# Fr. Terry Keehan

## Lenten Theme

We mark time in many ways. We use it to usher in the future, saying things like, "It's time to eat, time to go to work, time to go to bed," and many more times for...

Our Lenten theme this year gives the ushering in of the future a sense of urgency. You will be hearing **Now is the Time for ... A LOT** this Lent.



This statement comes from the second reading proclaimed this Ash Wednesday from Paul's second letter to the Corinthians (6:1-2).

Paul appeals to us not to receive the grace of God in vain, assuring us that God hears us in an acceptable time and helps us on the day of salvation. For greater emphasis and grounding all that we should prepare for, Paul continues, "NOW is the very acceptable time; NOW is the day of Salvation."

The sub themes of each week of this coming Lent will complete the initial statement:

NOW is the time for CHANGE  
NOW is the time to LISTEN  
NOW is the time to turn from greed to SOCIAL JUSTICE  
NOW is the time to BELIEVE  
NOW is the time to be SERVANT LEADERS

Beginning NOW, this week, with urgency for change, we are challenged to go deeper in experiencing change, to retrieve its original meaning. The type of change Paul is speaking of is *Metanoia*, indicating a truly transformative change, a change of heart, a spiritual conversion.

Lent is a season calling us to this type of change.

Let us share a deep spiritual journey together this Lent because... **NOW is the time.**

## Solidarity

As we have done in recent Lents, we will be highlighting the importance of Catholic Social Teaching and in particular this year the principle of SOLIDARITY. We are one human family, whatever our differences. We are our brothers and sisters keepers. At the core of Solidarity is the pursuit of justice and peace.

As always, scripture guides us in Solidarity as Psalm 122 tells us, "Peace be with you! For the sake of the Lord I will seek your good."

In his encyclical *Laudato Si*, Pope Francis says, "We need to strengthen the conviction that we are one single human family...There are no frontiers or barriers, political or social, behind which we can hide, still less is there room for the globalization of indifference."

This year we will extend SOLIDARITY to and with our neighbors at St. Joseph's Home for the Elderly and The Little Sisters of the Poor in Palatine. St. Joseph's Home has been a partner of ours for many years and beginning in week three of Lent we will hear more specifics of how we can help the Sisters and more fully live the principle of SOLIDARITY.



## THE PASCHAL SEASON 40/3/50

ALL THE DAYS, from Ash Wednesday to Pentecost, are our Paschal (Passover) Season. The 40 days of Lent and the 50 days of Eastertime surround the Triduum, along with the Great Three Days from Holy Thursday evening through Easter Sunday evening. This entire season has a unity centered in the Easter Vigil. It is expressed through our Lenten theme - Now Is the Time, and continued celebration of baptismal death and resurrection in Christ during Eastertime. Together we experience A Very Acceptable Time for change during Lent so that we might come to celebrate The Day of Salvation during Easter and, in turn, go forth at Pentecost in the power of the Spirit to transform the world.

Lent has a twofold theme of Baptism (both recalling and preparing for) and repentance.

Another word for repentance is conversion. Both of these words are from the Greek word, metanoia, best defined as “change of heart/change of mind/change of perspective.” This Lent we are challenged to recognize that Now Is The Time to go “beyond our mind,” to a new way of seeing ourselves as beloved Children of God. Now Is The Time to see that each of us is a new creation literally loved into being by God, in Christ, and celebrated in Baptism.

While Lent is serious, it is never sad. It is a “spiritual spring,” a joyful season of conversion and a turning toward the Gospel. Due to the Lenten focus on Baptism, those preparing to celebrate the initiation sacraments are our companions on the journey toward Easter. Whether they are RCIA participants preparing to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and/or Confirmation at the Easter Vigil, or second-graders and high school students preparing to celebrate First Eucharist and Confirmation during the Easter season, all of us are reflecting, reconciling, and changing in response to “Now Is The Time.”

There is also a strong social justice element to Lent. The prophet Isaiah reminds us: “This is the fasting that (God wishes); releasing those bound unjustly...setting free the oppressed...sharing your bread with the hungry, sheltering...the homeless.” This season we will focus on the Catholic Social Teaching of Solidarity; Now Is The Time to see ourselves as one human family.

As we embark on our Lenten 2021 journey, let us remember...

“Behold, now is a very acceptable time; now is the day of salvation”  
- 2 Corinthians 6:2

We are living in a time that is challenging to our faith practice and our ability to see one another as God's children. Instead of drawing ourselves to one another in our common goodness, we stand as witnesses to increased divisiveness. Our Catholic social teaching on Solidarity states:

*"We are one human family whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. We are our brothers' and sisters' keepers, wherever they may be. Learning to practice the virtue of solidarity, learning that "loving our neighbor" has global dimensions in an interdependent world. At the core of the virtue of solidarity is the pursuit of justice and peace."* USCCB.org

"Before all else, let us begin by acknowledging that change is needed. . . . Do we truly realize that something is wrong in a world where there are so many farmworkers without land, so many families without a home, so many laborers without rights, so many persons whose dignity is not respected? Do we realize that something is wrong where so many senseless wars are being fought and acts of fratricidal violence are taking place on our very doorstep? Do we realize something is wrong when the soil, water, air and living creatures of our world are under constant threat? 


