# SET THE WORLD ABLAZE!

## **Lesson Introduction**

<u>The Word God speaks to us</u> in love, inviting us to be friends. God's Word is life giving. It has the power to heal, comfort, affirm, challenge and instruct. As Catholic-Christians, we believe that the Bible is **reliable, truthful** and **sincere** because we believe our God is reliable, truthful and sincere.




Yet learning how to hear the Word of God, and through it, **feel God's loving presence**, takes time and effort. Like all the information we receive, we have to learn how to **interpret** what we hear/read in the Bible.

Many people (young and old) become discouraged when they first try to explore the Bible. Indeed the very first story -<u>the story of creation</u> - raises questions about whether or not what the Bible presents is true. Lack of confidence in biblical truth, is one of the major issues that raises doubt and diminishes faith. If we do not have confidence that the Bible is reliable, it undermines our belief in the trustworthiness of God Himself. If we question the honesty and sincerity of God's communication to us, we simply stop listening.



Tonight we are going to ask the question, "Is the Bible a reliable source of knowledge

#### Knowing does not happen all at once. Knowing is a process.



**Understanding how this process works** helps <u>us</u> become more skillful and adept knowers.

# Knowledge builds on knowledge

Like building a block tower, we <u>test</u> and <u>assemble</u> each piece of data we receive to create <u>concepts</u> that work together to create ideas that lead us to draw <u>conclusions</u>.



Over time, we build a bank of things we know. This is called <u>prior knowledge</u>. Maintaining our bank of prior knowledge in good order requires that we occasionally review what we have learned so we can use it to add to our understanding. That's one of the reasons for the Teen Handouts.

### Catholics believe God Has A Plan

#### That every person will find truth and happiness and all of creation will achieve its full potential.




Some people make the Bible say whatever they want it to say.

My Uncle says the Bible was written to explain the mysteries of the universe, before the advent of modern science. Scientific discovery has made the Bible irrelevant.

Some Christians tell me that Biblical truth transcends all truth, even scientific truth, because the Bible comes from God and all other forms of truth come from human beings. Some of my non-Catholic, Christian friends tell me the Bible says women <u>must obey</u> men; Gay people are a <u>big mistake</u> – unintended freaks of creation - and transgender people don't even exist! Is that true?

 The passage, or teaching someone draws for the passage, denies or negates your lived experience


## ASK YOURSELF

- What is this book or passage's literary genre? What are the guidelines for understanding it?
- What was the historical situation at the time this book was written? How did the human author(s) address this situation?
- Is there a cultural practice or attitude reflected in this book/passage that I need to understand to appreciate the author(s) intention?
- How does this book or story fit into the overall story of salvation history?
- Is my understanding of this passage consistent with the rest of Scripture?

- Lead to deeper insights
- Engage others
- Influences/alters one's own point of view or another's
- Expose bias


## **One Way to Visualize Truth**

Truth speaks about the known and unknown; the seen and unseen; the proven and the not yet even imagined. Truth is both **objective** (true for all, everywhere) and **subjective** (true for some). Truth can be readily apparent and hidden.

## God's Covenant with Abraham Genesis 15:1-6

Abraham's faith and trust in God has become a model for Jews, Christians and Muslims. All three of these religions trace their faith back to Abraham. He embodies for all three what it means to have a deep and personal friendship with God.

- God assures Abraham saying, "Do not fear, Abram! I am your shield." Have you ever experienced God as your shield, your protection against fear? If so how did that make you feel? How does thinking about God being your shield make you feel right now?
- God took Abraham outside and had him try to count the stars as a way of showing Abraham how many descendants he would have. What signs does God show us about his willingness to be faithful to us?
- How does knowing the story of Abraham help us trust God?
  - How does Abraham's faith in God help us believe in God more readily?
- D. Putting Faith Into Action (3-5 min)



Identify 1 thing you will do this week because you came to IGNITE tonight

Faith is the ability to believe, but that ability must be used and acted upon for faith to come alive and make a difference. Jesus tells us our lives must produce <u>fruit</u>.

Believing is the <u>action side</u> of faith – believing is 'acting in faith.' Just having faith is not enough. Having the ability to believe is not enough.

In the epistle of James, James calls out the hypocrisy within the community – people who were professing faith in Christ, claiming to be a Christian, who were not, in fact, Christian.

"If a brother or sister is without clothing and in need of daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and filled" and yet you do not give them what is necessary for their body, what use is that?
