Fr. Terry Keehan

As the Easter season continues, we go back chronologically in John's Gospel and hear Jesus telling the earliest band of his followers and all who subsequently believe in him, including us, he will suffer and die for us. These words are told before those salvific events occurred. This passage conveys Jesus' prediction of mission and purpose using a tender image of a shepherd. But, for emphasis and clarification, he calls himself the Good Shepherd and qualifies this goodness by saying he will, "Lay down his life for his sheep." Sheep here means disciples.

He contrasts this commitment and love of his sheep, and for us, with someone who is hired to care for the sheep, but payment for this care is more important than the relationship with them. The Good Shepherd forms a relationship with his sheep and the word that surfaced during our discussion this week during our Directors meeting was devotion. Jesus Christ the Good Shepherd is devoted to us and our welfare.

As I gathered with our Holy Family Catholic Academy students for Mass this past week, we reflected on the same passage from John. Mrs. Jen Lando's remote learning class of Kindergarteners and First Graders surfaced two additional words to describe the type of Good Shepherd Jesus is. They observed that he protects us and guides us. They then shared with the entire school via zoom and live stream how they have felt Jesus guiding and protecting them.

Laying down his life further shows the Lord's devotion for us because it includes the word "life." Jesus 'layed down his life' for us because he would later take it up again in the glory of the Resurrection that shines during this Easter season.

Please Note the 11:00am Mass Schedule

As we expand our weekend Mass offerings our staff has chosen to do so carefully because we continue to need volunteers to safely host Mass. We also have an additional 4 First Communions and 3 Confirmations in the next two months. We will be offering 11:00am Mass beginning this Sunday, April 25 and then on the following Sundays: May 2, May 9, May 16, (but NOT May 23 or 30), then beginning June 6 we will offer 11 am Mass every Sunday going forward.

At The Table

Deacon Dennis Brown offers an answer for this week's *At the Table* series.

What are the Introductory Rites of the Mass and why do we need them?

Simply put, the *Introductory Rites*, also known as

the Gathering Rites, are rituals to remind us of who we are as people of God, the Body of Christ, come together to give thanks and praise to God. These rituals prepare us to fully enter into the spirit of the Mass.

The *Entrance Procession* is not a welcome ritual for the presider, but is symbolic of all of us entering into the Liturgy, bringing our joys and sorrows, successes, challenges, and failings with us. Coming together from our separate lives, we are pilgrims on a journey of life and love, joining our voices into one voice, in song.

We make the *Sign of the Cross*, the ancient symbol of faith in our triune God. We gather in the name of the Father, who loved each of us, and all creation, into being; who imagined and designed us, molded and shaped us into the divine image, who breathed life into us and put us on earth for a purpose. We gather in the name of the Son, Jesus, who lived, died, and rose for us, to show us the way of life and love, and who calls us to follow him and complete his work. We gather in the name of the Holy Spirit, who enlivens, strengthens, and guides us to complete that work for which we are created and called. We gather in the name of the most holy Trinity, this divine flow of sacrificial love that drives the universe, in whom we have life.

The *Penitential Rite*, in which we proclaim "Lord, have mercy; Christ, have mercy; Lord, have mercy," is not a quick sacrament of reconciliation. It is both a request for mercy and a proclamation of mercy already, and continually, received in Christ. During the Easter season, this ritual is usually replaced by the sprinkling rite, reminding us of our baptism into the Body of Christ, the mercy of God.

The *Gloria* is a joyous song of praise that we offer to our loving God. This is why we are here: to give thanks and praise to God because we need to give thanks and praise, not because God needs us to do so.

And finally, the *Opening Prayer*. After the presider says, "Let us pray," we are quiet together for a few moments; still, calm, and aware that we are one people, bringing our separate lives together, in prayer and worship before our loving God. The presider then prays aloud, collecting all of our personal prayer into one great common prayer, to which we respond "Amen!"

Now we are ready; the church gathered and hungry to listen and be fed by the living word of God.

Human Concerns

Catholic Social Teaching – United States Catholic Conference of Bishops



The Church's social teaching is a rich treasure of wisdom about building a just society and living lives of holiness amidst the challenges of modern society. Modern Catholic social teaching has been articulated through a tradition of papal, conciliar and episcopal documents. The depth and richness of this tradition can be understood best through a direct reading of these documents. In these brief reflections, we highlight several of the key themes that are at the heart of our Catholic social tradition.

Care for God's Creation

We show our respect for the Creator by our stewardship of creation. Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan, it is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation. This environmental challenge has fundamental moral and ethical dimensions that cannot be ignored.

Man, who discovers his capacity to transform and in a certain sense create the world through his own work, forgets that this is always based on God's prior and original gift of the things that are. Man thinks that he can make arbitrary use of the earth, subjecting it without restraint to his will, as though it did not have its own requisites and a prior God-given purpose, which man can indeed develop but must not betray. Instead of carrying out his role as a co-operator with God in the work of creation, man sets himself up in place of God and thus ends up provoking a rebellion on the part of nature, which is more tyrannized than governed by him. *On the Hundredth Year (Centesimus Annus...), #37*




