Institutional Catholicism

The Roman Catholic Church has:

- Built
- Regulated
- Ritualized
- Formed
- Missioned
- and Culturally Integrated the great commission of Jesus Christ to Baptize ALL nations in the Trinitarian God, staying true to the structure he instigated (on Peter and the Apostles), preserving the truth, trusting the Holy Spirit, for the rest of time (see Matthew 28:18-20) in every country on the face of the earth.

This has spawned tremendous growth and a loyalty to communion that is good, but often leads to minimalism and consumerism, to a looking back and not to *now* or *forward*.

The Institution of the Catholic Church has purveyed the sacred by welcoming, feeding, reconciling, affirming, healing and committing. It simply does more good all over the world everyday than any other institution. It protects, shelters and counsels those far beyond its membership without cost.

However, it has also spawned an attitude of clergy *above* as opposed to clergy *with* the people of God. Sins of abuse and violations of trust by clergy have caused wounds beyond telling.

The instituting vision of Jesus Christ reached its institutional height in various countries at various times throughout history. It is peaking in some areas today.

Perhaps the greatest institutional experience of Roman Catholicism in its history has taken place in the United States from 1850-1970. It has coincided with waves of immigration, industry, war, depression, economics, art, music, technology and more. It has generated more priests and religious per Catholic during that time than ANYWHERE, EVER in the 2,000 plus years of its history.

All of us have been formed by this institutionalism culturally, religiously and spiritually. The institutional connection and consumeristic attitude of

American Catholics is strong.

Consider how our language indicates this phenomena with statements and questions such as:

- You *get* grace by doing certain things
- Did you *get* Baptized?
- Did you *get* Confirmed?
- Did you *get* Absolution?
- Did you *get* Communion?
- Did you *get* Anointed?
- Did you *get* Ordained?

Institutional church has created an assumption of availability and a lack of knowledge of all it takes to make church, faith, ministry, community and service available. It has regulated what we *get* over the grace of what we *receive*. It has emphasized *getting* over *sharing*.

I believe that we are in a new moment with a new challenge to build upon the institution with deeper, more profound, more exciting, more innovative, more contemporary, more vibrant, more relevant experiences of faith.

We already have deep and diverse spiritual resources generated by profound spiritual masters and movements of the Holy Spirit throughout the centuries to build on.

Let us get out of the boat of over-institutionalism that has carried us thus far and embark on a new era, on new spiritual terrain, yet carrying out the same commission of Jesus Christ with more emphasis on his statement "...and know that I will be with you until the end of time." (Matthew 28:20)

Our Adventures in Grace: a Pilgrimage is a start.

Let us lead the post institutional era of Catholicism beginning now!

Investing in the Spiritual Life yields remarkable dividends

As spiritual beings, we seek meaning and purpose.

As Catholics, we believe we find our life's meaning and purpose in our personal relationship with God. We believe we are born with the ability to respond to God's invitation to become friends. This personal friendship with God is what we call **faith**. The ways we engage with God is what we call the **spiritual life**.



Like all relationships, our friendship with God is a living reality. It is **unique, personal, and ongoing**. It changes over time. It waxes and wanes. It can deepen or grow stale. Left unattended or taken for granted, it suffers. Our relationship with God needs nurturing if it is to sustain us. **Investing in your own spiritual growth and helping your children invest in their friendship with God is one of the greatest gifts you can give.**



Spirituality and Religion

Those who share with us, a similar understanding and relationship with God, **support and affirm our spirituality**. As we continue to share and reflect on our relationship with God with them, we draw closer to God and each other, forming a **community of faith**. As a community, we develop ways to express what we have come to know about ourselves, each other and God through these relationships, we call **beliefs**. We acquire ways to express our thoughts and feelings about our relationship with God and each other, creating a common spiritual language comprised of verbal (**spoken** and **written** texts), visual (**signs** and **symbols**) and non-verbal (**rituals**) elements.

As a parish community, we create ways of being with God and each other that strengthen and nourish these bonds. We call these **spiritual practices** and **customs**. In addition to beliefs and practices, we choose ways of behaving that enhance our individual relationship with God (**values**) and agree to common standards that support and enhance our relationships with God and each other (**morals**).

The **beliefs, values, practices, morals** and **language** we share is what comprises **religious faith**. Our ancestors passed on to us their religious faith. This was a sacred gift, a blessing. Yet every generation has to make the religious faith they inherit, their own, incorporating it in their lives so it both serves their spiritual life and becomes an authentic expression of their relationship with God, before passing it on to others.

Religious faith **serves** the Spiritual life, giving it form and expression

Religious beliefs and practices provide **tools** to respond to *God's invitation to friendship* - ways to construct our spiritual lives. Inherited faith is the starting point in coming to know God's love intimately and personally.

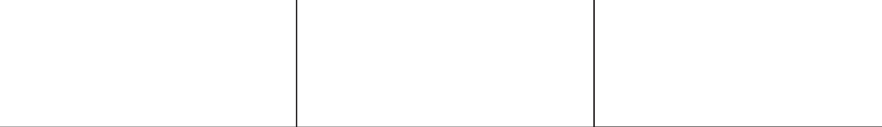

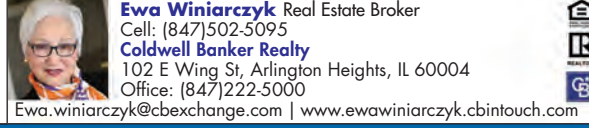
