## Fr. Terry Keehan

## **Epiphany 2019**

I think that it bears mentioning that Christmas, like Easter, is not only a day but a season. The Christmas season is shorter than that of Easter, but includes not only the day Jesus was born, but also the Feast of the Holy Family on the Sunday that follows Christmas Day, then Mary the Mother of God on New Year's Day, Epiphany which we celebrate this weekend, and concludes with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

Let's look a bit closer at the sacredness of the experiences behind these feasts. That is where any holiness comes from, the deeper spiritual movements that the church acknowledges. Sometimes though we focus too much on the title, such as Feast or Solemnity, and overlook how profound the experience can be. That holiness can become more powerful as we apply it to our lives. Connecting with the experiences behind celebrations is what I like to call a spiritual exercise. I borrow that term from Saint Ignatius of Loyola who founded the Jesuits and has a system of prayerful activities that he calls Spiritual Exercises. I use the term in a bit less formal way. I believe that any concentrated, deliberate, prayerful reflection is a spiritual exercise. So, let's do a few spiritual exercises to deepen our connection with the Christmas season.

We often refer to Christmas as celebrating a rather theological concept called Incarnation. We believe that God became incarnate or real in Jesus. We often refer to Jesus as the Incarnate Word of God. So, in Jesus we have the supreme example of God becoming real in human life – your life – my life. Questions are essential to spiritual reflection. What has become real in your life? How has God become real in you?

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph provide a lofty example of sacredness. When our parish community was founded, Med Laz and others encouraged people then to see themselves as a Holy Family. I would like to revisit that notion and encourage you to do a spiritual exercise of reflecting on our holiness as a family today. Parish life and family life can be messy. It can involve struggles and misunderstanding. How can you make Holy Family holier? How can your family be holier? How has our parish community brought holiness into your family? How has your natural family made you better, stronger, holier?

Mary has a very powerful title that we celebrate every New Year's Day. We acclaim her as Mother of God. Many people, particularly non-Catholics, wonder how God can have a mother. Well, our belief in the Trinity tells us that God is three persons and one of those persons is Jesus Christ who was given birth into our world by his mother, Mary.

There are fewer more profound titles than mother. On one level it refers to women who have children, most of whom have carried a child in the womb and physically given birth. A deeper spiritual exercise inspired by Mary urges us to recognize what we have given birth to and what has given us life. All life comes from God. Once we have life, we have possibilities and hope. Life opens up the future to us, and Mary gave those possibilities to Jesus.

His coming was the stuff of prophecies. His life was and is something that all humanity longs for. Mary enabled God's promise of more for all humanity to become a reality. Where do you find life? Do you see that life as rooted in God? What kind of life have you given birth to? What is the fruit of your work, your effort and passion?

An Epiphany is an awakening or manifestation. The story of three traveling kings, following a star, bringing gifts to the child king is filled with fodder for a prolonged spiritual exercise. What gifts or talents do you hold? Where, how and to who do you give those gifts?

The star intrigued the Magi, but its importance was that it led them to their savior. What or who are stars in your life? Make sure you, like the three kings, don't confuse the star with its ultimate importance – it can lead you to your savior.

The Baptism of the Lord might usher us into a bit of confusion. Why would Christ the Lord, the savior of the world, need to be baptized? If that confuses you, know that it did the same to John the Baptist. He suggested that Jesus should be baptizing him.

Baptism is an immersion, a diving into. That's what Jesus did. He totally immersed himself in human life. He walked into a dirty river and made a statement that he was one of us. He didn't just dip his toe into the Jordan, he fully immersed himself and shared the fullness of human life with ALL human life, including yours.

Baptize yourself in all of the richness of the Christmas season. Immerse yourself in it's richness. Give it some prayerful thought. It is a worthwhile spiritual exercise.

Millennial and Gen Z Catholics are looking for COMMUNITY and AUTHENTICITY according to the most recent study *Going, Going, Gone: The Dynamics of Disaffiliation in Young Catholics*, an unprecedented two-year national study on why young people are leaving the Catholic Church, conducted by Saint Mary's Press Catholic Research Group and <a href="The Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate">The Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate</a> at Georgetown University (CARA). The study found people stopped identifying as Catholics at a <a href="median age of 13">median age of 13</a>, long before they ceased attending a parish.

Saint Mary's Press president and CEO John Vitek, said that he and his team were compelled to find out more about why young

Catholics leave the church following the <u>Pew Research Center findings</u> in May 2015 about the growth of the "Nones," people who don't affiliate with any religion. Of all the major denominations, Catholicism has experienced the greatest net losses as a result of affiliation changes (the full report is available <u>here</u>).

The Disaffiliation in Young Catholics is a trend the entire Catholic Church needs take to heart. Long aware of this trend, the Holy Family Catholic Community has actively engaged teens for years and as a result has fashioned an inventive approach to Faith formation for teens built around the experience of Christian community that integrates

- Personal and shared reflection on the gospel and contemporary spiritual questions,
- Opportunities to serve the poor and marginalized,
- Discernment of personal gifts and talents leading to opportunities for ministerial leadership,
- An introduction to a rich tradition of prayer to support an authentic personal spirituality.

We do so to help our young people establish a deep and lasting relationship with Christ rooted in an authentic and personal spirituality empowering them to become the next generation of leaders in and for Christ's Church and the world. As a result hundreds of teens remain active members of our Faith community, especially after they are confirmed. The national average of young Catholics who continue to practice their faith after being confirmed is 22% and falling; at Holy Family close to 70% of teens remain engaged and involved, often in leadership and ministerial roles. Many are effective evangelizers, bringing their peers who are searching for a sense of community and authentic religious experience, to the Teen Faith community at Holy Family.

## Family & Teen Faith



Matthew's tale of the coming of the Magi is a richly rendered story of insight and faith – dramatic and powerful. Revealing the inherent tension in life between

- Faithfulness and unfaithfulness
- Trust and fear
- Generosity and greed
- Inclusion and exclusion

in the lives of a captivating cast of characters. Matthew skillfully crafts a poignant narrative about human strengths and frailties in response to God's presence.

At the heart of Matthew's tale is the question:
What does the star illuminate?
What does the light reveal?

Like the star, the evangelist not only poses the question he leads us toward instructive responses – epiphanies of faith.

Matthew does not want us to miss that the fullness of Christ, the glory of God is revealed in an infant, the most vulnerable of humanity. Furthermore, this **epiphany** is recognized by magi from the east — foreigners, outsiders, strangers to Jewish tradition, but yet welcome guests within God's infinite reach, enfolded in the Almighty's boundless embrace. The **faithfulness of the magi** (we have come to do him homage), **their attentiveness to God's sign** (we have seen his star at its rising) and **their generosity** (they opened their treasures and offered him gifts) are meant to be signs to us of our own capacity to believe in God's all-powerful love, to be aware of God's presence always, to be generous with the treasure laid before us in a manger.

Matthew's story of the Magi is comforting. The treasure offered to us this day is the opportunity to see clearly the grace that comes to us when we

- Are open to the manifestation of God's presence in life,
- faithful to truth, and
- practice generosity and inclusiveness.

Next week the Good News that will be proclaimed to and by us is that God's salvation reaches to the ends of the earth.

**Let us enter fully into this extraordinary feast,** gathering next week <u>expecting to be enlightened</u> so that we may reveal Christ's love and reflect God's glory.

Let us teach our children and grandchildren that the map that has been charted for us begins with a star, with a fire blazing in the heart, a uniquely personal experience of the glory of God.

the heart, a uniquely personal experience of the glory of God.

Let us teach the young, and each other, that no one can see the

path all at once or know how it will twist and turn. No one is able to perceive at all times how the journey will call us to places both strange and familiar. Let us share with one another those times in our journeys when we feel lost and uncertain and encourage one another to trust in Christ's light to guide us on the way.

Let reassure each other, and those that follow us, that we will discover what the Magi learned – to be alive in the glory of God in all its dazzling splendor is a magnificent blessing. Rejoice Holy Family for 'the glory of God shines brightly among us – Alleluia!






