freedom!

creates a vibrant prayer and worship experience so that all may participate in a fully conscious and active way in the liturgy. This includes different forms of prayer and worship experiences, for all attending Holy Family.

By virtue of our Baptism, all of us are called to continue our spiritual formation in Christ. This calling is a work in progress, a privilege offered to everyone who has made the decision to be a disciple of the Risen Jesus. For this reason, the Church offers special opportunities for the People of God to reaffirm their calling in Christ, and to encourage those who are preparing for initiation into our faith community.

This weekend, Nov. 3/4, and next weekend, Nov. 10/11, we are celebrating Rite of Welcoming Weekends at Holy Family. On these weekends we recognize and celebrate three different groups of people who are seeking initiation: catechumens who are seeking Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist, candidates who are seeking entrance into our Roman Catholic tradition, and baptized Catholics who seek to complete their sacraments of initiation.

At the 9:00 Mass on Nov. 11 we celebrate this ancient ritual with those adults preparing to receive the initiation sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and/or Eucharist by participating in the RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). The adults to be baptized will now be known as catechumens, while those previously baptized as Catholics or another Christian tradition, and now preparing to complete their initiation, will be known as candidates. At the 5:00 Masses on both Nov. 3 and Nov. 10, we celebrate this Rite with our young people preparing to receive the sacrament of First Eucharist. At the 4:00 Mass on Nov. 4 we celebrate the Rite of Enrollment with our teens preparing to receive the sacrament of Confirmation. Already one with us by virtue of their infant Baptism, all of these young people will continue on their Order of Christian Initiation journey toward reception of those remaining initiation sacraments and full membership in the Church, the Body of Christ. Those enrolled in the RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children), preparing for Baptism and/or First Eucharist, will also celebrate the rite at the 5:00 Mass on Nov. 3.

In this Rite all these candidates for initiation, assembled publicly for the first time, declare their intentions to us, the Church, by making promises to listen, pray and serve. We, in turn, accept and welcome them by our commitment to teach, support, care and pray for them on their continuing journey of conversion. In essence, for the young people, this ritual is a repeating of the beginning of the Rite of Infant Baptism. Now, instead of their parents speaking for them, they speak for themselves and are marked with the sign of the cross of Christ to strengthen them for the journey ahead. As a side note, we will also be celebrating an infant Baptism, with the Rite of Welcome at both the 9:00 and 11:00 Masses on Nov. 4.

In this Rite the entire community also witnesses to our commitment to continue living and growing in Christ. This decision includes a personal dedication to life-long spiritual growth and faith formation expressed in learning, prayer, worship, service and mentoring of others. Our own participation in the sacraments of initiation binds us to this ongoing journey of deepening faith and love. For the committed disciple of Christ, this journey is not an option.

Please welcome our youth and adult candidates for full initiation to this phase of their journey with your joyful encouragement. Teach them by your example and pray for them on their journey of faith with us all.



## making Connections with faith

100 years ago today, Monday, November 11, 1918, on the eleventh hour (11 am) of the eleventh day of the eleventh month, the armistice that halted fighting in World War I was signed in a ceremony in a Paris train station. 116,516 American soldiers had given their lives on the battlefields of Europe and an additional 320,000 men and women returned wounded or chronically ill as a result of chemical warfare, malnutrition and disease and what was then called **shell shock** (now known as Post Traumatic Shock Disorder or PTSD).

In 1919, on the first anniversary of the Armistice, the U.S. established *Armistice Day*, which became a national holiday in 1938. In 1954 President Eisenhower, who served as the Supreme Commander of the Allied Expeditionary Force during WWII, changed the name to *Veteran's Day*. Unlike *Memorial Day*, *Veteran's* Day pays tribute to all American veterans—living or dead—but especially gives thanks to living veterans who served their country honorably during war or peacetime.

Today, most Americans know little if anything about WWI. The last living veteran of World War I, <u>Florence Green</u>, died on February 4, 2012 at the age of 110, and for most Americans WWI quickly receded into history with the advent of WWII.

Like most wars, as WWI began, both sides expected a quick victory. Neither leaders nor civilians from warring nations were prepared for the length and brutality of the war, one of the <u>deadliest conflicts</u> in human history. Military and civilian casualties are estimated at 40 million, and for the first time in human history civilian deaths outnumbered that of combatants. Genocidal policies were carried out during World War I\_against the *Armenians*, *Assyrians* and *Greeks*. Researchers are still trying to calculate the **environmental degradation** resulting from WWI.

This catastrophic loss of life was due in part because of **new technologies** applied to warfare, including tanks, airplanes, submarines, machine guns, modern artillery, flamethrowers, and poison gas. Yet the saddest part of the WW I story is that very little was resolved and twenty years later worldwide war raged again killing an additional killing **72,468,900** souls.

As people of faith, let us remember the sacrifice so many have made on our behalf. Let us honor the memory of those who paid the ultimate sacrifice to secure our freedom. Let us pause and also recall the unspeakable cost of war and commit ourselves to be peacemakers whenever and wherever the opportunity do so is presented to us.

Our Family Faith children will hold a special prayer service for peace during their classes today and Wednesday. Parents and grandparents are welcome to join us the last half hour of the class session in the Multitorium on Sunday or the Chapel on Wednesday for this event. Come and remember with us and pray for peace in our troubled world.


## for registration for 2018-19!

If you have child you want to receive 1<sup>st</sup> Communion in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade, they must be registered for 1<sup>st</sup> grade **this** year. We only have a few spots left in our 1<sup>st</sup> grade classes. We will be **closing registration** for both our Faith classes and the Home School program on **November 12**, **2018**.

The Archdiocese requires that children have two years of formal religious education prior to receiving a sacrament. Children who are registered in 2<sup>nd</sup> grade without having completed 1<sup>st</sup> grade religious education will not be eligible to receive 1<sup>st</sup> Communion until 3<sup>rd</sup> grade.

This also applies to Confirmation. To be confirmed in the spring of sophomore year teens need to have completed all the **FLAME I** requirements.




