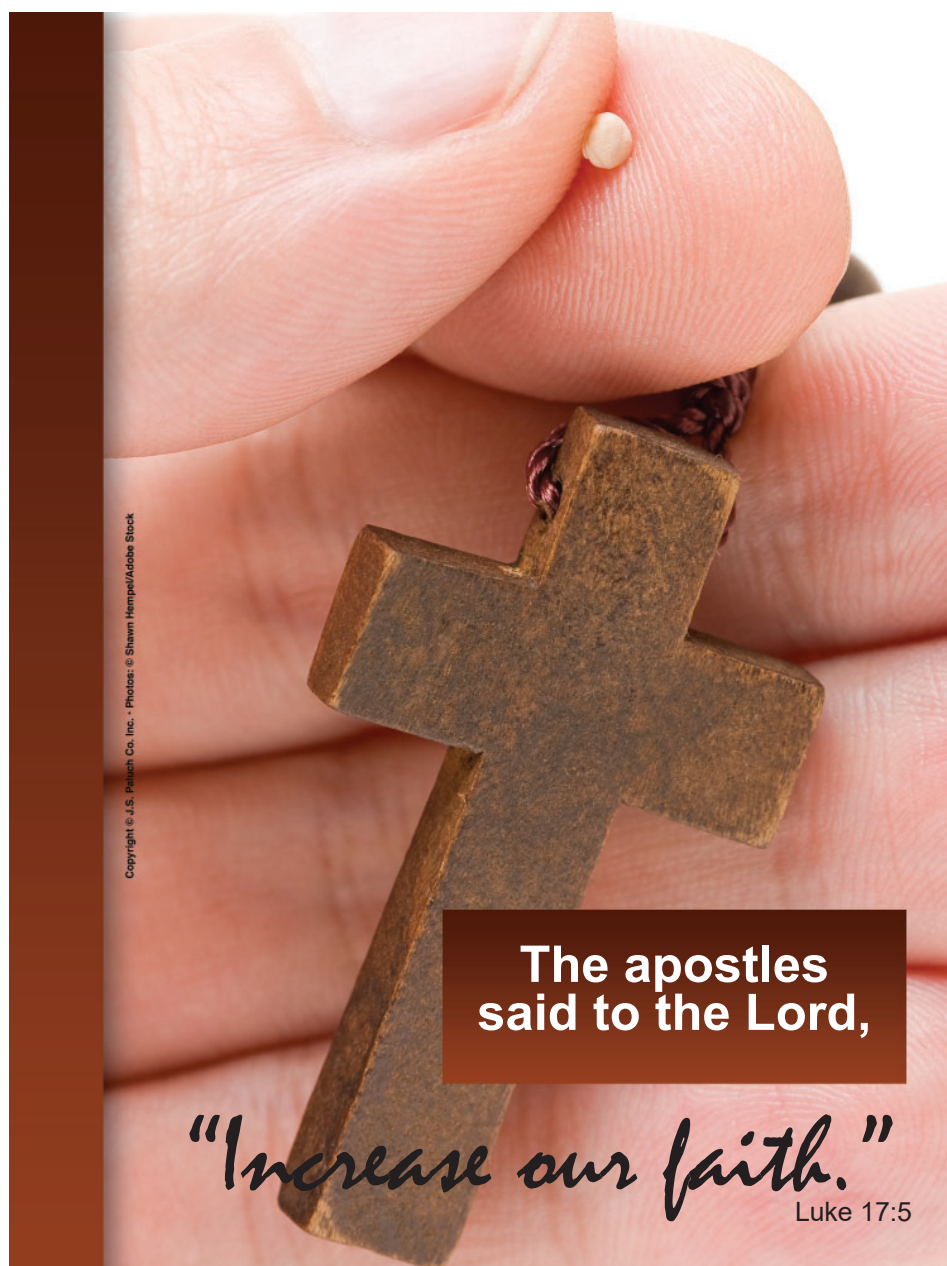

Providing For Our Family's Future



Campaign Kick-Off

Nearly a decade since Holy Family's last campaign, it is time again to focus our efforts on a transformative fundraising endeavor to Renew Our Church.

Today, we formally announce our campaign to raise \$3,775,000 in order to address our parish needs: to Build our Community for the future; Sustain our Mission; and continue to support our Archdiocese.

Thank you to the parishioners who have stepped forward to lead the campaign. More than \$965,000 has been contributed from only 14 families. God is great! That is over 25% of our campaign goal.

We ask you to consider three things:

- 1. *Pray for the success of the campaign***
- 2. *Welcome personal contact from fellow parishioners to discuss the campaign***
- 3. *Prayerfully consider your own sacrificial gift to the campaign***

Providing For Our Family's Future

The three key initiatives of this campaign are:

Building Our Community – An initiative aimed at reenergizing parishioners, providing spiritual renewal for the disenchanted, and engaging the future leaders of our Church

Sustaining Our Mission – To provide for the ongoing maintenance and upgrades needed for a welcoming and functional facility that can serve our parishioners and visitors for years to come

Supporting Our Archdiocese – As a leader in the larger Church community, we will support programs for innovative education for Catechists, Scholarships, and infrastructure of facilities throughout the Archdiocese.

Campaign visits have begun. The campaign will be conducted in various phases from now until the beginning of December. Before conclusion of the campaign, all parishioners will have an opportunity to participate. Our goal is to personally visit as many parishioners as possible. The actual number of individuals visited will depend upon the number of volunteers we're able to recruit.

We will need the participation and support of every family to reach our goals. Throughout the campaign, we will communicate with parishioners through letters, bulletin insert announcements, personal visits and phone calls. Please keep your hearts and minds open to hear more about this important campaign.

Thank you, again, for your attention to the presentation shared by Bernie Schaeffer, Operations Director and personal commitment shared by Pete Barber, parishioner, usher and Pastoral Council member. The goal was to present the similarities between the management of our personal finances to those of the parish finances, with the added element of scale and difficulties in budgeting with inconsistent unpredictable income. Hopefully, this presented a clearer picture of the need and importance of electronic giving. Currently 40% of our regular contributions come from electronic givers and Pete Barber gave us the challenge of raising the number to 70%. He asked that you prayerfully consider how you can increase your contribution and/or begin electronic giving. Our staff appreciates and thanks you for all your stewardship of OUR Holy Family.

With the close of summer and the many programs, i.e. faith classes and school, back in session, it seemed appropriate to provide a listing of some of the major upgrades, repairs and projects completed this past summer and referenced in previous bulletin articles. This brief list emphasizes the cost of caring for this very large campus and our need to maintain our building reserve (savings) account.

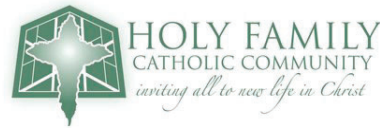

WE TAKE AND RECORD ATTENDANCE AT EVERY FAITH SESSION. Attendance records are legal documents and can be subpoenaed.

In the event of an emergency, FTF staff members, and first responders, need to know how many people are on the campus at any given time and where they are on the campus. In case of an emergency, this is critical information needed to guarantee everyone's safety and well-being. For this reason

STUDENTS ARE TO BE ON TIME FOR CLASS & REMAIN IN CLASS FOR THE ENTIRE SESSION.

Having people coming and going at all times throughout the class sessions makes it impossible to provide adequate supervision or control access to and within the building.



RUNNING LATE?! Don't Sweat

2. Get an **admit slip** from the Hall Monitor. If your child's class is not in their classroom, the Hall Monitor will direct you to the alternate location.

Step 1: Parents must inform the catechist prior to the class session that their son/daughter will be leaving early from class.

Step 2: Parents must pick-up and sign-out their Pre-K thru Grade 4 children. Catechists will not dismiss a student early from class unless a parent is there to pick him/her, up.

Step 3: Students in grades 5-10 must get an Early Dismissal Slip from their catechist and turn it into the Hall Monitor in the Narthex before exiting the building.

RUN FOR YOUR LIFE!!!

It may sound like a game, but to millions of people around the world, this is their reality, literally. 70.8 million people are displaced around the globe. Approximately 37,000 new refugees are on the move every day. I recently took part in a simulation and, as the Director of Human Concerns for Holy Family, I would like to share my experience with you.

First, let's answer some basic questions. What is the difference between a refugee, asylum seeker, migrant, and immigrant?

- A refugee is a person who has been forced to leave their country in order to escape war, persecution, or natural disaster.
- An asylum seeker is a person who has left their home country as a political refugee and is seeking asylum in another. However, their claim for refugee status has not yet been determined.
- A migrant is a person who moves from one place to another, especially in order to find work or better living conditions.
- An immigrant is a person who comes to live permanently in a foreign country.

I experienced the "run for my life" as a refugee, fleeing my home because my life had been threatened and my village was being burned to the ground. I had 30 seconds to make a determination as to what I was going to bring along with me. I was part of a family consisting of two adults and three children ages 10 yrs – 6 months. We chose a few items: "Papers" identifying who we were, wedding ring, canteen for water, all the money we had, coat, scissors, blanket, extra pair of shoes, compass, map and a doll.

We ran in a direction we felt was going to lead us to safety following others from the village. We traveled for days, eventually coming to a check point entering another country. They inquired why we were fleeing. In order to cross they asked for our papers and were questioned about our intentions quite intently. We passed through, however, another "guard" approached us and said we could not go any further. In order to continue he inquired what we were carrying and he took the wedding ring.

These check points, questions and bartering with

our belongings to continue on our path happened multiple times. At one check point, a guard took the 10 year old and told us she would be fine with him and we should continue on with her. Because we had money we were able to convince him to let her continue with us. This was an obvious attempt to eventually sell or traffic her.

We eventually came to the sea and found boats that we could sail to another country. We had very few of our belongings left and little money. We were given one life jacket for the 5 of us. We paid more of what little funding was left to secure more life jackets because we didn't know how long we would be at sea or how dangerous the journey would be. We eventually came to shore in another country and the check points, bartering and questioning continued.

Our simulation ended, however, the reality of a refugee fleeing for their life is only beginning. Left with almost nothing but the clothes on their backs, many do not survive the trip. One actual refugee said he lost track of how many days he was on a boat (a rubber boat – think small raft for about 4 people fitting comfortably) with 18 - 20 people on it for what he thought was about 17 days. (No bathroom, food and out in the hot sun fully exposed.)

Once the refugees find a refugee camp, it is not uncommon for individuals and families to stay there for 17 years. They live in a rudimentary tent and try to find small jobs to earn wages as they must pay rent for their small tent. Refugee camps are isolated so finding a job there is limited. They still struggle to survive this leg of their ultimate journey of finding a place of opportunity and safety for themselves and their family.

The Catholic Church believes that people have the right to find opportunities in their home countries and that they have the right to migrate when conditions in their country of origin preclude them from providing for the safety and wellbeing of their families.

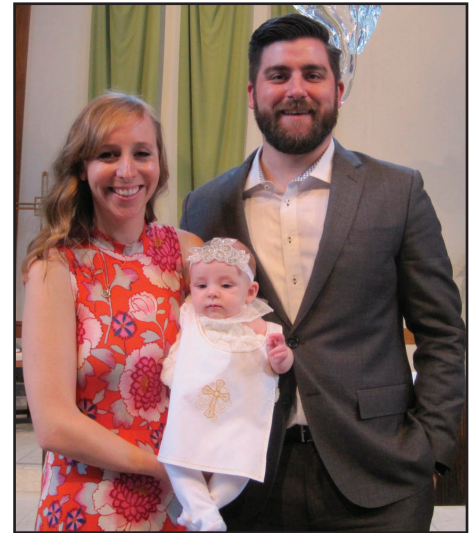
