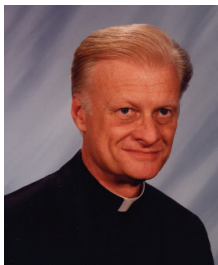
# Fr. Terry Keehan

Last week in my homily I mentioned a bit of irony relating to Memorial Day. It is a somewhat somber day designated to look back and use the unbelievable gift of memory to connect with and honor those who have passed away, and for us Christians, those who have gone before us into eternity.

The irony comes in because it is also a day that unofficially begins summer. In that beginning, we look forward to warmer weather and outdoor fun. This dual energy also applies to many other events taking place this time of year. Many institutions such as Holy Family and families are acknowledging the accomplishments of students in graduation ceremonies and festivities, but these people are also naturally looking ahead to high school, college, further studies and careers.

Memorial Day invites us to remember those who have given their lives in military service to both defend and preserve our freedom. Those of us who rest beneath the banner of that freedom should simply and sincerely express our gratitude. Perhaps the deepest expression of gratitude is to continue to preserve that precious freedom with our lives and actions moving forward.

## Neophyte Sunday: The Christian Community Continues to Welcome with Great Joy!

Today, at the 11:00 Mass, we celebrate Neophyte Sunday. An observance that goes back to the first century of the Church, Neophyte Sunday was traditionally celebrated on the Sunday immediately following Easter. Those who had been baptized at the Easter Vigil (now known as neophytes) returned to the Eucharistic assembly, dressed in the white garments with which they had been clothed following Baptism, for recognition.

In keeping with that tradition, but from a slightly adapted perspective, today we recognize and celebrate the 147 infants and their families who have been baptized at Holy Family since last Easter, as well as the 12 RCIA adults who were baptized, received into full communion with the Catholic Church, or completed their Catholic Initiation at this year's Easter Vigil, and the 5 RCIC children who were baptized and/or received their First Communion on the Sunday following Easter.

*Holy Family experiences seasonal spikes in income associated with Christmas, Easter and the timing of FAITH Tuition payments, where expenses are more consistent and have less seasonality. We have taken a more conscious approach to these seasonal fluctuations during our FY19 budgeting.*

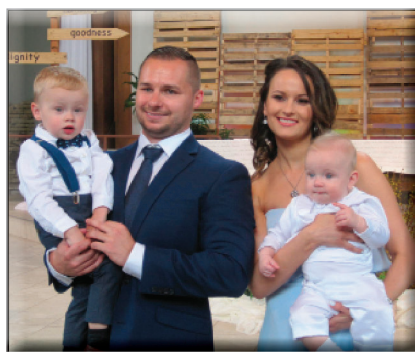

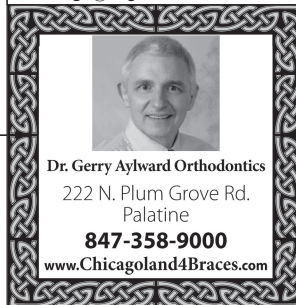
