More Adventure, More on the Pilgrimage

As we have been preparing for Adventures in Grace: A Pilgrimage we have received some questions. Perhaps I can clarify a bit. This is not a physical journey from place to place like a classic pilgrimage is. It is a spiritual journey with homilies and presentations here at Holy Family and hopefully follow-up discussions with some others with whom you would like to share your faith. We will provide resources such as discussion questions for continued personal reflection or discussion with others. We will also provide opportunities for virtual discussion and sharing as well. The various stops, or destinations along the way will creatively and provocatively focus on the grace of life, and thus the grace of the seven sacraments that our Church is structured around and on.

We are beneficiaries of and products of the institution of the Church that gives and regulates the seven sacraments. I say beneficiaries because each sacrament marks a sacred moment of the Holy Spirit and has so much grace to offer. But we are hoping to retrieve the original movement of that same Holy Spirit and connect more deeply with the instigating energy of Jesus Christ, which started each sacred experience that we call sacrament. We say that Jesus instituted the sacraments. That very word is an institutional term with the same root word. I want to put a different spin on that by saying he instigated the sacraments based on LIFE.

For example, a popular spiritual saying is that we can find God anywhere. I use that statement to say that God can find us anywhere. If we believe that God can find us anywhere, then our world is filled with grace, graced moments and grace opportunities. Jesus knew that. He had a vision to perpetuate faith and thus the institution of the Church began. Through the centuries much has been added to develop that institution and at times it needs renewal. I believe we are in such a time NOW, as a larger church and here at Holy Family.

The Pilgrimage offers something new and different, a unique approach to the lasting energy of the Holy Spirit that has always guided us—the

Church. We will often refer to the Pilgrimage with the letters AIG standing for Adventures in Grace. There are more details available on our website at:

Catechetical Sunday Theme

“Just say the word and my servant will be healed.”

These words are a heartfelt profession of faith, spoken with confidence by the Roman centurion to Jesus in Matthew's gospel (8:6-8). The Centurion's belief in Jesus' power to heal stuns the people who have come to hear Jesus teach. The centurion's

profession of faith is the basis for the prayer we say during the Communion Rite, *“Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.”*

Many of the Jewish people in the crowd saw the Centurion as an oppressor of the Jewish people. They despised him. Many would have been angry that he would even dare to ask Jesus for help. Those closest to Jesus, might have felt nervous or afraid. If Jesus did not heal the centurion's servant, the centurion could have him arrested. If Jesus did heal the centurion's servant, Jesus could be in trouble with the Jewish leaders for helping an enemy of the Jewish people. The Roman soldiers who accompanied the centurion might wonder why the Centurion didn't pray to the Roman Gods. They might doubt his loyalty to Rome and/or lose respect for the centurion.



Professing our Faith in public can be risky

When Jesus responds with compassion and agrees to heal the centurion's servant, many of the Jewish people were angry with Jesus as well as the Romans. They grew suspicious of everyone. Others thought the centurion was taking advantage of the situation, setting Jesus up to fail, so their hatred of the Romans only increased. Some may even have walked away from Jesus, after he said, *“Truly I tell you, I have not found anyone in Israel with such great faith.”* Not only was Jesus willing to help, he held up the centurion as an example. How could Jesus choose the centurion over them?

God's love does not always make sense to us

In the encounter with the Centurion Jesus teaches us

1. **We, like the Centurion, can trust Jesus.** When we humbly ask in faith, Jesus will help us.
2. **Jesus is a source of healing and strength.** We receive this healing and strength through the sacraments, especially the Eucharist. *“Only say the Word and my soul will be healed.”*
3. **Practicing our Faith is not a private affair.** Like the Centurion, once we recognize that Christ is the Lord, we cannot be afraid to share our faith in him with others.
4. **We have to speak the truth,** even if others disagree with us or think we are foolish. That is why belonging to a faith community that can support us is so important.
5. **We must recognize and bless those who help us to grow in faith** by witnessing to the Good News of Jesus Christ.
