What does a relationship with God look like for you?

Relationships tell us who we are, whose we are and what is expected of us. Our relationships define where we've been, where we are, and where we're going. In Matthew 5, Jesus teaches us that we are to love our enemies. "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven." When it comes to loving and praying for our adversaries, Jesus's words are inspiring and challenging, encouraging and convicting. Jesus reminds us that beyond the appearance of our most difficult adversary is a person loved by God and capable of good. Today's gospel invites us to see our spiritual life in the context of a God who sees me, hears me, knows me, and provides for me. When I open my eyes up to that God, I truly want to get to know Him better. Holiness means imitating God and trying to be as generous as we can. We are to act as God does in loving all, just or unjust, good or bad. His mercy and graciousness are radical, disproportionate, and outrageous.

Many of us have been hurt by another person at one time or another. **Broken relationships** may manifest as **fights**, **divorce**, **violence**, **abuse and war**. That's why God calls us, as a faith community to not just think about the relationship between **justice and mercy**, but to really live it out. When it comes to personal relationships, Jesus reminds us that our first and foremost response must be one of **mercy** rather than **retribution**. We are called to **seek and restore**, rather than to tear down. God is "**gracious**" and "**compassionate**." And if God is "gracious" and "compassionate," then we who claim to be His beloved children must also be "gracious" and "compassionate."

In today's gospel, Jesus is showing us an example of compassionate offered healing. Repeatedly we read that Jesus "had compassion on them" in stories of healings. Compassion and grace offer something real and tangible. Kindness is demonstrated. It is shown. It is offered to another. Grace and compassion do something. Compassion is not simply a feeling. Compassion acts. Compassion enters into the darkness with the one who suffers, and does something about it. Compassion costs us something. It demands something of us. We must step in, get dirty, invest something of our-

selves and our resources to demonstrate kindness to the other. We have to be willing to risk. As Henri Nouwen phrases it, "Who can take away suffering without entering into it?"

God offers us all grace. He reaches out to every one of us. He reveals himself to us in Jesus Christ and has extended the offer of new life. God's grace and compassion are not just an abstract. **They can and should do something to who we are**. Finally, grace and compassion are inherently indiscriminate. Just as God's grace and compassion are freely given, so too must ours. Just as God is kind to the ungrateful and the wicked, we too must be kind and gracious even to those we may not want to. We far too often hold back our love and kindness from some people. We see the sin, the brokenness and poor choices. We use all sorts of excuses to get around helping people.

So what does it mean to love our enemies? And how can we love our enemies the way that God loves His enemies? How do we express love for our enemies when they are our enemies precisely because they have perpetrated acts of violence on the innocent? How do we love the innocent victims of violence while at the same time expressing grace and compassion for those who are rightly our enemies because of their actions? What would it look like if the Church as a whole decided to actually imitate the compassion of Jesus Christ? What if we offered good news instead of a threat of retribution? What if we told sinners God is for them instead of God is angry? God's compassion lifts up, it doesn't tear down.

Lord You desire all Your children to love others as Christ loved us, but my love is poor and weak and is far removed for all that You desire of me. Fill me I pray with the love of Christ that I may love others in the same way that Christ loved me — so that as Your love pours into my soul, so I may be used as a conduit for Christ's love to stream out to others with whom I come into contact.

Help me to demonstrate Your love not only to those that are lovable, but also to those that who lash out at me through pain or anger, disappointment or loss. May the love of Jesus be manifested in me and may the love of Jesus be distributed, by grace through faith — to all with whom I come in contact, in Jesus name I pray. Amen

Edwina Gateley

Born in Lancaster, England, Edwina Gateley's educational experiences have awarded her a Teacher's Degree from her home country, a Master's Degree in Theology from Catholic Theological Union, Chicago, and certification as an HIV counselor in Illinois. After some time in prayer and solitude and then spending a year on the streets of Chicago walking with the homeless and women involved in prostitution, Edwina founded Genesis House, a house of hospitality and nurturing for the women involved in prostitution. She also founded the Volunteer Missionary Movement (VMM) in England to recruit, prepare and send lay missionaries to work in the developing world. The VMM has sent over 3,000 women and men to serve in 26 countries throughout the world. Edwina's missionary work took her to Uganda where she established a school for Ugandan girls, which became the largest and most successful in the area. Edwina is a writer and speaker, leading national and international retreats as well as Parish Missions, and she continues to work with women in recovery through her small Foundation, Sophia's Circle.


Bible Study at Holy Family

Lent still holds power in the imaginations of Catholics. It is not unusual to find Catholics who have left the Church, still consciously keeping the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and alms-giving. Ash Wednesday is still a day when Catholic Churches are filled to the rafters – more people come to Church on Ash Wednesday than on Easter!

So what is it that Lent speaks to in our lives?

Ann Barr Weems, the gifted and prolific "Presbyterian poet laureate" wrote,

"Lent is a time to take time to let the power of our faith story take hold of us,

- a time to let the events get up and walk around in us,
- a time to intensify our living unto Christ,
- a time to hover over the thoughts of our hearts...

Lent is a time to allow a fresh new taste of God!

Is it the Lenten *promise of a new start* that draws us to engage in Lent; to practice prayer, fasting and alms-giving in the hopes of reigniting our personal faith?



Does keeping the season of Lent anchor us in hope at a time when the natural world can seem to be so arbitrary, winter fiercely hanging on even as daylight valiantly warms the earth desperate to break forth in bloom, heralding the potent possibility that lies just below the surface?

Could it be the deepest parts of us realize that over time, our hearts and souls get messy and Lent *invites to roll up our sleeves and sort through the clutter of our lives* – a spiritual spring cleaning if you will?

Whatever the reason, Lent does speak to our on-going need for personal renewal. It is a season that encourages us to sort things out and let things go. Lent is a season that speaks of our need to re-set our internal clocks, tidy up the inner recesses of the heart in order to commit yet again to what is important.

These are wonderful lessons to share with our children and teens. Lent is a time to make sure they know

- We repent not to be loved, but because we are loved;
- We fast not to suffer for past transgressions but to de-clutter and re-focus, clearing out what distracts us from seeing and feeling God's love;
- We give, not to insure some far-off inheritance, but because we are confident in God's generousity.



PRAYER, FASTING & ALMSGIVING these are the ways we grow closer to God and our neighbor, resources to help us live hopeful, joy-filled lives rich in the harvest of justice, mercy.

LENT SOCIAL JUSTICE 2020 LOVE FIRST, A CHANGE IN PERSPECTIVE

The number 7 is highly significant in the bible as God rested on the 7th day of creation. Holy Family has completed six Lenten Social Justice Projects since the first visit to St. Paul in Kentucky in 2014. This is our 7th year and we plan to "rest" by focusing on a change in perspective. We will reaffirm our commitment to the 7 major principles of Catholic social teaching and review and receive current updates on the impact of our past six Lenten projects. Through the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and alms-giving, let us be energized and recommit ourselves to share time, talent and treasure within our community of faith and beyond.

As we enter into the week before Lent, the Gospel teaches us to love our neighbor. Catholic social teaching (CST) expresses that love in the first and most fundamental CST of *Respecting the Life and Dignity of the Human Person at All Stages of Life*. We also love our neighbor by Caring for Creation since human life cannot exist without the resources God created to sustain everyone on this planet.

Life and Dignity of the Human Person

The Catholic Church proclaims that human life is sacred and that the dignity of the human person is the foundation of a moral vision for society. Our belief in the sanctity of human life and the inherent dignity of the human person is the foundation of all the principles of our social teaching. We believe that every person is precious, that people are more important than things, and that the measure of every institution is whether it threatens or enhances the life and dignity of the human person.

Care for God's Creation

We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

Lenten Social Justice Project 2016 – JOURNEYS | The Road Home

Four years ago, Holy Family's Lenten Social Justice Project supported JOURNEYS | The Road Home, a non-profit agency in our Northwest Suburbs, by raising awareness around the issue of homelessness and collecting \$54,384 in almsgiving. JOURNEYS | The Road Home provides shelter, social services and housing to the homeless and those at risk of becoming homeless in 37 towns in north/northwest suburban Cook County. The mission of JOURNEYS is to individually assess and serve its clients, while broadening community awareness and involvement. The

agency consists of the PADS Shelter Program, the HOPE Center Supportive Services Program, and the Pathways Housing Readiness Program, all focused on assisting those in need. JOURNEYS currently provides over 50,000 services to more than 900 people across the north and northwest suburbs of Cook County

Love First - A Change in Perspective:

Northwest Suburban PADS, Inc. was created in 1989 and eventually merged with HOPE NOW, Inc. in 1992 to address the growing homeless population in the northwest suburbs. In October of 2001, Northwest Suburban PADS and HOPE NOW legally merged—forming the new agency known as JOURNEYS | The Road Home, a multifunded, comprehensive service agency with wraparound services including case management, job counseling, minor medical care, mental health screenings and securing permanent and stable housing.

Holy Family had been PADS site for 16 years at the time of our Lenten project and we understood the importance of reaching out to the homeless population. Our Lenten project increased our parish's awareness and increased JOURNEYS capacity to serve their clients. It just so happened that in 2016, the number of families facing homelessness was on the rise. This created a new challenge for JOURNEYS to properly serve not only adults, but now the many children caught in the trap of homelessness. Our gift was a huge blessing to the JOURNEYS staff as well as the families being served.

The momentum is continuing as JOURNEYS recently announced they will construct a 3-story, 27,000-square-foot facility adjacent to their current building, which will eventually be demolished. The new structure will have first-floor offices, 42 beds for PADS clients to use overnight on the second level and 11 permanent, affordable supportive living apartments on the third story.

As affordable housing options diminish in our area, JOURNEYS provides the care and dignity to individuals and families facing homelessness during their time of struggle. Holy Family Parish and its parishioners are a beacon of light to our neighbors, especially our neighbors in need. For more information about JOURNEYS, go to journeystheroadhome.org.


