The next three weekends we will hear a series of long, but very rich, stories from the Gospel of John. This year we are hearing readings from cycle A, and the Gospel stories are primarily from Matthew. However, each Lent during the 3rd, 4th and 5th weeks we may use the Samaritan Woman at the Well, the Man Born Blind and the Raising of Lazarus. These three readings more powerfully express the scrutinies that we will also mark, not only for our Candidates and Catechumens seeking full Communion with us, but for ALL of us. We can use these three readings to scrutinize, or examine, our hearts and souls, to give special and deeper reflection regarding the practice and actions of our faith life. May I suggest that if you have not already made a commitment to one of the 7 principles of Catholic Social Teaching that you listen intently to these three readings.

Consistent with this year's Lenten theme of **Love First**, may I suggest that you scrutinize your heart and strip away things that interfere or prohibit you from embracing the unconditional and foundational love that God has for you. I would like to share an example:

Several years ago I read an article in the *Chicago Tribune* about a boy from Wisconsin who was born without legs. This presented a significant challenge for him and his family, as you can imagine. He and his mother navigated the primary years of his life as well as could be expected, in fact, better than the mother had expected. The boy maneuvered in special scooters and wheel chairs and seemed to be adjusting. However, as the boy became an adolescent, he began to demonstrate rebellion and anger. This behavior escalated to a point where the mother was exhausted and questioning how to deal with this situation. She was at her wits' end.

One particular day, as she and her son were arguing and he voiced despair at his situation, the mother reports that something came over her from an unknown place (I believe from Love and the Holy Spirit), and she sternly asked her son the most important question of his life. She asked, "Are you going to let the fact that you have no legs define who you are?" Quickly then she demanded, "I want an answer right now!"

Her son was stunned, but forced to give a reply. His first reaction was tears. Mom thought for one split second that she had made a mistake, but after he collected himself, he looked up at her and with a sense of resolve replied, "No."

With a renewed sense of hope, the mother found resources to put a number of medical procedures in place that drafted stubs onto his lower body, from which were attached prostheses that eventually became fairly well functioning legs. The article was really about the advanced medical procedures that enabled him greater mobility, but I was more touched by the interaction of the mother and son.

It leads me to a question for you to consider... "Does dying on the cross ultimately define who Jesus is?" After significant reflection, I say "No." What ultimately defines Jesus Christ is rising from the dead, not dying on the cross. His Resurrection is rooted in his suffering and dying. He, and we, must go through suffering and death to get to new life, but his Resurrection, and ours, must be rooted in the deepest and first love – God's love for us – God's First love for us. Our Cross of New Life suggests this as Jesus is reaching out to us from a place of suffering, but rooted in love. We are trying to emphasize this Lent that everything is rooted in God's Love for us; EVERYTHING, including the passion, suffering and death of Jesus, and ours as well, as people who dare to identify ourselves as like Christ—or Christians.

What is the worst thing that has ever happened to you? What is the worst mistake you have ever made? What tragedy has befallen you? Will you let that define you? Does it define you, or will God's Love First define you? Does God's Love First define you?

Celebrating the Rites of Scrutiny



On this Third Sunday of Lent, at the 11:00 mass, we celebrate the first of three Rites of Scrutiny with our RCIA elect and candidates. Two related themes characterize the season of Lent: Baptism and Penance. It is a time of purification and enlightenment for the elect and candidates preparing to receive the Easter sacraments of initiation. In this process, they are helped by this local faith community as we recall our own Baptism and prepare for its Easter renewal. As a community, we all join together in a spirit of repentance and conversion of heart, preparing for the celebration of new life at Easter.

The scrutinies are rituals of self-searching and repentance. They are ancient rites and, though they may seem strange to us, they are profoundly rooted in our human experience. They are meant to uncover, then heal, all that is weak and broken in the hearts of the elect and candidates; to bring out, then strengthen, all that is upright and good. The agent of scrutiny, however, is not this community, but the Living Word of God which scrutinizes us all and prepares us for the Eastertime renewal of baptismal promises.

The Second and Third Scrutinies will be celebrated on the Fourth and Fifth Sundays of Lent at the 5:00 and 9:00 masses, respectively. Please keep our RCIA elect and candidates in your prayers as we journey together to experience **a change in perspective and LOVE FIRST**, in preparation to celebrate the Easter sacraments.

Edwina Gateley

Born in Lancaster, England, Edwina Gateley's educational experiences have awarded her a Teacher's Degree from her home country, a Master's Degree in Theology from Catholic Theological Union, Chicago, and certification as an HIV counselor in Illinois.

After some time in prayer and solitude and then spending a year on the streets of Chicago walking with the homeless and women involved in prostitution, Edwina founded Genesis House, a house of hospitality and nurturing for the women involved in prostitution. She also founded the Volunteer Missionary Movement (VMM) in England to recruit, prepare and send lay missionaries to work in the developing world. The VMM has sent over 3,000 women and men to serve in 26 countries throughout the world. Edwina's missionary work took her to Uganda where she established a school for Ugandan girls, which became the largest and most successful in the area. Edwina is a writer and speaker, leading national and international retreats as well as Parish Missions, and she continues to work with women in recovery through her small Foundation, Sophia's Circle.

Join teens from Holy Family as well as teens from Catholic parishes across the Midwest for an amazing week of prayer, service, fellowship, faith sharing and high energy games and activities for a ton of fun. Once again, we will partner with **Catholic Work Heart** as we head to **Farmington, Michigan** (a northern suburb of Detroit), the week of **June 21-26, 2020**.

Catholic Work Heart Camp's motto is **Love. Serve. Connect.** The Mission Trip provides opportunities for teens to restore homes, feed the hungry, lift the spirits of children, bring joy to the elderly and disabled, and help local social service agencies.

The program is open to all those going into 8th grade in the fall of 2020 through high school seniors who graduate in the Spring of 2020. The projected cost of the trip this year is \$670.00 per participant. We run three fundraisers prior to the trip to defray the cost per teen to between \$300-350. All teens wishing to defray their personal cost are asked to help with each fundraiser.

LENT SOCIAL JUSTICE 2020 LOVE FIRST - A CHANGE IN PERSPECTIVE

The number 7 is highly significant in the bible as God rested on the 7th day of creation. Holy Family has completed six Lenten Social Justice Projects since the first visit to St. Paul in Kentucky in 2014. This is our 7th year and we plan to “rest” by focusing on **Love First**. Because when we **Love First**, we experience a **Change in Perspective**. We will reaffirm our commitment to the 7 major principles of Catholic social teaching and review and receive current updates on the impact of our past six Lenten projects. Through the Lenten disciplines of prayer, fasting and alms-giving, let us be energized and recommit ourselves to share time, talent and treasure within our community of faith and beyond.

What does Catholic social teaching say about the Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers?

The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it is a form of continuing participation in God’s creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected—the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to organize and join unions, to private property, and to economic initiative.

Lenten Social Justice Project 2014

St. Paul Mission Church in McKee, KY – This was our first collaborative effort with Catholic Extension Society. St. Paul is a small mission church in Appalachia (the only Catholic Church in that county) and serves a rural population. It could not sustain the salary of a full-time priest. Rebecca Koury (now Rebecca Woods) was the Pastoral Associate at that time. Holy Family raised **\$48,718** to pay Rebecca’s salary and support the many ministries she administers in collaboration with Catholic Extension. Since 2014, Rebecca instituted many programs benefitting youth, adults and the greater community.

Love First

Rebecca fell in love with the people living in McKee, Ky, especially at St. Paul Mission Church. She was open to doing what was needed knowing that God uses everyone for something and He always teaches us through others. Through that lens, she gained a perspective on the importance of diversity in the parish. It made her want to continue to work in the Church. She never felt alone and they felt like family.

Rebecca shared: “I never thought about or felt any different as a woman and lay person (doing pastoral work) because Sister Mary had been in charge for so long before there was a pastor. That is the beauty of St. Paul. They are like family and it’s “everybody’s church.” Working with Sister gave me a perspective on religious sisters, and I loved the level of care they gave to everyone. We all carried different roles and experienced God in each one. “

One unique program Rebecca started was to make granola and sell it to visitors coming to McKee as it is a favorite place for hikers because of the sheer beauty of the mountains. It was a way to create new jobs in a town devastated by the demise of the coal industry. She has been in contact with a business-woman in Jackson county, KY that currently runs a cheesecake business. She is considering taking on the Mountain Made granola product since the license is in Lexington. We hope to learn more about the finalizing of terms soon.

With support from Holy Family, Rebecca increased both social and pastoral outreach to this very poor community. After faithfully serving in the community for eight years, Rebecca Woods made the decision to transition out of the parish. However, she created a strong foundation for a new lay leader, Rebecca Nixon, to succeed her in this important ministry. We wish Rebecca Woods the very best in her new role as a case manager with the Indiana Dept. of Child Services and as a new mom. We look forward to hearing more about St. Paul’s programs and the progress of Mountain Made granola from Rebecca Nixon while keeping both Rebecca’s in our prayers.

Precautions

We want to advise you of the measures we have taken as a staff and throughout our campus to minimize concern over **COVID-19 (coronavirus)**. We want to assure you we are following recommended guidelines as posted by the CDC and recommended by the Archdiocese.

We are committed to following the steps to prevent the spread of everyday illnesses including COVID-19.
