- ✦ Slide 9 – Jesus welcomes all
- ✦ The hospitality Jesus offers is a sign of God's enduring mercy.
 - It is the expression of God's kindness, love and compassion
 - It communicates God's wholehearted acceptance of who we are
 - It is a way to heal the effects of exclusion, isolation, dissension and disaffection.
- ✦ Biblical hospitality is a sacred duty, an act of justice required for moral living.
- ✦ Christ expands the understanding of Biblical hospitality beyond those who lack the familial and communal ties that provided protection (the widow, the orphan, the stranger, the poor) to those who experienced spiritual alienation (the sinner, the outcast).
- ✦ The welcome Jesus offers transforms the way we see others and ourselves.

- ✦ **Discipleship is not limited** to only a few. It includes people of every age, rich and poor, men and women, people from every ethnic background etc. In the Body of Christ everyone is welcome **if** they are willing to follow the path Jesus walks. If we are not ready to walk the path quite yet, Jesus waits til we are and then invites us again.
- ✦ Many have said **yes** to Jesus' invitation. Others say no. The choice is up to each person. Jesus welcomes and invites but does not force.
- ✦ Celebrating the sacraments, especially the Eucharist, strengthens and unites us to do the work of being disciples of Christ.

Slide 11 - We become what we receive

In the Eucharist, we become what we receive



The Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation are given to us so that we may be one with the Lord and each other and set the world ablaze with the fire of God's love!

- ✦ In the Eucharist two very important changes occur
 - Our simple gifts of bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus
 - When we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we become the Body of Christ.

- ✦ St. Paul, tells us, that as the Body of Christ we are to
"Be careful for yourselves and for all the people God has given you. The Holy Spirit gave you the work of caring for this flock. (Act 20: 32; 28)

This is why at Holy Family we say, **we are in this together**. Every part of the body must contribute to the health and well-being of the body, just like all members of a family must share their unique gifts and strengths to keep the family strong.

- ✦ As Christ's Church, we must work with the other members of Body of Christ to care for God's people. We do this by
 - Praying with and for them
 - Forgiving them and asking for their forgiveness
 - Caring for them when they are in need
 - Serving them
 - Sharing with them through what we say and do, that God loves them.

The final activity of the Retreat is a simple act of service done as a family.
