The Joyful Season of Advent is upon us. Matthew's gospel puts us right in the tension that exists in our world today with the suffering and those who can make a difference in their lives. This Advent is for us to take time to **search**, **dialogue and be renewed**. We are to make room for something wholly unexpected and transcendent, **a higher love** that interrupts our lives and forever changes our destiny and that of the world. Together we, the community of Holy Family, seek to **encounter** and **witness** to "a **higher love**."

Therefore, let us: awaken to see that black people are still victims of racism and sometimes it seems as if their lives don't matter: that women still face discrimination and too many live in a culture of violence: that LGBTQ people often do not feel accepted or safe; that acts of anti-Semitism still exist along with a rising voice of white supremacy; that income inequality is growing; that we often fear those who think and act differently from us; that we have not always welcomed the foreigner and have turned away the refugee; that we have not responded to the pain and needs of the poor, the hungry, the homeless, and those in need of medical care; that we have failed to see the depth of hurt, anger, and frustration in this country; that we are, at times, a divided United States; and that we may all wake up and see all human life as sacred and fragile.

These are not issues to be solved, agendas to be pursued, or problems to be fixed. These are real people whose lives are fragile and sacred; just as fragile and sacred as our own lives. How can we live a higher love in an unknown and uncertain future? Advent reminds us to see one another and ourselves through the lens of our **baptism**. It means returning to the waters of our baptism where we promised to proclaim, by our words and example, the Good News of God in Christ Jesus. It is where we promised to seek and serve Christ in all persons, not just the persons of our party, our race, our religion, our country, but all persons. It is where we promised to love our neighbors as ourselves; where we promised to strive for justice and peace for all people; and promised to respect the dignity of every human being.

Our baptismal waters may have dried, but our promises remain eternal, just as God's promises are eternal in us. This coming of Advent has set before us a context for our baptismal work. This is

the unexpected hour. Now is the moment for us to wake from our sleep (Romans 13:11). Reclaiming our baptism may just be the most important work we can do throughout this Advent season. It is our work for one another and for Christ. Let us begin by promising to persevere in resisting evil and, whenever we fall into sin, to repent and return to the Lord. What if we let Advent be a time where we live out our baptismal vows, allowing them to guide our actions, determine our words and establish our priorities? What would that mean for us? What would it call forth from us? What would it demand of us? What might we need to change? What would we need to let go of or give up? How would we do life and politics differently? What would it take for us to fulfill our baptismal promises in today's circumstances?

Advent invites us to enter this moment, this hour, this day, as the only one in which we have the potential for clarity, the opportunity to make a change, the ability to do things differently. We face the uncertainty and the unknowability of our future by living faithfully in the present. That means we must remain vigilant. We must stay awake and be watchful. We must first be watchful of what is going on inside of us; our thoughts, fears, anger, the emotions that overtake us, the choices we make, the words we speak, the actions we take. Do they align with our baptismal vows? Are they congruent with the life of Christ? Do they show us to be followers of Jesus or partisan proponents? We must also be watchful for the divine presence in the other; the divine presence in our neighbor, in the stranger, in the foreigner, in our enemy; the divine presence in those who think and act differently from us; the divine presence in those who do not worship or believe as we do; the divine presence in the poor, the hungry, the homeless, the refugee, the marginalized, the oppressed; the divine presence in those whose choices and lifestyles are not our own; the divine presence in all of humanity. The very unexpectedness of the divine presence coming in another human being, especially one who is different from us, demands that we be awake and watchful because, if we are not, we will surely miss it. It means trading our words and acts of violence for words and actions that grow, sustain and nourish life. "Lord, Bring Us To A Higher Love This Advent Season."

The Liturgical Arts Community...

creates a vibrant prayer and worship experience so that all may participate in a fully conscious and active way in the liturgy. This includes different forms of prayer and worship experiences, for all attending Holy Family. We Christians hold a great festival during the winter solstice, the shortest days of the year. We call this festival "Christmas," meaning the "feast of Christ." It takes several weeks to **prepare** and several weeks to **celebrate**. It is, undoubtedly, one of our favorite feasts. It's very important, however, to not confuse the **preparing** and the **celebrating**.

The weeks of preparation are called **Advent**, the season of growing darkness before the solstice. Advent and a new church year begins this weekend. The weeks of celebration are called **Christmastime**, the season of growing light after the solstice. Perhaps it comes down to something basic: We are children of the Light.

Of course, there's a great contrast between these two seasons of our faith and the commercial "holiday season." The "holiday season" usually begins in early November and then comes to a crashing halt on December 26. And, unfortunately, it is most often filled with great stress and fatigue because the preparing is usually focused on cleaning, shopping, decorating, baking, and partying. Yes, even partying can be stressful and exhausting! **We need something different!** We need a **Higher Love!**

We need Advent. We need a spiritual "oasis" to which we can retreat during all the craziness and be loved. Without it we stop being who we are: a people who are waiting in joyful anticipation for Emmanuel, God-With-Us. And we need Christmastime. We need a festival that runs beyond a single day or week. In the many days of Christmastime we shout loud and clear that Jesus Christ is born. The reign of God is here among us, in our flesh and blood. That is why we have star-topped trees, decked halls, and bountiful tables.

Advent, however, cannot exist if we jump the gun on Christmas. And Christmastime cannot exist if we are already tired of it by December 25. These two seasons require each other. Commit to making Advent a little different this year. Reach beyond yourselves and find **Higher Love** here at Holy Family. **Invite someone else who might need some spiritual enrichment**...a family member, a friend, a neighbor... to attend at least one mass with you during the season. Awaken to a **Higher Love!** Awaken to who you are as a **Beloved Child of God!**

May the lights of the Advent wreath lead us all to the Star of Bethlehem, the Light of the World.

Qualified charitable distribution (QCD) basics

Qualified charitable distributions (QCDs) can be taken out of your traditional IRA(s) free of any federal income tax hit. In contrast, other traditional IRA distributions are taxable (wholly or partially depending on whether you've made any nondeductible contributions over the years).

Unlike garden-variety charitable donations, you can't claim itemized deductions for QCDs. That's OK, because the tax-free treatment of QCDs equates to a 100% deduction because you'll never be taxed on those amounts. And you don't have to worry about tax-law restrictions that apply to itemized charitable write-offs. QCDs have several potential tax-saving advantages.

Advantage No. 1 QCDs are not included in your adjusted gross income (AGI). This lowers the odds that you will be affected by various unfavorable AGI-based rules, such as those that can cause more of your Social Security benefits to be taxed, less of your rental estate losses to be deductible, and more of your investment income to be hit with the dreaded 3.8% Medicare surtax (the so-called net investment income tax).

Advantage No. 2 QCDs always deliver a tax benefit while "regular" charitable donations might not. The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) almost doubled the standard deduction amounts for 2018-2025, and you only get a tax benefit from a charitable donation if your total itemizable deductions exceed your standard deduction. These higher standard deduction amounts under the TCJA reduce the odds that you will be able to itemize deductions and gain any tax savings from "regular" charitable donations.

Advantage No. 3 A QCD taken from your traditional IRA counts as a distribution for purposes of the required minimum distribution (RMD) rules. Therefore, you can arrange to donate all or part of your annual RMD (up to the \$100,000 limit) that you would otherwise be forced to receive and pay taxes on.

Talk to your financial or tax advisor to see if making an QCD distribution from your IRA to Holy Family is right for you.





the heart of Advent Children find it excruciating! Waiting frequently makes us

restless, increases our frustration and sometimes triggers aggression.

We spend a lot of our life waiting because waiting is part of the Creator's grand design. Waiting is one of God's tools for developing our hearts, our minds and our spirits. Advent asks us to rethink waiting.

Developmentally, waiting is a <u>life-skill</u> we learn through <u>practice</u>. Patience <u>is</u> a virtue, or as St. Paul teaches, one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit. Children need to learn and practice Advent waiting. This year, once again, our weekend liturgies will invite us to


STOP..... BREATHE LISTEN REFLECT during Mass each week of Advent.

The Jewish writer Simone Weil, said,

Waiting patiently in expectation is an act of hope. Scripture tells us, and our experience confirms, that God has blessed us time and



The early pages of the gospels tell the stories of men and women who have learned to wait on the Lord. Mary and Joseph, Elizabeth and Zechariah, Simeon and Anna, all echo the hopefulness of their ancestors in faith and show an unreserved confidence, a new sense of expectancy and a keen trust in the providence of God. Mary's response to God's promise is to sing, Elizabeth's is to welcome with open arms; Zechariah's is to shout for joy and Joseph's is to act resolutely in love. We need to instill these things in our children and reaffirm in ourselves during Advent.

Advent waiting requires that we trust.

Pray with song - create a Christmas playlist. Just listening to the words of your favorite carols can begin to prepare your heart for the coming of the Christ child. Playing them in the car is a good and <u>easy</u> way to introduce your kids/grandkids to the religious significance of Christmas.

Have young children? Invest in a new Christmas storybook. There are several beautiful ones available. One we would recommend is *The night of Posadas*, which will be integrated in our Children's Christmas Eve Mass here at Holy Family. Another beautiful one by the same author is *The Clown of God*, based on the medieval French tale *Le Jongleur de Notre Dame* the story of a juggler turned monk who has no gift to offer the Virgin Mary except for his ability to juggle well.




