Fr. Terry Keehan

Fr. Rich and I were having dinner with my good friend, Fr. Bob Heinz, from St. Mary of the Woods Parish in Chicago a few days before Governor Pritzker's stay at home order went into effect. We noticed a few unique things that night. First, the restaurant was not as crowded as it normally would be and, in fact, the server verified that fact when we asked her. Secondly, the guests were seated in a manner that left lots of room between tables. Physical and social distancing was already taking place.

In the midst of our lively discussion regarding the coronavirus, the uncertainties, and the many concerns and reactions, Fr. Heinz said something very profound. Undoubtedly inspired by the restaurant atmosphere he said, referring to our response to the gigantic challenge we are facing, "We can't just be concerned about our table, we must be concerned about the whole restaurant."

Our table, so to speak, is our part of the world or community. In the midst of this challenging virus scare, we must be aware of the whole restaurant of the world. That is what a pandemic means; it is a disease epidemic that has affected the entire world restaurant, and we must be aware of more than just our table, our family, our community, our state, our country, our condition, or our part. The entire restaurant is affected by this and our actions and precautions must have that in mind.

We have been making a statement here at Holy Family before each weekend Mass for over two years now that "We are in this together." I have a strong conviction that we should always be in THIS thing called life – together. Notice how timely this statement has become for more than just our parish, as several leaders and organizations have adopted the same statement in response to the Covid-19 virus, indicating a need for greater awareness leading to unifying action.

One of the hidden blessings in the midst of this pandemic is that, unlike the American resolve for unity following the 911 attacks, this challenge may bring the world together – the entire restaurant.

If we really believe that we are in this together, we will tap into resources that we never even knew we had. We have already seen generosity abound as people have a heightened sense

of compassion for others that normally doesn't exist.

As Jesus was faced with a challenge that initially seemed overwhelming – feeding over 5,000 people with a few loaves of bread and a couple of fish, he responded with a series of actions that spawned unity (see Matthew 14:13-21, Mark 6:31-44, Luke 9:12-17 and John 6:1-14 for details). He got the people to sit down, thus stopping and becoming more aware of each other's presence. This undoubtedly engendered greater sensitivity among them. Next, he gave thanks for what he had, as meager as it seemed. Then he shared what he had and, as we know, in the end there was not only enough – there were leftovers.

Both Jesus and Fr. Heinz call us to a greater awareness of something beyond ourselves. Their suggestions in the face of great concern point us in a direction of sharing and unity that will not only feed us as our concerns grow, it will take us beyond what we need and into what is possible – for the whole restaurant.

Practical Tips for Silent Prayer

In my Pastoral Letter recently I suggested that we take advantage of some extra alone time that we may find ourselves with, although parents with children at home all day may find much less alone time. May I suggest some things that can help ALL of us, even help those children and parents.

Turn off the TV. Take off your earbuds and headphones. Turn off the music. Stop. Be silent, even for a few minutes.

Sit in a chair that is comfortable but one that won't induce sleep. Sit up straight. Take a few deep breaths. Breathe by pushing your stomach out when you inhale and drawing it in as you exhale. Relax. Now read a passage of Scripture. Don't worry that you may not be a scripture scholar and thus figure out what the passage means; rather, let it speak to you. Simply pay attention to whatever catches your attention and continue to focus on it. Use the silence to let the passage touch your mind, your heart and most importantly your soul.

Let silence and scripture combine to deepen your prayer.

On Friday March 20, Governor Pritzker announced a mandatory shelter-in-place order for the State of Illinois. What this means for our parishes is that effective 5 p.m. Saturday, March 21 through Tuesday, April 7:

- All churches and adoration chapels must be closed and locked until the order is lifted by the governor. Private prayer in any parish building must be discontinued until the order is lifted.
- There can be no live Stations of the Cross or any other gatherings anywhere on parish/school property, nor can any parish personnel be involved in organizing them on any other site.
- All weddings and baptisms must be postponed and can be re-scheduled only once the order is lifted. There are no exceptions to this, regardless of the size of the group. However, in case of an extreme emergency for baptism, please seek the permission of your bishop.
 - Funerals and wakes must be postponed until the order is lifted.

(Note: Priests can – and are encouraged – to continue celebrating Mass privately and to livestream their Masses for their parishioners, if possible. Moreover, anointing of the sick and confession/absolution guidelines will be forthcoming.)

Human Concerns

LENT SOCIAL JUSTICE 2020 LOVE FIRST - A CHANGE IN PERSPECTIVE

For our final recap of our past six social justice Lenten projects, we focus on Catholic social teaching about Rights and Responsibilities and get an update on the Cuba projects.

What does Catholic social teaching say about the Rights and Responsibilities?

Rights and Responsibilities

The Catholic tradition teaches that human dignity can be protected and a healthy community can be achieved only if human rights are protected and responsibilities are met. Therefore, every person has a fundamental right to life and a right to those things required for human decency. Corresponding to these rights are duties and responsibilities—to one another, to our families, and to the larger society.

Lenten Social Justice Project 2017 – San Miguel Arcangel Church, San Miguel de los Banos, Cuba – This Lenten project worked in collaboration with Catholic Extension raising donations totalling \$95,000. This enabled Catholic Extension to provide grant money to not only rehab San Miguel Arcangel Church, but also two chapels in the Diocese of Pinar del Rio – Las Ovas Chapel and Paso Real de San Diego Chapel. St. Rosendo Cathedral also received grant funding to complete their renovations. To date, all projects are moving along quite well as the both chapels are very close to completion and St. Rosendo Cathedral is moving ahead of schedule. San Miguel Arcangel is also moving along well as they continue to gather the materials needed for completion.

Love First

Significant work has occurred over the last three years to begin to transform the oncedilapidated building into a church. Work already completed includes the demolition of the three-floor bell-tower and lateral naves, repairs to the exterior of the dome, partial restoration of the interior beams of the dome, carpentry work of doors and windows, installment of new windows to the north side of the church, repairs to the interior columns, placement of supporting beams, and repair to exterior walls, as well as partial installation of the electric system.

The journey has not been an easy one for San Miguel Arcángel but a journey that began with Love First. The entire island of Cuba is facing massive shortages of supplies and materials. Cement and gasoline were at a shortage in the country, a problem which was only exacerbated by Hurricane Irma in 2017. Additionally, the lateral naves of the church had to be demolished and reconstructed due to the bad state they were in. Despite the challenges, the parishioners - true to the resilient and determined spirit of the people of Cuba—were able to finally gain access to cement and transport it to San Miguel Arcángel. Now, work on the project is moving forward again, as evident in this encouraging photo. Catholic Extension will continue to monitor the progress of this important project.

It is important to note that this delayed construction process has not been time lost for the people of San Miguel. The community members continue to meet in people's homes for liturgy and prayer. They know that with Holy Family's support three years ago, their dream of having a church is slowly becoming a reality. They are patiently waiting in hopeful expectation of the day when they can walk through their church doors again.

Holy Family's generosity allowed many additional projects to be completed on the island. The pastor of

the Cathedral of San Rosendo in the diocese of Pinar del Ro says: "I want to take this opportunity to express our thanks to Holy Family for your project, your help in the restoration and painting of this cathedral. We are so happy. We are thankful and we pray that the Lord may keep blessing you and remain with you always. Many blessings on you and pray for us. Thank you."
