Our Lenten theme of **Now is the Time** gives urgency to things both old and new, traditional and contemporary.

We have used the urgency of the season to emphasize a time for familiar Lenten experiences, **CHANGE** and **LISTENING** thus far. This week we emphasize **TURNING FROM GREED TO JUSTICE**.

We hear, not from Mark, but from John in the Gospel this weekend about a dramatic scene in the Temple showing a passionate and angry side of Jesus. He uses the Temple as a metaphor for his very self, one that will be destroyed then rebuilt in three days. This is a foreshadowing of his death and Resurrection. As we hear this story, let us once again be reminded that the importance of the Lenten journey is to lead us to the rebuilt Temple that is Jesus Christ at Easter. In the midst of this proclamation by Jesus, he is physically aggressive in turning over tables and using cords as a whip to drive people out who are using the sacred Temple as a marketplace.

The Liturgical Arts Community...

creates a vibrant prayer and worship experience so that all may participate in a fully conscious and active way in the liturgy. This includes different forms of prayer and worship experiences, for all attending Holy Family.

1. Chronicles shows this human pattern: People sin – God is merciful – people continue to sin – divine punishment follows. In the end, God shows the depth of His mercy and forgiveness. Is this pattern still true today? How does God's mercy continue to impact our lives?
2. As Paul tells us: "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not from you; it is the gift of God." In light of this, why are the good works that we do still so important?
3. "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life." This may be the most widely known Gospel quote. Why is this message so powerful? What does it mean to you?
4. As we start to emerge from the year of COVID, did we do a good job of keeping His light bright in our lives and for those around us?

Dear Parishioners of Holy Family Parish,

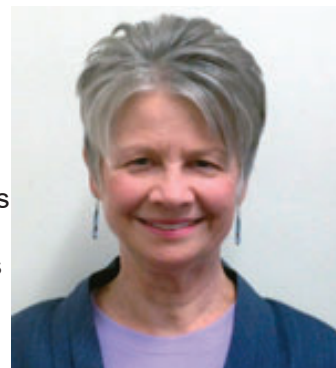

Lenten Social Justice Project

This Lent, Holy Family will live out the Catholic social teaching of **Solidarity** more intentionally by supporting The Little Sisters of the Poor at the St Joseph's Home for the Elderly in Palatine. The Little Sisters of the Poor are an international congregation of Roman Catholic women religious founded in 1839 by Saint Jeanne Jugan. Together with a diverse network of collaborators, they serve the elderly poor in over 30 countries around the world.

The COVID pandemic has profoundly challenged the Little Sisters and they require assistance with in-kind and financial donations to support their residents. An in-kind collection of much needed items will take place beginning this weekend, March 6/7 and accepted through March 21. This list of specific items along with additional information can be found on the Lenten Social Justice page of Holy Family's website or this link <http://bit.ly/LentSJP>.

- Containers are outside on the front portico near the west entrance doors to collect these items. We ask that you separate heavy items from the lighter items to prevent the lighter items from being crushed. Containers are clearly marked and we appreciate your cooperation. Holy Family Teens will be available to unload at the curb on March 6, 1-3pm, March 13, 10am-12pm and March 20, 1-3pm.
- Donations may also be dropped off at St. Joseph's Home's front doors located at 80 W. Northwest Hwy, Palatine.
- Checks can be made out to Holy Family Parish with a notation "St. Joseph's Home" and deposited in Lenten SJ envelopes available on the tables as you leave Mass. Financial donations, in a clearly marked envelope for the Lenten SJ project, can be deposited in the offertory boxes after Mass, placed in the secure mail deposit outside the front entrance doors, or dropped off at the parish office on Tuesdays, between 9:30am and noon.
