I hope you have picked up my love for scripture as I frequently say that a certain passage is one of my favorites. The truth is that scripture is like Rock 'n' Roll for me. I can't tell you what my favorite passage or song is, but often I will cite that my favorite is the last one that I listened to or read, and I proclaim favoritism while my heart and soul is moved by the impact of a song or passage. And the beauty of it is that cycle goes on and on.

With that being said, this weekend's Gospel passage from Mark (10:46-52) is indeed one of my favorites. It contains a three-fold message to the blind Bartimaeus, and to us, and it poses a question for all of us.

I also know that my fascination with the spiritual nature of the number three is evident. It is manifest in many other three-fold statements in scripture that actually appear, on the surface, to be one statement.

The three fold message in this passage is:

- 1. Take courage
  - 2. Get up
- 3. Jesus is calling you

The passage begins with the crowd attempting to silence a man who has a loud yet humble request, giving us a glimpse of his faith in Jesus. "Son of David, have pity on me." The crowd rebukes him until Jesus makes a simple yet direct request, "Call him." The very ones who just tried to silence him now empower him at the command of Jesus. The three-fold message unfolds. Where do you need courage in your life? If we don't get up, show up, or in any way elevate ourselves, try or inquire, we can't answer the call of God fully in our lives. Can you hear the Lord calling you? Where has it taken place in the past? Where is that call manifesting itself right now in your life? Where is the Lord's call leading you?

The response from the blind man is simple and sincere, "Master, I want to see." Do we recognize the wisdom, authenticity and depth of God's call in our lives, and can we let that help us continue to seek spiritual, intellectual, political, racial, medical and relational sight?

Let us take courage, get up and meet God's call in our lives with a desire to see, particularly in areas of our lives where we are blind.

Every year a Holy Family parishioner is nominated to receive the Christifideles award from the Archdiocese of Chicago. This individual Catholic layperson must demonstrate participation in parish life which calls the laity to the vocation of responsibility for the Church's life springing from the gift and mission of their baptism.

Scott Swenson is Holy Family's 2021 Christifideles Award Recipient.

A little more than a year ago, after the pandemic completely shut down our parish, we received word that the Archdiocese of Chicago would begin a gradual reopening of the parishes, for sacraments only, operating at just 20% capacity. We were in brand new territory as the Archdiocese gave us directives, yet allowed each parish to design safety protocols to best fit our facility and staffing abilities. There were no prior models to follow.

Scott willingly took on a role that required organization, mental agility, volunteer recruiting and retention, structuring, patience, creativity and immense faith. His engineering skills guided our path with attention to every minute detail with the ultimate goal of keeping our parishioners, families and friends safe as the pandemic continued to rage all around us.

Simply put....we couldn't have gotten through this unique year without Scott's key contributions.

His joyful spirit and willingness to always be there for our community is inspiring and evident of God's grace in his heart. On behalf of our leadership and faith community, we congratulate Scott for this well-deserved recognition and award!

### Viator House of Hospitality - When the News Comes Home

We probably all saw them. The images were heartbreaking: children and adults panicked and crowded together, hoping to escape Afghanistan through the Kabul airport. Many Afghans made it out, but many did not. There is a new Afghan flag hanging in our stairwell that shows that Viator House was honored to welcome one of the young men who escaped through that chaos - Omar. Sadly, Omar was separated from his parents and all but one sibling, his 21-year-old brother who also escaped.

Good News In The Midst Of Sadness: But, because of Viator House, he has been able to speak to his brother, who was flown to a Texas military base and, more recently, to his best friend in Kabul, who was able to then tell his parents that Omar is safe. And, in more good news, we hope to help him and his brother reunite soon.

Meanwhile, he has 23 new brothers from around the world making him feel at home as they help him cook, start to learn English and laugh during board games. ### That Precious Bond

### The vocation of grandparenting

Each year Fr. Terry meets with every FLAME II Faith class in a gathering we call Pizza with the Pastor. Early on a weeknight, before the round of parish meetings begin, Fr. Terry invites the teens to his house for a meal and a conversation. As part of that

conversation he often asks, "Who are your spiritual heroes?" By far the most common answer the teens give is a grandparent or grandparents. What makes them spiritual heroes to their grandchildren?

- Their fidelity to love "I know my grandpa always has my back."
- Their prayer life "My grandmother prays every day. She is the only one I ever ask to pray for me, because I know she will do it"
- Their commitment to their religious beliefs, especially in times of hardship or struggle "My grandfather always tells me that you know if you really have faith when your back is against the wall."
- Their willingness to share their faith with their grandchildren "My grandparents never tell me what to do, they share what they did when facing something similar. It's really cool."
- Their devotion to the Eucharist "My grandpa never misses Mass and my Nana goes to Mass every day. My grandpa says, 'If you put God first everything else will fall into place."
- Their service to others "My grandmother is always doing stuff for other people, thinking about others instead of herself. I really admire that about her."

The sincerity with which our teens share these stories is very touching. As you look around at the group you see them all nodding and often hear the phrase, 'mine do too'. The fact is, and every research study done on the role grandparents play in their grandchildren's lives backs this up, grandparents are bearers of

- Connection and continuity
- Family heritage and tradition
- Spiritual wisdom and faith

What makes religious faith, heritage and tradition such a compelling matter in the relationship between grandparent and grandchild? According to

Arthur Kornhaber, M.D. "...what transpires between grandparents and grandkids is unique and powerful, making grandparents ideally suited to the role of "spiritual quide. There's something cosmic about that bond."

For psychologist Carolyn Newberger, an involved grandma herself, it's primarily About continuity. As a grandparent, Newberger says, "I stand in a place that

stretches behind me and ahead of me. Through me, my grandchildren will carry

forward what I remember." That link to living memory can often stretch across centuries. Dr. Peg Hanrahan remembers her grandmother, who was born in 1888, telling stories of her grandparents who were both born before 1810. "Those stories, now over 200 years old, is quite a legacy to have been given," says Dr. Peg.
