Annual Catholic Appeal

This weekend is the second and commitment part of the three week Annual Appeal. Last weekend we introduced the need for the Appeal and began to offer additional means and methods to support it financially.

Each year this Appeal broadens our notion of and awareness of Church. As Catholics we are a part of the 340 parishes and many non-parish agencies and services for all people, not just Catholics, in Lake and Cook Counties. We are very blessed here at Holy Family with resources that most parishes do not have. We should be very proud of the outreach that we do in our local community to assist and to serve our neighbors with some of life's basic needs. We are also able to provide programs of formation and education that, quite frankly, are easy to take for granted. This Appeal invites us to help our neighbors beyond our local communities.

The Annual Appeal assists parishes, communities and agencies that do not have the resources we do, or do not have any means of raising funds to support their ministries. In many of those areas the need is the greatest. This campaign expresses our support for each other as an Archdiocese. It is a great way to serve.

The ministry of the local church, our Archdiocese includes non-parish ministries as well. For example, Fr. Kurt now focuses his ministry as the Vicar for Priests, which is a source of support for all of us priests. I worked in the Vocation Office for the Archdiocese for eight years, assisting post-college aged men and women discerning priesthood, religious life and lay ministry in the Church. These are two of the many agencies that have no community or parishioner base to directly support their efforts. They rely on funds generated by a sharing diocesan-wide, including this Appeal.

This weekend at Mass, including the 9:00am Mass that is always live streamed and available to view at any time via our website, we will hear a message from Cardinal Cupich articulating the need for this effort. As your Pastor, I ask that you

be attentive to his message and to make a gift to the Appeal. I want to thank all of you who have given to the campaign in past years. I can assure you that the funds generated are deeply appreciated by the parishes, schools, agencies and people served by the Archdiocese. Each of us is called to share his or her gifts in support of the local Church, the Archdiocese of Chicago which I refer to in the Eucharistic Prayer each time I have the honor of presiding at the Eucharist.

How to be a Hero

When you hear the word “hero,” what image or words come to mind? We often use this word to honor the bravery of firefighters, soldiers, policemen and women, hospital-workers, activists, etc. It’s a well deserved title for anyone who sacrifices for others, or shows courage when life presents a challenge. These people stand out and inspire others by their actions.



In our ancient Catholic tradition, through the passage of time, Christians have celebrated, honored and prayed to “saints,” in whom we have found evidence of *heroism*. These men and women *lived* for God, and many of them sacrificed their lives, livelihoods, self-interest or reputations for their faith. Oftentimes, this happened in a society that was generally opposed to their beliefs and practices - the ones that died for their faith are called “martyrs.” We remember and honor them as “*Heroes of the Faith*,” and the remembrance of their heroism is enshrined in our songs, prayers, religious devotionals, statues and stained-glass.

Unfortunately, in today’s modern world, many Catholics (our young ones especially) hear about Saints and they view them as “otherworldly” or “unapproachable.”

They say, “How could I, of all people, be like St. Paul, St. Francis... or St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta?” Ironically, these very saints viewed themselves as no better than anyone else and were (just like every other saint) made of the same human flesh and bone that we are, too. So, what has to change to fix this problem..? Their life-stories don’t have to change, but the way we talk about their life-stories must.

Yes, St. Paul did travel thousands of miles in his ministry spreading the Gospel message far and wide and inspired the early church with his devotion to our Lord, although he also struggled just like us and begged God to take away the “thorn in his flesh” (2 Corinthians 12:6-7). St. Paul never specified exactly what this “thorn” was, but in his humanness, he expressed that he too, suffered anxiety over troubles that pained him. On this same note, both St. Francis of Assisi and St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta, in all their great accomplishments done for the glory and love of God also suffered and were not perfect.

St. Francis was known to lose his temper on occasion and not always be the charitable person we popularly remember him as today. St. Mother Teresa underwent long periods of doubt and torment in her faith, which may come as a surprise to many readers. She one time wrote in a letter to a priest-friend, “Jesus has a very special love for you. As for me, the silence and the emptiness is so great that I look and do not see, listen and do not hear.”

In this difficult time in our world, let us remember that to be a “hero,” that to be a “saint” doesn’t mean that you are perfect and sinless, but that heroism is a possibility to all of us. Embrace your humanity and recognize that God can use you in service and light to others, even through the hardest of times. Seneca said, “sometimes, even to live is an act of courage.” Here’s to the heroes.

Holy Family Parish will be distributing fresh produce from the Greater Chicago Food Depository in the remote parking lot on Thursday, Feb 11. If you would like to help with the distribution, contact Sue at 847-907-3443 or sgeegan@holyfamilyparish.org.

This will be a drive-through distribution to maintain social distancing between volunteers and guests. We ask for adults and children no younger than 12 years old. Due to the pandemic, numbers of people coming for food has doubled, so we need many hands to assist us in distributing the produce to our neighbors in need. We need helpers at 8:30am unloading pallets and setting up before the distribution and people to clean up until about noon. Distribution is outdoors rain or shine.

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY UPDATE

Although we have been hampered by the Covid pandemic, the Habitat ministry made substantial progress in 2020. Through Holy Family's participation in the Spring of Life partnership, we completed two projects last year. Unfortunately, yet understandably, the local Habitat affiliate has suspended all volunteer participation in build activities until March 31, at the earliest. The potential exists to begin our next project in early April. It is all dependent on the rollout of the Covid vaccine. Our highest priority is the health and safety of all volunteers.

The following is a recap of our work in 2020 showing Spring of Life (SPRING) achievements and some notable milestones this year.

In July, SPRING completed our 18th project in a record period. We broke ground in December 2019 and held the house blessing in July. The project was on schedule for completion in early May before the Covid pandemic lockdown. Through the effort of numerous volunteers, the new homeowner and her two children have an affordable home which will greatly stabilize their finances.



In early July, SPRING assumed the task of completing a second home this year. The project had been placed on hold by the Habitat affiliate during the height of the pandemic. SPRING volunteers, working in smaller teams to follow prudent safety protocols, completed the project in November. The new homeowner works regularly with our volunteer construction crews, learning all the tips and tricks it takes to build and maintain a home.

Habitat does not provide handouts but a hand up. This mother, because of domestic violence and divorce, has progressed from a WINGS resident to full time employment, and now, homeownership. The mother and daughter will move into their home shortly after the holidays.
