

God's library has two wings

Old Testament & New Testament

Each wing has four smaller rooms Old Testament New Testament

Pentatuch The Gospels

History Acts of the Apostles
The Prophets 21 Epistles (letters)

Wisdom Writings Revelation

The Old Testament wing (46 books) is approximately twice as big as the New Testament wing (27 books).




- A Bible Study is a way to dive into the word of God, learning what He wants for us through Scripture.
