“Come after me and I will make you fishers of men (people).”

Matthew 4:19 and Mark 1:17

“Do not be afraid, from now on you will be catching men (people).”

Luke 5:10

Perhaps you share my fascination with the different accounts of similar events from Gospel to Gospel. Some differences are subtle, some quite pronounced. The above comparisons are actually quite different.

This week we hear from the Gospel of Luke as Jesus engages the disciples in an unbelievably clever way. He understands their profession and calls them using something they are familiar with – in this case, fishing. That familiarity is present in all three accounts. In the accounts from Matthew and Mark the invitation from Jesus precedes the fishing analogy. It is their first encounter with the savior and thus there is an emphasis on following him. In Luke’s version, the disciples have seen Jesus in action already. They have witnessed his healing and they have been exposed to his impact on others.

Luke places emphasis on quelling the disciples fear and an emphasis of certainty for the future, “...*from now on you will be catching men (people).*” Luke also uses the verb “catch” as opposed to “fish.” This also stresses some certainty as to their future success. His version also follows quite a dramatic scene. Several young fathers in the parish will dramatize this during our FM Mass at 9:00am this Sunday. I thank them for their courage and for stressing that this new FM Mass is multi-generational and not reserved solely for children’s participation.

The crux of Luke’s passage seems to be that they are the fishermen and Jesus is the preacher. They are proud men, indeed the best fishermen in all of Galilee. Undoubtedly, they are embarrassed because they had fished all night and caught nothing.

Jesus uses Simon’s boat to preach from since it has no fish in it. They now see him in ac-

tion once again. Jesus then ORDERS them (he doesn’t ask or suggest) to not only go out again, but to go out into deep water. This order is similar to the one we heard recently from the Wedding Feast at Cana when he ORDERS the servers to fill the jars with water and to TAKE some to the headwaiter.

Again, in a simple analysis of both miracles, at the beginning there is no wine. Once Jesus orders, there are 150 gallons of REALLY GOOD wine. Both the quantity and quality are significantly elevated. Here, at the beginning there are no fish. At the end there are too many for one boat to bring in and reinforcements from the boat belonging to James and John are summoned for help.

This all has quite an impact on Simon Peter. His response is very visceral. He wants to distance his perceived unworthiness from the goodness of Jesus. This miracle has brought him to his knees in confession of his sinful identity. Embarrassment, amazement and, perhaps, other emotions have manifest in fear. Jesus recognizes this immediately and begins his statement like so many other announcements in scripture, “*Do not be afraid.*”

At the command of Jesus, plentitude is brought from the mystery of the deep up and into plain sight. Master fishermen are transformed into disciples. Fear is addressed with a certainty for the future. Embarrassment from failure becomes possibility for the future.

Perhaps these accounts can speak to you in a similar way. Think of something that you are really good at. Reflect on what makes you most productive. Think about the most meaningful work that you do and reword what Jesus says to Peter to fit your calling. Choose either

“Do not be afraid, from now on you will be ...”

OR

“Come after me and I will make you ...”

As so many of the challenges at the end of our FM and Academy Masses end, Good Luck!!!

As an arm of Habitat for Humanity of Northern Fox Valley, Spring of Life (www.springoflifehabitat.org) is a partnership of 8 churches in the northwest suburbs. Holy Family has been a longtime member of this partnership and, with the other churches, provides all the volunteer construction, fundraising and project leadership needed to build homes and contribute financially.

Hundreds of Holy Family members have volunteered as carpenters, painters, landscapers, drywallers and lunch caterers. We are so proud of the many hours our dedicated members have given and which have allowed these families to move from being in a constant state of housing insecurity to one of having the stability of home ownership. Focusing on Habitat's vision of **A world where everyone has a decent place to live**, we have created affordable housing for 20 qualified families over the past 25 years.

We Don't Build Homes: We Change Lives Home Ownership Leads To:

Increases in:



- Graduation rates.
- Children's good health.
- Net family wealth.

Decreases in:



- Children's behavioral problems.
- Reliance on government assistance.
- Asthma.

No One Gets a Free Home

The homes we build are purchased by homeowners who don't qualify for a conventional mortgage, but meet Habitat's strict requirements for an interest-free \$500 down mortgage. In addition to financial requirements, adult homeowners must put in 250 hours of sweat equity on their homes. Working alongside the construction crew gives these first-time homeowners an opportunity not only to put some "skin in the game," but also to learn how to maintain their homes.

Holy Family Leadership Roles

In addition to the construction volunteers, Holy Family has four members on the Spring of Life Leadership team. The group manages the project builds, relationship with the Habitat Homeowner, coordinates with Habitat's paid staff and much more. Larry Buettner has been on the leadership team since the beginning, served once as a project manager and was also the chair of the leadership team for a decade. Myra Buettner played a key role in creating a fundraising team when the group was struggling to raise the \$35,000 our partnership contributes to each home. Without the expertise of John Wise, who serves as the project manager/general contractor, Spring of Life would not have been able to build as many homes and at such a high quality as it has. Husband and wife team Mike Rekruciak and Monica Keane volunteer in a variety of roles as well.

Gospel Summary

Jesus calls us to be disciples and trust in God’s way of love.

Family discussion questions on today’s Readings

[Isaiah 6:1-2a; 3-8](#); [Psalm 138:1-2a, 2-3, 4-5, 7-8](#); [Luke 5:1-11](#)

1. Simon Peter hadn't caught any fish. But he trusted Jesus. He followed Jesus' command to lower the nets into the water.
What happened next? (The fishermen caught so many fish that the nets tore.)
2. Jesus told Simon Peter he would be a different type of fisherman.
What did Jesus say Simon Peter would be catching instead of fish? (men/people)
3. Jesus was calling Simon Peter to help him bring people to God. **Did Simon Peter follow Jesus?** (Yes.) **Is Simon Peter the only one who followed Jesus?** (No. Simon Peter's brother Andrew, his partner John, and all the fishermen put aside their nets and followed Jesus.)
4. Jesus calls us to follow him too. Simon Peter was a leader, a person of influence among his friends. Our job as disciples of Jesus is to influence others in positive ways and to lead them to Jesus. **In what ways can we have a positive influence on others?**



Meaning behind the Presentation of the Our Father

One of the greatest gifts Jesus gave us was the prayer we call the **Our Father**. When we say this prayer, alone or together, our faith becomes stronger and we become one with the whole community of disciples. The Our Father teaches us everything a disciple of Jesus needs to know.

- This is a prayer to help us remember to [trust in the Lord](#) and strengthens our trust in God.
- Our Father** - God is our Father and loves us very much. Calling God, our Father makes us all brothers and sisters. We remember we are one family.
- Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven** - This world is not what God created it to be. God is making the world new (heaven on earth) and asks us to help.
- Give us this day our daily bread** - God gives us everything that we need (like the fish in today's Gospel).
- Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us** - God offers us forgiveness and asks us to forgive others. (In today's Gospel Jesus forgives Simon Peter)
- Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil** - God is always with us, even when life is hard or bad things happen (like fishing all night and not catching even one fish).
- For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory for ever** - God wants us to be happy and wants each of us to go to heaven and enjoy new life forever. ("Don't be afraid. From now on you will be fishermen for men.")

Gospel Challenges for Feb 6 - Trust God; Follow Jesus by being a positive influence on others; Say the Our Father everyday – this will help us be faith-filled disciples of Jesus.
