Jesus Video

The video is just over 6.5 minutes long. After you watch, here are some debrief questions:

- What does the video say Jesus did? What do we know Jesus did?
 - Miracles, healed a blind man, raised a man from the dead, fed people with the loaves and the fish
- What were the 2 “A” words that we can use to be more like Jesus?
 - Attitude and actions
- What are attitude and actions? What does that mean?
 - Don’t just say or think love- show it, be kind to others, do nice things for others
- How can you have a good attitude and actions? How can you be like Jesus?
 - ((variety of answers))

What I’ve learned

Give each teen a sheet of paper and a writing devise. Ask the teens to take a few minutes by themselves to reflect on what we’ve been learning the last few weeks.

- What did I think about Jesus?
- What did I learn?
- What do I know now?
- What would I tell a friend?

When everyone is done writing, come back as a group and discuss what everyone put as an answer.
