BE ALERT!

Advent is a time of preparation for celebrating the coming of the Messiah, the coming of God's kingdom. The readings this Sunday bring together the prophetic and Gospel traditions calling for a new social order based on peace and justice. It is a time for everyone to reflect on what "living in the light of the Lord" (Is. 2:5) obliges us to do in caring for each other and our world. The Season of Advent is a season of vigilant waiting that prepares us to welcome the mystery of the Word Incarnate, who will give us 'Light.' We could say that the true light of Christ enters the world through Mary's yes to God, but it does not stay there. On the contrary, this light flows out into our own dark, obscure, broken lives to illuminate them, so that we can become the light that illuminates one another in the world. When we're awake, we can act. When we're awake, we can connect. When we're awake, we can imagine possibility.

Here at Holy Family parish community, we start the Advent Season together by remembering that we are all a pilgrim people, not destined to be of this world, but to be in it for a short time in preparation for our eventual destination in God's heavenly kingdom. We therefore prepare ourselves as best we can each day for the trials, tribulations, and signs of hope we encounter as children of God and disciples of Christ. "Be vigilant at all times," Jesus says, and pray for strength to remain on the right path. In the Gospel passage for this first Sunday of Advent, Jesus tells us: "Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come. ... May he not come suddenly and find you sleeping."

Let us begin with these words of Jesus. "Be on guard! Be alert!" Stand up and raise your heads! God is near. But where, we may ask, do we find these signs of God? We are to find them in the joy and pleasure of friends and family gathered together, in the joy and pleasure of a delightful meal prepared and served to the homeless, and in all acts of kindness and love. God wants us to know of his love in a very personal and genuine way. At the core of His tender love is the knowledge that we are all unique and special in God's eyes. He wants us to spread this truth of love to others. God wants us to "be somebody to

somebody," as Mother Teresa used to say, so that people around us will feel His love and mercy. We want to make sure we are all paying attention to what God is asking from us in our daily lives.

There is a fine line we all have to tread right now between the distractions of the hustle, bustle and preparations for the holidays, shopping, cooking, decorating and holiday gatherings alongside of the importance of reflecting on how we can be more aware of Jesus' presence in our life. For this reason, let us live this time of waiting not only to celebrate the mystery of Christ, but to repeat this mystery in our lives and in the service of others. To wait for the Lord who comes means to wait and to watch so that the Word of Love enters inside us and focuses us every day of our lives. Let us take note of the things that can separate us from God and what we need to do to conform our hearts. minds, and wills to the image of Jesus Christ. And every day throughout Advent, let's try to go out of our way to make other people, especially our families, feel God's love and mercy with small acts of service. What a different world, what a better world, it would be if we all tried to do this every

As Blessed John Henry Newman reminded us in a homily for the Advent Season: "Advent is a time of waiting, it is a time of joy because the coming of Christ is not only a gift of grace and salvation but it is also a time of commitment because it motivates us to live the present as a time of responsibility and vigilance." This 'vigilance' means the necessity, the urgency of an industrious, living 'wait'. When we are on the side of the poor, the vulnerable, the suffering people, and when we stand in solidarity with those without hope and act together, we can be channels of hope. In opening our eyes and hearts to the sufferings of our world, hope can be awakened, a hope that allows us to see things from the perspective of God. As a parish community, let us return to the core of the Gospel which is love, compassion, justice, and solidarity with the poor. Let us return to its ancient role of being a refuge for the poor and an oasis for the oppressed. Let us commit this Advent Season to stay awake, to seek and respond to God's invitation of love in the world, around us, and within us.

Advent is a great time to take stock of where you are in life. Perhaps the most important gift one can give for Christmas is forgiveness.







JUST "BE" FOR ADVENT!

We Christians hold a great festival during the winter solstice, the shortest days of the year. We call this festival "Christmas," meaning the "feast of Christ." It takes several weeks to **prepare** and several weeks to **celebrate**. It is, undoubtedly, one of our favorite feasts. It is very important, however, that we not confuse the **preparing** and the **celebrating**.

The weeks of preparation are called **Advent**, the season of growing darkness before the solstice. The weeks of celebration are called **Christmastime**, the season of growing light after the solstice. Perhaps it comes down to something basic: We are Children of the Light.

Of course, there's a great contrast between these two seasons of our faith and the commercial "holiday season." The "holiday season" usually begins in early November and then comes to a crashing halt on December 26. And, unfortunately, it is most often filled with great stress and fatigue because the preparing is usually focused on cleaning, shopping, decorating, baking, and partying. Yes, even partying can be stressful and exhausting! We need something different! We need to BE surprised, satisfied, filled, loved!

We need Advent. We need a spiritual "oasis" to which we can retreat during all the craziness and just **BE**. Without it we stop being who we are: a people who are waiting in joyful anticipation, alert to Emmanuel, God-With-Us. And we need Christmastime. We need a festival that runs beyond a single day or week. In the many days of Christmastime we shout loud and clear that Jesus Christ is born; love is born in human form. The reign of God is here among us, in our flesh and blood. That is why we have star-topped trees, decked halls, and bountiful tables.

Advent, however, cannot exist if we jump the gun on Christmas. And Christmastime cannot exist if we are already tired of it by December 25. These two seasons require each other. Advent, and a new church year, begins today. Commit to making Advent a little different this year. **BE** still and **BE** surprised by what the Spirit of God has to say to you. Find your moment to **BE** here at Holy Family. Invite someone else who might need some spiritual enrichment...a family member, a friend, a neighbor... to attend at least one mass with you during the season. BE your Story! BE your Journey!
