The meeting was called to order at 7:05 P.M. by Mike Myers.

I. Mission and Faith First

 Joan played the daily reflection for the Second Sunday of Lent from Dynamic Catholic, which reflected on Andrew, Peter's "almost-anonymous" brother.

II. Mission Statement and Pulse of the Parish

- Michael discussed the success of the Gala and the tax credit scholarship matching grants.
- Michael also mentioned the difficulties in the parking lot during morning drop-off due to poor parking lot conditions during the last snow of the season.
- Luis discussed the possibility of a "year-of-recognition" for woman at work in the parish behind-the-seasons.
- Chad mentioned that Kid Church continues to grow by word-of-mouth, with no discernible drop-off from the split of older kids into Adam's Apple. Luis added a new Kid Church video is forth-coming.
- Anthony mentioned the success of Pastapalooza and the engagement of teens at the Sunday, 4pm Mass.
- Joan added that incorporating music from Kairos would be good.

III. Approval of Council Minutes

February minutes - Motion to approve made by Joan, and seconded by Luis. All approved.

IV. Family Faith Update - Dr. Peg Hanrahan, Director

- 2018-19 Family Faith enrollment is up 5%, the third straight increase in enrollment.
- Ignite (Jr. High) down 12%, Flame up 8.5%; no drop-outs, but 6th and 7th grade classes are comparatively small
- 10 RCIC candidates, 111 First Communion candidates, 93 children prepared for Form A Reconciliation, 68 Confirmation candidates
- 60 Catechists and 46 Peer Ministers
- Faith Faith revenue (tuition and retreat expenses) cover 50% of total cost
- Other accomplishments:
 - Attendance up by 25% with new tracking protocol
 - 68% of HF teens remain actively engaged in parish life

- All curriculums have been reviewed and updated, with Family Faith moving from We Believe (Sadler) to Finding God (Loyola Press)
- Sacramental policies and prep programs have been reviewed and updated and in full compliance with Archdiocesan standards
- · Safety protocols have been reviewed and updated
- New communication protocols
- Formation of staff development initiatives
- Christian service incorporated at all grade levels
- · Increase use and access to technology
- Better coordination with Worship and Faith
- · Teen mental health initiative
- · Inauguration of community building activities
- Dramatic increase in parental involvement
- · Mindfulness practice incorporated in the curriculum at all levels
- Key Challenges:
 - Large number of disaffiliated youth
 - Lack of parent investment
 - Consumer approach to Church
 - · Need for Church renewal

V. Pastor's Report (Fr. Terry)

- Nun visiting from Brooklyn at 4pm Teen Mass on March 10th was blown away by the teens participation and energy. She had NEVER seen anything like it.
- The Beloved Retreat was once again enriching. The next will be November 1-3 at Mundelein Seminary
- 10 RCIC and 13 RCIA Candidates
- Ro Geisler, Mary Whiteside and Sue Geegan and Fr. Terry met with Cardinal Cupich on March 11 regarding the Clergy Sexual Abuse Survey and follow-up. He promises to personally address as many concerns as possible.
- As many fundraisers and financial asks as possible have been eliminated, replaced by the ability to request funds from biggest fundraiser - The Gala.
- In spirit of Renew My Church, there have been some small changes to Weekday Mass and Reconciliation.
- All Parish Reconciliation Service will be Wednesday, April 10 at 7pm
- Stations of the Cross every Friday during Lent at 7pm. A new Stations of the Cross for Athletes, written by Fr. Terry, will be on April 12th.
- Lenten theme is "The Return, a radical journey of the heart"

VI. Other Business

- Sue handed out a flyer on the Lenten Social Justice Project, Kino Border Initiative and Holy Family Fund
- The Parish Mission with Father Ed Shea will be March 24-26

There being no more business, the meeting was adjourned by Mike Myers at 9:01pm. A closing prayer for teachers was offered by Rick Zanardo.
