Palm Sunday always begins the most sacred time of the church year and the spiritual invitation to enter into Holy Week. I would like to emphasize and challenge us all to ENTER into this, and every Holy Week. We can do this by putting ourselves in the place of Jesus as he ENTERED into Jerusalem instigating the first one. My spiritual invitation/challenge is to enter into Holy Week – ALL of Holy Week.

The Church places particular emphasis on the Triduum, which begins as Wednesday of the coming week gives way to Thursday. The focus is on an experience of the number three, hence the name Tri(3)duum. We should obviously enter into the drama, Passion and purpose of this special time beginning on Thursday, but I don't think enough emphasis is placed on Monday-Wednesday. The impact of the Triduum often overlooks Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, which is another experience of 3 days, most commonly viewed like any other three days, but it can be another triduum, so to speak.

The use of the number three in Holy Week most commonly refers to the components of what we call the Paschal Mystery, the SUFFERING, DEATH and RESURRECTION of Christ. The Paschal Mystery gives us both an experience to pray into, as well as a guide for the suffering, death and resurrection that we experience so frequently in our lives. If we look at suffering and death of our lives like Christ looked at his, through the lens of faith, we will experience new life.

The Triduum includes three liturgical events that are ideally viewed as one with three components. They include the Last Supper, instituting the Eucharist on Thursday; Christ's suffering and death on Good Friday; and the Vigil on Holy Saturday, which ushers in the Resurrection experience on many levels, including those to be initiated fully into our community.

All of this emphasis on three may invite us to consider several spiritual elements of this special time of year. The Triduum actually includes 4 events: The Eucharist, Suffering, Death and

Resurrection. I like to emphasize then that there are three transitions:

From Meal to Suffering – 1
From Suffering to Death – 2
and
From Death to Resurrection – 3

By now, many of you are familiar with my suggestion that the number three has both physical and spiritual realities in the world that we all live in. This can be applied to and draw new life from the liturgical experience of the Triduum.

In the physical of our one world, three can mean 1. A Beginning, 2. The Middle and 3. The End. Viewing Holy Week like this might be helpful for planning family gatherings that conclude with Easter Sunday and end, so to speak, with the passage of seven days.

The spiritual 1, 2, 3 however refers to 1. The Beginning, 2. The Next Step, and 3. The Eternal.

But the spiritual element of these events invite us to pray into the beginning of the week, Palm Sunday, the next steps of the great drama from Thursday to Sunday that gives way to the ultimate thing that lasts, eternal life.

So, I would like to invite/challenge you to use Monday of Holy Week to reflect on the beginning of your faith journey. How did it begin? Who taught you about faith? About God? Then Tuesday can be a reflection on the next steps that you have taken. How did you mature in your faith? How have you grown? This all gives way to a reflection on Wednesday focusing on what lasts about your faith. What do you believe is eternal? What has lasted for you, or perished for you, in your faith journey?

Let's have two sets of three this Holy Week, two Triduums, and may it be a very sacred time for us to ENTER into deeper reflection of beginnings, next steps and the eternal nature of our faith that comes through the suffering, death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ our Lord.

An Examination of Conscience in Light of Catholic Social Teaching USCCB

Life and Dignity of the Human Person

- Do I respect the life and dignity of every human person from conception through natural death?
- Do I recognize the face of Christ reflected in all others around me whatever their race, class, age, or abilities?
- Do I work to protect the dignity of others when it is being threatened?
- Am I committed to both protecting human life and to ensuring that every human being is able to live in dignity?

Call to Family, Community and Participation

- Do I try to make positive contributions in my family and in my community?
- Are my beliefs, attitudes and choices such that they strengthen or undermine the institution of the family?
 - Am I aware of problems facing my local community and involved in efforts to find solutions?
 - Do I support the efforts of poor persons to work for change in their communities?
 - Do my attitudes and actions empower or disempower others?

Rights and Responsibilities

- Do I recognize and respect the economic, social, political and cultural rights of others?
- Do I live in material comfort and excess while remaining insensitive to the needs of others?
- Do I take seriously my responsibility to ensure that the rights of persons in need are realized?
 - Do I urge those in power to implement programs and policies that give priority to the human dignity and rights of all, especially the vulnerable?

Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

- Do I give special attention to the needs of the poor/vulnerable in my community/the world?
 - Am I disproportionately concerned for my own good at the expense of others?
 - Do I engage in service and advocacy work that protects the dignity of the poor and vulnerable?

The Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers

- Do I give my employer a fair day's work for my wages? Do I treat workers fairly?
- Do I treat all workers with whom I interact with respect?
- Do I support the rights of all workers to adequate wages, health insurance, vacation and sick leave? Do I affirm their right to join unions or worker associations?
- Do my purchasing choices take into account the hands involved in the production of what I buy?

Solidarity

- Does the way I spend my time reflect a genuine concern for others?
- Is solidarity incorporated into my prayer and spirituality? Do I lift up vulnerable people throughout the world in my prayer, or is it reserved only for my personal concerns?
- Do I see all members of the human family as my brothers and sisters?

Care for God's Creation

- Do I live out my responsibility to care for God's creation?
- Do I see my care for creation as connected to my concern for poor persons, who are most at risk from environmental problems?
- Do I litter, live wastefully, or use energy too freely? Are there ways I could reduce consumption in my life?
- Are there ways I could change my daily practices and those of my family, school, workplace or community to better conserve the earth's resources for future generations?

The Importance of Family Traditions

Family traditions strengthen the bond between family members, providing a sense of identity and belonging. Participating in family traditions help children understand who they are. They contribute to a sense of continuity across generations, keeping families connected across space and time. Family traditions inspire and create cherished life-long memories that we share. Family stories pass on the collective wisdom a family has gained through lifetimes of experience.



When religious symbols and rituals are embedded within family traditions and become part of everyday life, both family life and the intentional practice of faith become more robust. In his article, **The Importance of Family Faith for Lifelong Faith Formation**, John Roberto writes,

"It is evident that youth who are most likely to mature in faith are those raised in homes where faith is part of the normal ebb and flow of family life."

Family faith traditions, instill values, transmit beliefs and give meaning to our lives. The practice of our faith, when woven into the fabric of family life and expressed through shared family experiences, increases our sense of agency and builds resilience. **The "Effective Christian Education Study"** (Search Institute.1990) found that "the practice of faith in families was the most important factor in faith maturity."

Holy means, "set apart." Christians set apart the week before Easter, called **Holy Week**. During this week we celebrate the **Paschal Mystery**, the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus, which is at the core of our Faith. Though many are still not comfortable coming to Church, there are many ways to participate in Holy Week.

To you, Lord, I return it.




